From the Rabbi's Study

Jewish Strike-outs Happen Too



Earlier this summer, I had an opportunity to celebrate a wonderful Bar Mitzvah with a young man who is one of the biggest baseball fans. I would like to

share with you a summary of the words that I had for him on that special morning.

At the time of this writing, Mike Moustakas had the highest batting average of the team, batting .326. Paul Goldschmidt of the Arizona Diamondbacks had the highest in the MLB this year with .361. Ty Cobb, whose career ended 87 years ago, had the all time record with an average of .366 over 24 seasons.

This means, that the very best batter in history got on base fewer than four times in ten. These statistics are often quoted for life's pep talk about success in work, school or other "secular" endeavors.

Sadly, people often don't give Judaism the same number of strike-outs. Human beings are flawed, and Jewish organizations created by and run by human beings are flawed as well. It is not unusual that a first-time trip to a Hillel or Chabad for a college student, camp or youth group for a teen or pre-teen, or a meeting, program or service for an adult often doesn't result in a "home run."

It is not unusual for people at synagogues or other institutions to be so interested in seeing their long-time

friends, that they inadvertently miss the newcomer. This is no excuse for those already Jewishly connected to be more open minded and welcoming. However, sometimes Jewish social missteps or misfires happen, and all too often, they may prevent future opportunities. It is important to not give someone else the power to be a roadblock in one's spiritual journey.

The key is - keep stepping up to the plate. There may be two or three "strike-outs" before that spiritual connection is made. For those of us already connected and engaged - our job is to do our best, though, to avoid strike-outs when someone new is trying out our community.

Community Conversion Class Begins in August

The Rabbinical Association of Greater Kansas will again offer a community-wide course, "Judaism for Conversion Candidates" beginning August 27. The year-long course will be taught by rabbis from Reform, Conservative and Orthodox movements and will acquaint potential converts to Judaism with what it means to live Jewishly. Students must secure a congregational rabbinic sponsor by November 1 and meet the conversion requirements developed by their rabbinic sponsor.

The class acquaints students with Jewish holidays, home celebrations, life-cycle observances, rituals and prayer, Torah, Judaism's view of God, our religion's movements and Hebrew study. Participants will take part in Shabbat, Havdalah and holiday experiences. Future Jews-by-choice will have the opportunity to meet one another and learn about the Kansas City Jewish community.

Classes meet on Thursdays from 7:00-9:00 pm, and the location will rotate among the synagogues.

Orientation is scheduled for August 20, 7:30-8:30 pm at the Jewish Community Campus. The course fee is \$250 per person including course textbooks. 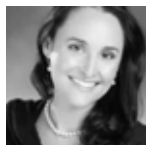

Growing up in Western Pennsylvania in the 70's and 80's, August was still very firmly part of the summer. During my childhood in parts of the Midwest and most of the Northeast, school did not begin until after Labor Day.

No one would argue that August feels like the start of fall. The start of the Jewish new year, Tishrei and Rosh HaShanah, have never in my lifetime, nor do I think ever will occur in August. August is still high summer. And yet, secular schools as well as Hebrew schools begin in the month of August. I am going to argue, however, that while this is a difficult time to transition into classes, this "soft

start" is critical to prepare for all the holidays that fly at us fast and furious come mid-September. The month of Elul, in August this year, leading up to the High Holidays are like the time when runners prepare for a marathon. It takes real effort and time to prepare for the long run, and the High Holidays are such a race.

Miss Judy's Advice on Potty Training

Miss Judy shares her advice on potty training. If you wait until your child is ready to be potty trained it is simple and free of power struggles!

As the child approaches the age of 2 - 2 1/2, begin buying your child's favorite character underwear. Every now and then when you are changing a messy diaper, comment "soon you

will be ready to go to the potty and you will not like having your diaper changed or wearing bulky diapers. You are putting the idea in his head but not telling him he has to wear big kid pants." Then wash the new underwear and put it away. Every few days ask if your child would like to go see his big kids' underwear? Soon your child

will say he wants to wear the big kid underwear, and you will remind him he will have to stay dry and go potty in the bathroom. One day he will be ready to succeed, and you will be there to encourage and reinforce. Make sure your child always feels like he is doing it for himself, not for you! All children succeed at this developmental milestone!

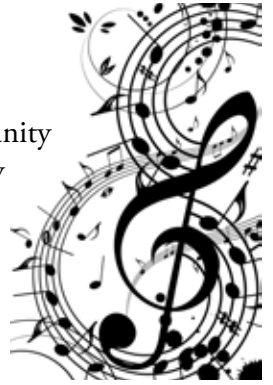

Sweet & Sticky Peachy Drumsticks

Ingredients:

- 1 12-ounce jar peach preserves
- 3 tablespoons honey
- 1 tablespoon extra virgin olive oil
- 1 tablespoon Dijon mustard
- Juice of 1 lemon
- Juice of 2 limes
- 1/2 teaspoon garlic powder
- 1/2 teaspoon kosher salt
- 1/4 teaspoon ground white pepper
- 8 chicken drumsticks (about 2 pounds)
- 1 cup frozen peaches, thawed
- Cooking spray

Directions:

1. Make the marinade by mixing the peach preserves, honey, olive oil, mustard, lemon and lime juices, garlic powder, salt, and pepper in a small bowl; whisk to combine.
2. Place the marinade and drumsticks in a large resealable plastic bag and massage around the chicken to coat evenly. Refrigerate for 1 to 3 hours.
3. Preheat the oven to 450° F. Line a baking sheet with foil and spray with cooking spray.
4. Transfer the drumsticks and marinade to

the prepared baking sheet. Bake until the chicken is golden and cooked through, 25 to 30 minutes.

5. Serve warm garnished with the thawed peaches. Time-Saver: In a pinch, simply pour on the marinade and bake.

Variation: This marinade also works great on a roasted chicken, whole or cut into 8 pieces.
