From the Rabbi's Study

Bring Wholeness to Holidays

Last month we observed the Jewish holiday of Tu B'Shevat and the American Holiday of Martin Luther King Day. This month, we will celebrate the American Holiday of President's Day and the Jewish Holiday of Purim.

The key with all of these holidays is to fully understand, appreciate and celebrate the values that undergird them, and celebrate them authentically. People think if they are passionate about environmentalism, they need to check these values at the door of the synagogue. Tu B'Shevat reminds us that nothing could be further from the truth. At the creation of humanity in Genesis, we are told that Man was created to guard and to work the earth. This lays the foundation of environ-

mental stewardship as a key component of Jewish living values. There are now numerous organizations such as Hazon, the JNF and the Arava Institute – to name but a few – that seek to find deep harmony between Judaism and environmentalism.

Dr. King's calls for justice in his lifetime are rooted deeply in the writings of the Prophets from the Tanakh, shared scripture between King's Christianity and our Judaism. President's day gives us pause to express gratitude for the profound level of freedom we have enjoyed under so many Presidents. The festival of Purim has deep and important messages about what it means to be engaged as a Jew in the political affairs of a host nation.

The common thread between

these holidays is not the season, nor the overlapping Jewish and American values. What is common amongst them is how, as adults, we tend to overlook all of them. The challenge is to live these holidays wholly (and not just "holy"). It is easy to look at MLK day and President's day as shopping days. It is easy to look at Tu B'shevat and Purim as days for Jewish kids only. The challenge is for us to celebrate them with reverence, joy, spiritual significance and intellectual depth. In other words: to celebrate with *shleimut* – "wholeness."

The Latest on the Wornall Campus

I am writing this article at the risk that by the time it is published the information will be dated. Nevertheless, I wanted to provide an update on our efforts to sell our Wornall campus.

We have engaged the commercial realty firm of Colliers Turley to market the property on our behalf. We have been quite pleased with the efforts of Bob Galamba and his staff at Colliers. In September a health care facilities developer signed a contract to purchase Wornall for our requested price. The developer was interested in creating a multi-use health care facility. Due to the complexities of creating such a development, we negotiated a contract that allowed the buyer six months to complete various development requirements (zoning approval, state certificates of need, etc) before the closing. Approximately three months after signing the contract, the buyer informed us that due

to health care market issues it felt that it was unable to pursue its development plans.

Since learning this news we have shown the property to other interested buyers and will continue to market it. Our congregants Ron Coppaken and Mark Eisemann deserve our collective thanks for their continued efforts in helping the shul market and sell the Wornall property.

I will continue to keep you posted as events unfold. In the meantime if you have any questions please feel free to contact either myself, Ron or Mark.

Alyson Spector's Coffee Cake



- 1 package yeast dissolved in 1/2 cup warm water
- 2 sticks margarine melted
- 2 3/4 cup flour
- Dash salt
- 3 tablespoons sugar
- 1/2 cup milk
- 3 egg yolks (save the whites in refrigerator)

Mix all and refrigerate overnight.

Next day:

1. Let dough sit out 1 hour.
2. Combine 1 1/2 cup sugar and 2 teaspoons cinnamon in a separate bowl.
3. Beat egg whites slowly adding 3/4 cups sugar.
4. Divide dough in half. On heavily floured board or table, knead the dough. If dough is sticky, may need to add extra flour. Roll out into a big circle. Spread 1/2 egg whites mixture on the dough - till 1/2 inch from edge of dough circle (spread like sauce on pizza dough).
5. Sprinkle half of the cinnamon/sugar mixture on top of egg whites.
6. Sprinkle 3/4 cup walnuts (slightly broken up) on top of cinnamon/sugar mixture. (Raisins are optional). Roll up dough jelly roll style and pinch ends closed. Place in tube pan which has been sprayed with Pam around center piece seam side up. (an Angel Food cake pan works well). Repeat with other half of dough. Place on top, seam side down. Let rise 1 hour.
7. Bake 1 hour at 350 degrees. Cool completely before removing from pan.
