from the hazzan's study

The Gabbayim

It is an honor to be called to the Torah, to say the blessings over the reading of the Torah. But who calls up those to be honored? It is an honor to read from the Torah, to present precisely according to our tradition the word of God. But who corrects and prompts those reading? Who helps guests who come up on the bimah, and who is responsible for knowing those special prayers and honors for each Shabbat of the year? The gabbai! The gabbai is not the *shalliach tzibbur* (prayer leader) nor is he/she the *baal koreh* (Torah reader for the day), but the gabbai keeps the service moving, maintaining the *kavannah* (mental focus) for the public hearing of the Law. The *gabbayim* (plural) have significant *halakhic* responsibility and, as identified in the *Mishnah Berurah*, signify the role of HaShem in the Torah service.

It is neither flashy nor sexy to be a gabbai, and it's not always obvious how important the gabbai is to the service. But to volunteer as a gabbai is a mitzvah in the broadest sense. So how can one become a gabbai? Does it take years of training and special talent? No! If you read Hebrew and are of good moral character - and attend our **Gabbai Workshop** on **Thursday**, **February 18** at 7:30 p.m. (see further information below) at Wornall - you could be on the bimah next month. The



workshop is by invitation, but if you are interested in becoming a gabbai, call Rabbi Tobin and let him know. You're going to be at the Shabbat service anyway, why not draw closer to Torah and to God?

He is married to Hildy Goldman, and they have three adult children and two cockapoos, Roxy and Ruby, who Joel claims "may never grow up."





Our Children Learn Tefillot

Our religious school students begin their day with tefillot, which teaches them the order of the prayers in the morning and afternoon/evening services. This learning is reinforced in Hebrew classes as students work on reading skills and discussions about the meaning of the prayers.

The Polsky Religious School's tefillah and Hebrew program are designed to enable students to regularly participate in prayer experiences and grasp the meaning and structure of our prayers. The emphasis placed on tefillot helps our children demonstrate skills needed to become leaders of tefillot, both for their peers and at their Bar/Bat Mitzvah.

We encourage our parents to join their children at our various Tefillot on Sunday mornings: 5th-10th grade minyan meets in the library, 3rd and 4th grade services meet in their respective classrooms, and preK-2nd service led by Rabbi Stein and Jamie Katz meets in room 109. 


