From the Rabbi's Study

We Need More Talking in Synagogue



One of my most pronounced weaknesses is my tendency to *kibbitz* in shul. This is a flaw not only because I am the Rabbi, but also because it can distract the person leading services as well as the other attendees in the service.

However, one of the reasons that I have a hard time not talking, as well as why I have a difficult time “shushing” others is that I love feeling that place of human contact (and I love witnessing others connecting too!).

I know that talking during services is not a positive trait, and one that I should work on. However, talking in synagogue – in the hall-

ways, before services, during Kiddush, walking up the path – this should be encouraged. We actually need more talking in synagogue overall, not less.

I would like to suggest that we not only need more talking – we need different talking. I read a wonderful piece in the “Modern Love” section of the *New York Times* titled “The End of Small Talk.” (<http://nyti.ms/1JMTuU7>). It was a charming article about a man on the search for love who simply stopped engaging in small talk on dates and went right into the biggest and most personal interactions possible.

In *Pirkei Avot* we read: “two who sit and exchange words of Torah, the Divine Presence rests amongst them”

(3:2). Later on in that chapter, Rabbi Shimon says “Three who eat at one table and do not speak words of Torah, it is as if they have eaten of idolatrous sacrifices”.

Though it is wonderful to talk about the weekly parasha, I think we also need to learn each others’ Torah. The Torah is a book of journeys, instruction, and wisdom. The Torah tells our story of families, God and covenant. The next Shabbat you are at Kiddush, take the time to learn the personal Torah of the person sitting next to you so “the Divine Presence can rest amongst you”.

Executively Speaking

One Woman's Jewish Perspective of Valentine's Day



About 24 years ago as a new executive director, I was told by the rabbi that under no circumstances could the staff (all of whom were not Jewish) celebrate Valentine's Day in the office. This included no flowers, no heart-shaped boxes of candy displayed on a desk and no balloons or cards. I personally felt that this request was harsh, but I followed the directives of the rabbi and set down the rules. I guess some rules need to be broken. That evening when only the rabbi and I remained in the office, I heard him making reservations in one of the nicest restaurants in town. Jokingly, I called him on it. The reply, "I

do not believe in Valentine's Day, but I have to live with her".

So, can we celebrate Valentine's Day with a clear conscience? I took some time to study some Jewish views. One that made me look twice is from the Rama, Rabbi Moshe Isserlis, Poland 1520-1572. He explained that there are four criteria that must be met in order to permit Jewish celebration of rituals initiated by Gentiles. They are: Does the debated activity have a secular origin or value? Can one rationally explain the behavior or ritual apart from the Gentile holiday or event? If there are idolatrous origins, have they disappeared? Are the activities actually consistent with Jewish tradition?

So yes, more than 450 years later, we can certainly contend that the rituals performed today do meet these criteria. The cards, candy and gifts are expressions of love. Most Halachic authorities feel that Valentine's Day no longer has any sufficient connection to its idolatrous roots even though there are some who still distance themselves from this holiday and its shady past. One of our Talmudic Sages tells us that "love" represents the ultimate mitzvah. My take on this is we should always celebrate love, not just on Valentine's Day, but every day of our lives. So...when the sun goes down, let's raise our cup to love and happiness.

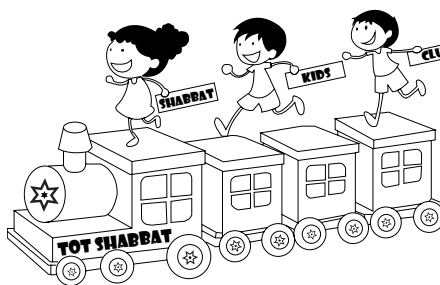

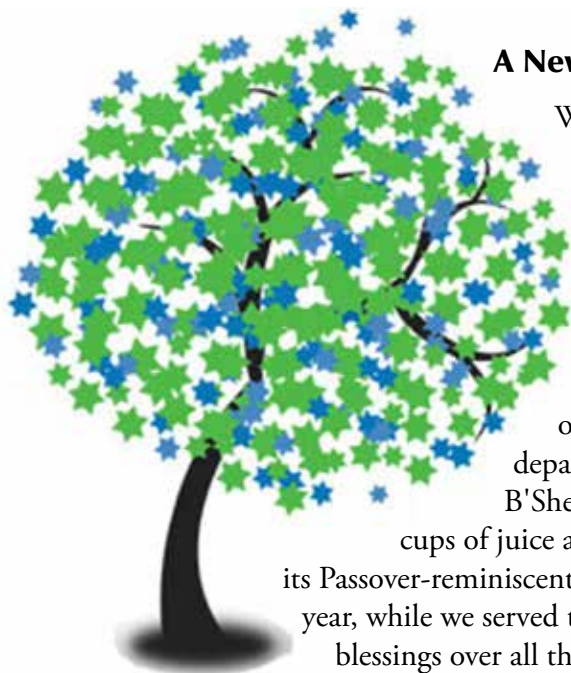

A New Take on Tu B'Shevat

While we are still in the throes of winter and the East Coast is buried under feet of snow, in Israel, they have celebrated the coming of spring with Tu B'Shevat. In our Hebrew School, we departed from the usual Tu B'Shevat seder, with its four cups of juice and different fruits and its Passover-reminiscent template. Instead this year, while we served the juice and made the blessings over all the fruits, we considered

the values and the ethical issues surrounding the human relationship with the plants and animals with whom we share this world. We debated the conflicts between human advancement and the protection of our environment. At a time when the post-biblical injunction to mark the age of trees in order to pay a tax to the Temple of first fruits is irrelevant, we face the opportunity to redefine the holiday of Tu B'Shevat.

I am hopeful that this year, our fifth through seventh grade students came away from the program with a new sense of the Jewish imperative to consider thoughtfully how we live and how we use the materials that our environment provides for us.
