# From the Rabbi's Study

#### The Joy and Immortality of Bar and Bat Mitzvah



Annie and I wish to thank the community for helping us celebrate our son Gavi's Bar Mitzvah the weekend of July Fourth. It was truly a

peak experience for our family. Additionally, we had family and friends from out of town, and they were all so impressed with the beauty and warmth of the CBS community. Thank you.

Gavi was born in between the day of my ordination and the day I began working as a rabbi in Dallas, Texas. So, just as it is his Bar Mitzvah, it is my Bar Mitzvah year in the rabbinate. In these thirteen years I have been privileged to officiate at dozens if not hundreds of Bar and Bat Mitzvah ceremonies. It is so different being on the other side. The pride, the joy, and

the emotion all took me by surprise.

What surprised me the most was how the Bar Mitzvah made me reflect on my own mortality. Gavi and I went to the weekday minyan during the week before we celebrated on Shabbat. As he was leading the service in the chapel at Village Shalom, I reflected on religious change that had taken place. By his becoming a full and equal part of the community, not only did Gavi count in the minyan, but he could lead the community in prayer. In other words, by his saying a blessing, and by me saying "amen," he had discharged my religious responsibility. It was the first time that my son religiously did something for me.

This subtle change in Jewish legal status made me fast forward in my mind and thinking of how slowly, imperceptibly the roles will reverse.

Before I know it, my children will be giving me the help that I need, they will be caring for me, and one day, it will be they who say Kaddish for my soul.

Though I wasn't conscious of it before, perhaps therein lies the joy of the Bar or Bat Mitzvah ceremony. When we see a child at the bimah, who is on the cusp of adulthood, we are able to imagine our own immortality. That might be the source of the joy. We can say to ourselves, "Perhaps. Perhaps, it won't all end with us, and the story will last another generation."



Fall means the start of school. Fall means the High Holy Days. And, fall means gearing up, up, up! This month we return to Hebrew School and do, indeed, look headlong into the High Holy Day season.

This year marks the beginning of a new chapter in my life, personally – I'm no longer a rookie at CBS! Last year I made very few changes to the curriculum, to the way our school works. #### Miss Judy's Guide to Reading

It is hard to believe summer is almost over! Getting ready to start a new school year takes planning. Miss Judy recommends that you read, read, read with your child! Being a good reader guarantees success in school!



For little ones who don't read yet, being read to regularly helps children develop a love for books and a wonderful feeling about reading. What is better than snuggling with a book and discussing it with total attention from your mommy or daddy? Read all kinds of books, rhymes, poetry, silly jokes, autobiographies and stories where your kids can guess the ending before you read what will happen.

Miss Judy also suggests that you play rhyming, opposites, number and category games in the car instead of listening to music or watching a video. Other suggestions for getting a child ready to read are finding words that

start with a letter or sound or words that are synonyms and finding things that look like shapes.

Encouraging your children to help clean up and emphasizing good manners helps get them ready for school. Have play dates with kids who will be going to your child's school. Start putting your children to bed a little earlier so they can get up early in the morning and be well rested.


