

From the Rabbi's Study

Hanukkah – in January

I know that it seems funny to write about Hanukkah in January. I am not writing today about the holiday, Hanukkah, but rather the Hebrew word.

But it was not simply a Hakah – a rededication – of an amazing congregation. Though the holiday of Hanukkah has ended for this year, I hope that will not stop you from adding your personal light to this community.

Progress Report – Search Committee for "Clergy 2": Director of Congregational Learning

The search committee has begun the process of seeking a second clergy position. This Committee, Cochaired by Jason Krakow and Norman Kahn, includes Jeff Goldenberg, Steve Flekier, Beryl Silberg, Steve Schorr, Don Cohen, Larry Kalendar, Richard Simon, Rhea Salasche, Mike Abrams, Rita Cortes, Cindy Daniels, Art Federman, Ellen Chilton, Ann Karty, Alana Muller, Mirra Klausner, Cathy Newman and Rabbi Glickman. This position will be titled "Director of Congregational Learning".

In consultation with Rabbi Glickman, the role for this new position is to build a vision for dynamic and engaging Jewish learning across the age groups within our synagogue. In the beginning, this role will focus primarily on congregational and family education, starting with

the Polsky Religious School, teaching, leading services when needed, giving Diveri Torah, and leading High Holy Day services for families and youth. The search committee prefers this individual to have a singing voice and musical ability that will facilitate the spirituality of congregants. The committee has developed a congregational questionnaire which is being posted to attract candidates from our three target groups: the Rabbinical Assembly, the Cantorial Assembly and the Jewish Educators Association.

Our 5th-7th grade students have been studying the Ashrei prayer. Dayna Gershon, who leads their tefillot asked each student to write a line for their own contemporary Ashrei which they have been reading during their tefillah time.

This prayer, whose first word means "happy are they," is recited three times a day—twice during the morning service and once during the afternoon prayers. The main theme of Ashrei is taking care of the needs of human society and of all living things. It is written as an acrostic in the Hebrew alphabet. In the Ashrei, the letter nun is missing and there is an association between this letter and the destruction of the Temple which is why in this acrostic there is no line beginning with the letter nun.
