"Almighty Adonai, let the children behave at the Seder table, for I have labored so long to make everything right and lovely. Suffer not their little fingers to spill wine on the tablecloth and carpeting, it never seems to come out. And let them pipe the Mah Nishtanah in such abundant glee and wisdom as to make the car pool to Hebrew School worth it."

"G-d of the World: let each year our table be fuller not only with your bounty, but with people—all our loved ones, dear friends, new babies and young lovers shyly brought home for approval."

"G-d Of Abraham, Isaac and Jacob and of Sarah, Rebecca, Rachel and Leah; let me not in the hustle and rush of preparation; forget what Passover really means."

And with our prayers hopefully answered, I wish for you, the Congregation Beth Shalom family, to enjoy the strength of family, friends and companionship, the power of faith, and the magic of renewal and hope this Passover.

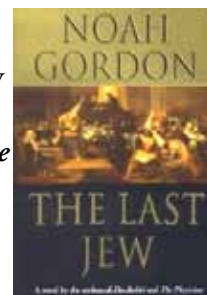

Passover Fun!

This month the RFEC is suggesting some fun Passover activities to keep young children involved in the Seder:

- Have the kids make name place cards
 - Let your children help you peel eggs, wash parsley, make charoset and do anything they can help with to be a part of the preparations.
 - Utilize a child friendly haggadah if you have preschoolers at your seder.
 - Get plastic toys that are similar to the plagues such as frogs, little balls for hail and sunglasses for darkness. See what other ideas the kids have for plagues.
- There are great kid songs to be sung for the Seder. If your children have been in preschool at Beth Shalom, they will know many. Assign different families different parts of the Seder or a song or two to lead.
- At the end of your Seder have everyone pour a little wine or grape juice in a cup and share a wish for the future and then take the juice/wine outside and pour it into a flower bed or garden to grow.

The more kid friendly the Seder, the more meaningful for the children, and the happy memories of Pesach will live on in your kids' minds forever! Chag Pesach Sameach!

Delicious Grouper

Prep Time: 5 minutes

Cook Time: 15 minutes

Total Time: 20 minutes

Ingredients:

- 1/2 cup grated Parmesan cheese
- 1/3 cup butter, softened, not melted
- 2 tablespoons mayonnaise
- 2 scallions, thinly sliced
- 2 large or 4 small (1-inch-thick) grouper fillets or other fish fillets
- 1 lemon
- freshly ground black pepper

Preparation:

1. Preheat broiler to high.
2. In a small bowl, combine the Parmesan, butter, mayonnaise, and scallions. Set aside.
3. Place the grouper fillets on a lightly greased broiler pan. Squeeze the juice from 1 lemon over the fillets and sprinkle with black pepper.
4. Broil 6 inches from heat for 10 minutes. Remove from oven. Spread the tops of the fillets with cheese mixture.
5. Return to oven and broil for 2 minutes longer or until the topping is lightly browned and bubbly. Remove fillets to platter.


