# **Voting our Values in Every Election**

The Jewish tradition has an ambivalent relationship with governmental power. On one hand Pirkei Avot tells us to be wary of the government. On the other hand, we have specific blessings for when we see a head of state. The Torah has explicit descriptions of the values a king should have, and the Talmud is rife with narratives of interactions between the rabbis of Babylonia and the Land of Israel having interactions with both local officials as well as ruling emperors.

Throughout history, Jews have been the subject of the laws that have governed the lands where we've lived. We have also tried to have relationships with the individuals in power so that we could try to be active citizens protecting the Jewish community.

No country has a longer, unbroken history of Jewish suffrage than the United States of America. I do not think that the disproportionate number of Jewish elected officials and appointed judges reflect anything inherent about the Jews. What it does reflect, though, is a community that has expressed its gratitude through active voting.

I look at voting as using a gift. When a relative or a loved one gives you a precious gift, the best way to express gratitude is by using the gift often. Not only does it demonstrate to the gift-giver your gratitude, it also makes you think warmly of the individual who gave you the gift. The way that we can express gratitude for the unique religious freedom we have enjoyed as a community in America is to show up at every election possible.

National elections, and national Presidential elections in particular, gather the most headlines and foster the most opinion pieces in the news. Local and state elections, though, likely affect our every-day lives even more than national elections. Furthermore, by being involved in local and state civic leadership, it sends a message to our neighbors that we care deeply about the quality of living for all the residents of the Greater Kansas City area.

- The primary election for Kansas is on August 7.

This year marks 242 years since Jewish men have been able to vote in the United States. It has been 150 years (since the passage of the 14th Amendment) for African American men to be able to vote. This August it will be 98 years since all women in America have been able to vote. Let's show appreciation for this gift: and use it.

# Life Lesson 11: Let's Forgive and Move On

"The bravest and the smartest thing you can do in a bad situation is to forgive and move on. Don't allow grudges and grievances to add to the weight you carry on the road to your own success."

These words by thought leader Lolly Daskal aren't telling us to forget the tough things in life that happen to us; she is telling us to forgive those who have offended us. When we carry the weight of allowing a grudge to take over part of our mind, we are not able to give 100% to the work we do or the people we love.

Sometimes we are the offended; sometimes we are the offender. Sometimes, we may say stupid things; sometimes, we may say things stupidly. I am sure there are times when no one should have been offended. We cannot change the past; we can only look forward to the future.
