From the Rabbi's Study

Why #BringBackOurBoys Is So Important



As I write this, it has been less than a week since Eyal Yifrach, Naftali Frenkel, and Gilad Shaar were abducted in Israel.

Our hearts go out to the families of these three boys who were studying in yeshiva – only ages sixteen and nineteen. My prayer is that by the time you read these words in *The Scroll*, they have been returned safely to their families. My dread is that by the time you read this, they will have not.

Throughout Facebook and social media outlets, the hashtag (a phrase preceded by a pound sign, indicating a topic that people are talking about) #bringbackourboys, has been proliferating.

On one hand, this seems like empty activism. It is not lobbying our United States government to assist in

the search and rescue of these young men. Nor is it giving direct support to the families of these boys. Nor is it really prayer, which millions of people around the globe have been engaged in to pray for their rescue.

the House of Lords once asked Chaim Weizmann, “Why do you Jews insist on Palestine when there are so many undeveloped countries you could settle in more conveniently?”

Weizmann responded: “That is like my asking you why you drove twenty miles to visit your mother last Sunday when there are so many old ladies living on your street.”

By stressing that Eyal, Naftali and Gilad are OUR boys – we send a message to ourselves, our friends and family, and those with whom we have contact, that



However, what it does do is send a message: “Jewish blood isn’t free.” These boys were targeted because they were Jewish, and because they had the audacity to believe that Jews have the right to live in the land of Israel.

There is a story attributed to Israel’s first President: A member of

the link between Jews and the United States is not casual or insignificant. When any of our boys are not free, none of us are completely.

Executively Speaking

Building Kehillah, A Sacred Community



As President of Beth Shalom, I look forward to working with the officers, board of directors, committees, clergy, staff and congregants to continually create our kehillah. More on that below...

This Spring, I came away excited from a class offered by the United Synagogues of Conservative Judaism (USCJ), the national organization of the Conservative Movement. Called *Sulam* (ladder in Hebrew) for presidents, the class is designed for new Presidents of Conservative synagogues, and it held some surprises for me. For example, with 715 families, Beth Shalom is among the top 8% of Conservative synagogues in size. Our annual budget of \$2.1 million, while lean, is on par with other Conservative

synagogues that are also struggling with everyone's post-recession reality.

The now famous Pew Study reveals much about what Conservative congregations value. Foremost is the congregation's rabbi. Ranking second is a sense of being warm and welcoming and third that members have a sense of community within the congregation. A distant fourth was branch of Judaism and behind that was location. To me, this sounds just like us.

Importantly, I learned that we are a kehillah, a sacred community. We know from our strategic plan that our view of our sacred community includes providing experiences of prayer and spirituality that are meaningful for diverse segments of our congregation. We value learning at all ages of our congregation, from our popular Rose Family Early Childhood Educa-

tion Center to our Polsky Religious School and many opportunities for adult learning. And we each seek a sense of community within our congregation, be it Sisterhood, Minyan Makers, Kabbalat Shabbat, Shabbat morning, Library Minyan, Tot Shabbat, Steppin' Out, Men's Club, Boy Scout Troop 61 and many other examples.

I begin my term with the new perspective that while we have challenges, we are a successful Conservative synagogue. I pledge to continue to lead the implementation of our strategic plan, focusing on prayer and spirituality, congregational learning, and community. Most importantly, I hope to share my new vision that Beth Shalom is not just an institution to which we merely belong and pay dues, but a kehillah, a sacred community we continually build together.

By accepting this premise, one could say that baseless hatred was the root cause for the destruction of the Temple - and all subsequent calamities that befell the Jewish people in the 2000 years since our exile from the Land of Israel.

By multiple congregations, multiple rabbis and multiple types of Jews coming together to observe Tisha B'Av, I truly feel that it is a bit of a *Tikkun* -- a Repair -- of the root of exile." Zucchini Pancakes (Dairy)

Ingredients

4 large zucchini
6 scallions, thinly sliced or 1/2 small onion, minced
1/4 cup chopped fresh dill or 1 tablespoon dried dill (optional)
8 ounces low-fat feta cheese or farmer cheese
1 teaspoon paprika
1/2 cup whole wheat pastry flour
3 eggs, beaten
Olive oil for frying

Instructions

1. Grate the zucchini coarsely. (A food processor works well.)
 2. Add the scallions, dill, cheese, paprika, flour and eggs.
 3. Heat the olive oil in a large skillet. (A non-stick pan will work well and does not need too much oil.)
 4. Drop the zucchini mixture by large tablespoons and spread them out to make thin patties.
 5. Cook until crisp and brown on both sides.
- Makes approximately 24 pancakes
