BEDIKAT CHAMETZ (SEARCH FOR CHAMETZ)

It is the practice, according to ancient tradition, after the house has been thoroughly cleaned, to make a final ceremonial search for whatever "chametz" may remain. This search, called Bedikat Chametz", is conducted on the eve of the day preceding Passover and the "chametz" is burned on the following morning.

From the Rabbi's Study

The Past, the Present and the Future at 3080 Broadway

Every year, our Sisterhood raises money for Torah Fund, though few are familiar with what it does for the Jewish Theological Seminary and its sister institutions. Recently, I traveled to my Rabbinic alma mater, The Jewish Theological Seminary, with members of our Director of Congregational Learning Search Committee, Jason Krakow and Cindy Daniels. Here is a taste from our visit:

The Past. Leaving JTS, we ran into Prof. Israel Francus, one of my beloved Talmud teachers. Prof. Francus studied at Yeshiva Chachmei Lublin before Auchwitz. Prof. Francus'

humor, wit and learning haven't waned. Our meeting showed the intellectual path connecting the Torah in our synagogue from a generation gone to the generations yet to come.

The Present. Our first stop: the Beit Midrash named after Matthew Eisenfeld and his fiancée, Sarah Duker, murdered by terrorists while in Jerusalem. Witnessing the Beit Midrash filled with students, volumes of Talmud, and open iPads demonstrates a Torah learning that is always in the Present.

Memories of Passover, Past, Present and...?

Memories of Seders shared year after year, imprints of indelible memories of family, good food, singing, and joyousness; a warm home, familiar smells of a meal very different from most, a table decorated so well that Martha Stewart would be jealous and the memories of the laughter and love of those that surround us now, and those of whom we remember! These are the hallmarks of why people look forward to Passover. As Tevye would say, "It's Tradition!"

Growing up with Orthodox grandparents in Brooklyn, the Passover experience was all encompassing; buying Matzot and wine on the lower East Side of New York, the house cleaning to the kashering a stove with a red hot stone. My job as a child was to help set the table. The grinding of fish to the preparation of homemade Passover lokshen was left to the adults. All of this work left everyone exhausted, and that combined with a Seder that was led by my very

pious grandfather, a Seder that lasted to well after midnight, made for very tired participants.

Life moves on, memories change, traditions continue. After my grandparents passed on, the Seder was taken over by my parents, and eventually passed down to me. Old traditions were kept, new traditions made. Now when we light the candles before our Seder, every woman at my table has a set to light. My granddaughter, Savannah, lights the sterling silver candles that have graced my family's tables for well over 100 years brought to America by my grandmother. Savannah lights those candles last. We do not bench over them. Their light is our tribute to those that have left the physical earth but whose memories endure- generation to generation.

It is time to prepare for Pesach!

Many of my best memories are the preparation for the holiday as well as the holiday itself! There are so many ways to have your children help you prepare: helping plan the guest list and maybe inviting someone special to your child, cleaning to help get the house ready for Pesach, going to US Toy to pick out symbols to make up the plagues, letting them use some of their own money to donate tzedakah and making place cards for the seder table.

The day before Passover your child can peel eggs and pull parsley apart, help prepare the seder plate, chop the nuts for the Charoset (in a plastic bag by pounding them with a meat tenderizer or hammer) and help set the table. Give each child a part in the seder and help them practice. Enjoy Pesach!



Everything You Ever Wanted to Know About Jewish Meditation

Sunday, March 17th, from 4 – 5:30 pm, in the CBS Conference Room, Svetlana Sorkin, an experienced Jewish educator, will lead a workshop on Jewish Meditation. In recent years, meditation has become so popular that it has spread far beyond Indian ashrams and American yoga studios. Meditation is a “hot topic” for discussion throughout Western Medicine, and its positive effects on one's overall health have been proven to be undeniable. With all of that in mind, how does meditation connect to Judaism? Was meditation always part and parcel of the Jewish tradition or has it been simply adopted into modern practice and observance? What are the healing modalities of Jewish meditation and what techniques allow us to enjoy its benefits? If you are interested in finding the answers to these questions, and more, this workshop is for you.

Svetlana holds Master's Degrees in Science and Jewish Studies. She studied Jewish Meditation with Melinda Ribner, a close associate of the famous Rabbi Shlomo Carlebach and Rabbi David Cooper, a contemporary master of Jewish meditation.

What are madrikhim, and what do they do? (A madrikh is a male teen assistant, a madrikha is a female teen assistant.) Madrikhim are 8th through 12th graders who help out in classrooms, the office, and with our Shabbat programs. These teens are a valuable part of our program, and all of our teachers appreciate their assistance. They are positive role models for our students and could be the next generation of Jewish educators. Later this spring we will send out letters to recruit teens who would like to be madrikhim for next year. This is a real job with responsibility, and when they are not in class, they are missed by both students and teachers.

In addition to assisting students, Madrikhim in grades 8-10 are expected to be students as well—either at The Polsky Religious School or the Hyman Brand Hebrew Academy. Students can choose to be paid, receive community service hours or participate in a work-scholarship program. Work-scholarship allows them to “bank” their money to use at

a later date for Kadima or USY programs, Jewish summer camp or Israel programs. Many of our madrikhim are able to get jobs teaching when they go off to college. This year we will bid farewell to the following madrikhim who have worked in the school for many years and are off to college and Israel next year: Ally Grant, Jessica Schneider, Ashley Ruben and Ethan Loftspring. They have been a valued part of our teaching staff, and we hope they have gained much from this experience.

Janice Shopmaker's Lemon Pie and Chocolate Pie for Passover



Angel meringue

6 egg whites, room temp.
1 cup superfine sugar
¼ tsp. salt
¼ cup cream of tartar
½ tsp. vanilla

Beat 6 egg whites until stiff
Add sugar
Add salt and cream of tartar
Add vanilla and beat until glossy

2- 10" pie plates-- grease well
Preheat oven to 450°
Place meringue in oven in 2 10" well greased pie plates and turn off oven immediately. Leave pie plates overnight in oven.

Lemon custard for Passover

4 egg yolks
1/2 cup sugar
1 tsp grated lemon rind
6 tablespoons lemon juice
1 cup whipping cream

Beat egg yolks in the top of a double boiler.
Stir in sugar, grated lemon rind and lemon juice.
Cook, stirring over boiling water, for 15 minutes or until thick.
Cool.
Fold whipping cream and custard into meringue and refrigerate.



Chocolate pie filling

6 oz package chocolate bits for Passover
4 egg yolks
1 tsp vanilla
2 egg whites, stiffly beaten
1 cup whipping cream
Shaved bitter chocolate

Place chocolate pieces in top of double boiler. Melt and remove from heat. Beat in the yolk and cool. Fold in egg whites and vanilla. Fold half the whipped cream into the custard. Place in meringue and pour rest of the whipped cream on the top. Sprinkle with shaved chocolate. Chill for several hours.
