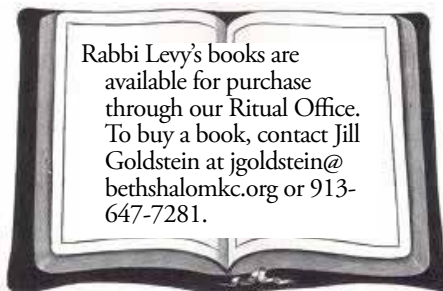

# From the Rabbi's Study

## Hanukkah – in January

I know that it seems funny to write about Hanukkah in January. I am not writing today about the holiday, Hanukkah, but rather the Hebrew word.

I spoke about this special word on the Shabbat morning of my installation here at Congregation Beth Shalom. On a personal level, this was extremely meaningful to share it with my parents from Michigan and other relatives from around the country, old friends from my pulpit in Dallas, and our new congregational family, Congregation Beth Shalom.

I want to thank the three families that chaired this amazing weekend: Amy and Peter Shapiro,

Phyllis and Erwin Abrams, and Lisa and Eric Ginsberg. The time and energy that they devoted to this was enormous.

But the real “stars” of the weekend were the congregants of Congregation Beth Shalom. I was so proud of this synagogue. Everyone felt the energy and warmth of the singing and camaraderie. Everywhere you looked, members of our community were helping out, raising their voices, and greeting guests.

If you were not able to join us on that Shabbat morning, I spoke about the meaning of the Hebrew word Hanukkah. Hanukkah is usually translated as “dedication,” but it is really “rededication.” I spoke about how silly the English word for welcoming a

new rabbi, “installation,” is. After all, the synagogue is getting a rabbi – not a kitchen appliance; I suggested that the name of the ceremony should be called a Hanukkah.

But it was not simply a Hanukkah of a rabbi, it was a Hanukkah – a rededication – of an amazing congregation. Though the holiday of Hanukkah has ended for this year, I hope that will not stop you from adding your personal light to this community.

## Progress Report – Search Committee for “Clergy 2”: Director of Congregational Learning

The search committee has begun the process of seeking a second clergy position. This Committee, Co-chaired by Jason Krakow and Norman Kahn, includes Jeff Goldenberg, Steve Flekier, Beryl Silberg, Steve Schorr, Don Cohen, Larry Kalendar, Richard Simon, Rhea Salasche, Mike Abrams, Rita Cortes, Cindy Daniels, Art Federman, Ellen Chilton, Ann Karty, Alana Muller, Mirra Klausner, Cathy Newman and Rabbi Glickman. This position will be titled “Director of Congregational Learning”.

In consultation with Rabbi Glickman, the role for this new position is to build a vision for dynamic and engaging Jewish learning across the age groups within our synagogue. In the beginning, this role will focus primarily on congregational and family education, starting with

the Polsky Religious School, teaching, leading services when needed, giving Diveri Torah, and leading High Holy Day services for families and youth. The search committee prefers this individual to have a singing voice and musical ability that will facilitate the spirituality of congregants. The committee has developed a congregational questionnaire which is being posted to attract candidates from our three target groups: the Rabbinical Assembly, the Cantorial Assembly and the Jewish Educators Association.

The search committee will meet monthly, visit New York to interview candidates in February, and invite finalists to Beth Shalom in late February and/or March 2013. Our 5th-7th grade students have been studying the Ashrei prayer. Dayna Gershon, who leads their tefillot asked each student to write a line for their own contemporary Ashrei which they have been reading during their tefillah time.

This prayer, whose first word means "happy are they," is recited three times a day—twice during the morning service and once during the afternoon prayers. The main theme of Ashrei is taking care of the needs of human society and of all living things. It is written as an acrostic in the Hebrew alphabet. In the Ashrei, the letter nun is missing and there is an association between this letter and the destruction of the Temple which is why in this acrostic there is no line beginning with the letter nun.

### Tikvah Program Serves Teens

The Tikvah Program is a two or four-week program serving adolescents ages 11-15 with mild to moderate intellectual and developmental disabilities, including Asperger's Syndrome and Autism Disorder. Tikvah campers (or chalutzim as they are known at Ramah Outdoor Adventure) will live in cabents (cabin tents) with specially trained counselors and will participate in the many activities that Ramah Outdoor Adventure offers all of its participants. These activities include horseback riding, Jewish learning, rock climbing, wilderness survival, arts and crafts, agriculture, sports, aerobics, and mining.
