It's Always a Good Time for New Year's Resolutions

Our Jewish tradition teaches us that in the Jewish calendar there are actually four Jewish New Years. These correspond to different ways we mark time. Like the secular calendar, we may have various new years such as a new fiscal year, a new school year, or a new sports season.

January 1 does not appear anywhere on the Jewish calendar, but I don't know any Jewish families that do not celebrate New Year's Eve. One of Annie's and my favorite New Year's Eves was when we lived in Jerusalem the year of 1999-2000.

As with people everywhere, we didn't know what would happen with the Y2K (remember that?) glitch, and it was also Shabbat. We, along with a group of friends, had a "progressive" Shabbat dinner making Kiddush in one home, soup in another, dinner in

a third, and dessert, champagne and *Birkat ha-Mazon* in the final home.

Though not a Jewish holiday, per se, New Year's Eve can be a Jewish holiday. Rabbi Eliezer taught us to do *teshuvah* (repentance) one day before you die. For me this is saying, it is always a good time to make resolutions and focus on living a better life. So, even though it isn't Rosh HaShanah, we can make the secular New Year

sacred by focusing on becoming better.

White Bean and Sausage Soup

- 1 teaspoon olive oil
- 1 cup chopped onion
- 2 (15 ounce) cans of navy beans, divided
- 1 cup chopped celery (2 ribs)
- 2 teaspoon bottled minced garlic
- 1 (14-1/2 ounce) can reduced-sodium, fat free chicken broth
- 1 (14-1/2- ounce) can no salt added diced tomatoes (can also use seasoned with onions and garlic)
- 1 bay leaf
- 1/2 teaspoon dried thyme
- 1/3 teaspoon black pepper
- 16 ounces reduced-fat Kosher turkey sausage.

Heat the oil in a 4 1/2 - quart Dutch oven or soup pot over medium to high heat. Peel and coarsely chop the onion, adding it to the pot as you chop. Rinse and dice the celery, adding it to the pot as you dice. Cook, stirring frequently, until the onions begin to brown about 3 minutes. Meanwhile pour 1 can of navy beans into a colander, rinse well and set aside to drain. Stir the garlic into the onions mixture. Add the broth and diced tomatoes with their juices. Increase the heat to high. Add the remaining can of beans with its liquid along with the rinsed beans, bay leaf, thyme and pepper. Stir and cover the pot. When the soup comes to a boil, reduce the heat to low. Cut the sausage into little slices and add them to the pot. Stir the pot and let simmer for about 10 minutes. Discard the bay leaf before eating. Serve with salad and rolls.

Recipe makes 4 servings with 419 calories per serving.

My family loves this soup. It is great on a cold winter day. It can be frozen and saved, or eaten in about 4 days.
