The Sanford M. Dunn Scholarship Fund for Study in Israel Applications are now being accepted for the Sanford M. Dunn Scholarship for study in Israel. Created in 1988 in memory of Sanford M. Dunn by his wife Patsy and children Daniel and Debbi, the scholarship is awarded on the basis of merit, not financial need, demonstrated by:

- A record of academic achievement.

- A bona fide proposal for study in Israel, as part of an established program or as an individual or original project.
- References from teachers, rabbis or similarly qualified individuals.
- Or any combination of the above. Age of applicants is not a factor, and while they need not be affiliated with the synagogue, first preference will be given to meritorious applicants from CBS. To apply: submit the above

documents to substantiate your qualifications. These documents must be received by the Beth Shalom Scholarship Committee no later than February 13 in care of the Beth Shalom Religious School Office at 14200 Lamar Ave, Overland Park, Kansas 66223. Minyan Maker Committee Says Thank You

The Minyan Maker Committee would like to thank those members of our congregation who are "regular" attendees of morning minyan, coming one or more times per week, "pinch hitters" who attend when contacted by email for mornings when ten people are not signed in and those who do not attend on a regular basis but sign in when they are available. All three groups are essential to assuring a daily morning minyan for mourners, those who are observing yahrzeit and those

who would like to start their day off "davening" with a minyan.

Minyan Maker has approximately 40 "regular" attendees, 10 who attend more than one day per week. There are 15 "pinch hitters" who come to bat as needed when they are available and another 10 Minyan Makers who attend periodically.

This is a cordial invitation to each and every member of CBS to join one of the three groups described above. Each Minyan Maker would welcome your help to make the daily minyan. Many of our "regulars" are individuals who observed the 11 months of attending minyan as mourners and want to assure that other mourners also have a daily minyan to say Kaddish. It would be most helpful if those who attend for yahrzeit would come to minyan when they don't have yahrzeit to guarantee a minyan for others. We hope that many of you will accept our invitation. ing as the beginning of the year. We have two programs this month where all families with children will celebrate in the synagogue together.

Friday evening, December 12 is the second Kehillat Shabbat program. "Accept the Hebrew Challenge"

The Rabbinical Association of Greater KC in collaboration with area congregations, The Jewish Federation of Greater Kansas City and Hyman Brand Hebrew Academy invite 67 members of the Jewish community to "ACCEPT THE HEBREW CHALLENGE" to celebrate Israel's 67th year of independence.

This challenge is to adults and children over 8 who have minimal or no previous knowledge in reading Hebrew AND wish to acquire a basic knowledge of reading Hebrew by April 15, 2015.

Learning experiences will include a self-paced computer program and Hebrew instruction classes in your synagogue or the community. Group sessions will be taught by Israeli instructor Orit Kamara and will meet for 7 two-hour sessions on Sundays or on Mondays. Other times may be available.

Group fees are \$90 per person with discounts for family, friends, and those over 65. Cost for the self-paced computer program is \$55 per person.

Those completing the challenge will be recognized at this year's Yom HaAtzmaut community-wide celebration. Those wishing to continue learning Hebrew can participate in a weekly Hebrew reading club with Hebrew speaking instructors.





Editorial Comments





Potato Latkes





- 1 small yellow onion
- 3 Tbs matzah meal
- ¼ tsp. baking powder
- 2 tsp Kosher salt

- Vegetable oil for frying
- 1 large egg, lightly beaten
- 1 Tbs chopped fresh herbs such as chives or parsely for garnish
- Sour cream for serving

Directions:

Peel potatoes and shred in a food processor. Repeat processing with the onion. Place the two in a large bowl. Stir in matzah meal, egg, baking powder and salt.

Fill a large skillet with ½ inch oil and heat over medium-high heat until oil is very hot but not smoking. Oil is hot enough when a little of mixture sizzles when dropped into the skillet. Scoop the mixture by ¼ cupfuls and add to hot oil. Flatten each latke slightly. Fry the latkes, turning them once, for approximately three minutes until golden brown. Drain the latkes on paper towels.

Serve immediately or keep warm in a 200° oven.
