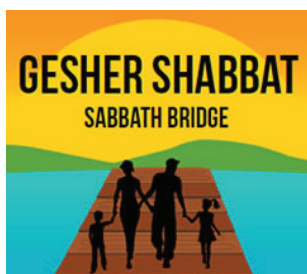

# From the Rabbi's Study

## Making the Spiritual Personal, and the Personal Spiritual



Marshall Ganz, a professor at the Kennedy School of Government, was one of the chief organizers for the “Camp Obama” approach to training young campaign workers for the 2008 election. Ganz took the lessons of community organizing and massive social change and applied them to a national presidential campaign.

In Ganz’ playbook, he writes of three stories that drive change: “The Story of Self,” the “Story of Us,” and the “Story of Now.” He instructs his students to understand their own personal narrative and learn how a personal narrative intersects with

a communal narrative. Finally, the “Story of Now,” is the narrative of why there is urgency in solving a problem.

Jewish holidays, rituals and practices that are still in existence in broad numbers across the Jewish people are the rituals that can connect with the stories of “self,” “us,” and “now.”

As we approach the holidays of Yom HaShoah (Holocaust Memorial Day), and Yom HaAtzmaut (Israeli Independence Day), I would like to suggest that we begin using these three lenses of self, us and now for finding relevance.

I used to think that what was missing for these modern holidays was ritual. Hanukkah has a menorah, Passover has a Seder – binding rituals

that are absent in remembering the tragedy of the Shoah and the hope of the creation of the State of Israel.

My thinking has shifted, though. It is not enough to have ritual. We need stories. It is not enough to have the disembodiment of history. We need to see how our own stories connect.

This year – my challenge to us is to uncover the stories this Spring. These stories might be from us, they might be from our family and they might be from our friends’ stories.

To quote Elie Wiesel who passed away between last Yom HaShoah and this year’s: “God created man because He loves stories”.

## The Healing Power of the Kaddish

I practiced law for twenty-eight years. One of the reasons I became a lawyer was to help my clients with whatever problems they brought to my door. When I left my practice in February 2006, I needed to find another way to help people that fit within the limitations of the movement disorder that had caused me to retire.

I decided to join the Monday morning minyan to help assure that those saying Kaddish could do so. I was grateful for the warm welcome from the regulars and quickly came

to appreciate the sense of community within that small gathering. Both of my parents were in their final years, and I knew that before too long, I would need the minyan as much or more as the minyan would need me.

I wasn’t wrong. When my father died in January 2008 and my mother in November 2009, I experienced the other side of the minyan, taking comfort in the supportive, consoling words of my friends. That didn’t surprise me.

What did surprise me was how saying Kaddish for eleven months helped soothe the hole in my heart.

Taking the time to pray and remember my parents strengthened my memories of them and my relationship to God. I often looked at the bimah while reciting the Kaddish, imagining that my parents were sitting there, watching and grateful for my prayers. I still do that when saying Kaddish on their Yahrzeit; once again making my memories of them a blessing.

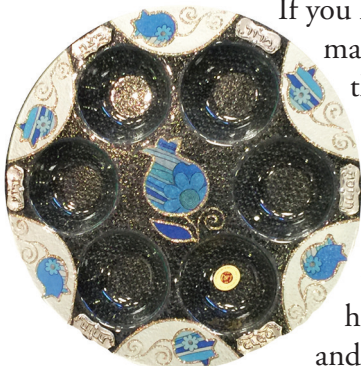

## Passover is Around the Corner

Passover is around the corner. Below are some ideas to make Passover more interactive for you and your children:

- Before Passover have your children help you come up with fun symbols for each of the plagues. For example: Ping Pong Balls or cotton balls for hail, get all kinds of frogs you can throw at your table. US Toy Carnival prize area has all kinds of animals for wild beasts as well as frogs, red food coloring and a clear bowl of water for blood and so many other ideas! Enjoy brain storming in advance

with your kids and then put them in charge of the plagues during the Seder!

- Make sure you sing all the fun Passover songs like *Lots and Lots of Matzah* by Ellen Allard and *Where is Baby Moses...* author unknown.
- Have your child help make name places for your guests.
- Buy different children's Haggadot as well as some fun interactive adult ones and pass them out for the seder. Let people share meaningful readings and ideas from the different Haggadot. *Uncle Eli's Special for Kids, A Most Fun Ever, Under the Table Passover Haggadah* by Eliezer Lorne Segal

is a great one.

- Invite family members in advance to send you their best memories of their childhood seders and read their memories at different times throughout the seder. It is great for children to hear about their aunts', uncles' and grandparents' memories and experiences.

- At the end of the seder go around the room and ask people to make a wish for next year...when the Haggadah says next year in Jerusalem what else do we hope for next year.

### Spring Cleaning for a Cause



What is the point of spring cleaning? Whether it is to get ready for Passover, or whether it's to refresh our homes after spending so much inside-time during the winter, there is something truly liberating about going through drawers, closets, pantries and shelves and getting rid of what we haven't used and no longer need.

This year I encourage you to take two additional steps in your preparations for Passover and spring cleaning. First, I strongly encourage you to consider making donations of food to the JFS Food Pantry, located within

the JCC. The JFS Food Pantry provides much needed food and personal supplies to over 290 families a month. They collect both kosher and non-kosher food, personal care items and even food for cats and dogs. Please consider giving some of the unopened food you would otherwise pack away for the end of Passover to the JFS Food pantry. If you would like to donate Kosher for Passover food, Beth Shalom is collecting Matzah Ball Soup mix and grape juice in the large white barrels at shul.

Second, if during your spring cleaning, you find clothing, home furnishings or other items that are still

in good shape, but are not so useful to you and your family, please consider donating them to Jewish Vocational Services. JVS helps refugees who have made Kansas City their home. They accept donations of beds, dressers, tables and chairs, couches and clothing. To have your donation picked up, call 816-471-2808, or you can drop off donations at their warehouse location, 2516 Pennway, KC, MO, 64108.

What better way to celebrate your freedom than to help redeem those who are in need? My daughters and I will be making donations both to JFS Food Pantry and JVS this year. I hope you will join us!

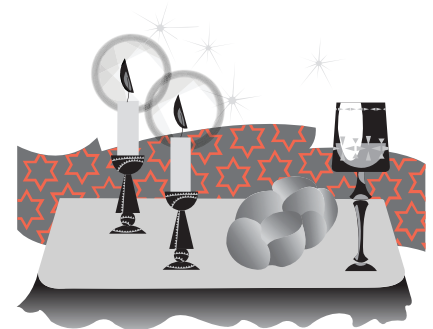

**Healthy Tuna Stuffed Avocado**

**Ingredients:**

- 1 avocado, halved and pitted
- 1 (4.5 oz) can tuna, drained
- ¼ cup diced red bell pepper
- 1 tablespoon minced jalapeno
- ¼ cup cilantro leaves, roughly chopped
- 1 tablespoon lime juice
- salt and pepper (to taste)

**Instructions:**



Scoop out some of the avocado from the pitted area to widen the "bowl" area. Place the scooped avocado into a medium-size mixing bowl.

Mash it with a fork.

Add the tuna, bell pepper, jalapeno, and cilantro to the mixing bowl. Pour in lime juice. Stir it all together until everything is well mixed.

Scoop the tuna into the avocado bowls. Season with salt and pepper.
