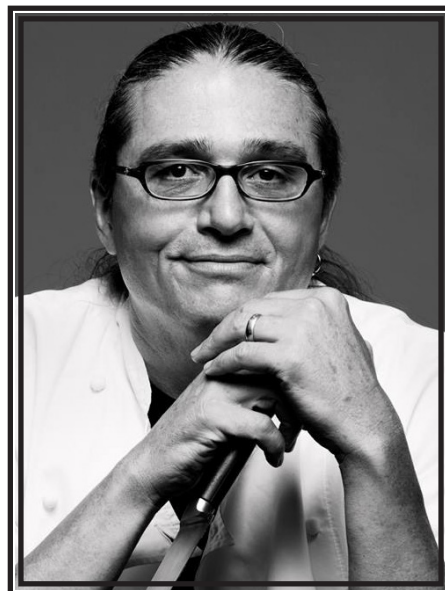

## God Renews us Each Day

The January 1st New Year is funny for us as Jews. On one hand, we have Rosh HaShanah which is most definitely our new year. On the other hand, we live in an American society, and New Year's is a cultural holiday without any religious connotations. It is the perfect holiday for us to celebrate as Jews.

It would be easy to dismiss January 1 religiously, and this would be a mistake. Rabbi Eliezer famously said in Pirkei Avot: "Do teshuvah (repentance) one day before you die." Since we do not know which day we will leave this earth, teshuvah must be an ongoing process.

*Also, we say in the blessing before the Shema in the morning that in "God's goodness, God renews the work of creation daily." Every day is an opportunity for renewal – if we allow it to be.*

If you are a regular attendee at a gym, you know that the gym and all of its fitness classes are filled to the brim during the first week of January. By the second week of March – far less so.

One of the great innovations of Jewish theology is the powerful belief that the body and the soul are intimately connected. If you are going to use January as a time to kick-start a physical habit like eating, exercise, quit smoking or regular sleep – see it as a time to kick start a spiritual habit.

We have many new "entry points" into our spiritual community at Congregation Beth Shalom. We have opportunities for uplifting prayer in our new Tefillateinu service. We have opportunities for giving in our new partnership with JVS for their Refugee birthday party. Also, we have time for personal and intellectual connection with our Talmud Jam's and Pop Up Rabbi KC times for coffee.

Use January 1 to kick start a physical habit. I invite you to consider it also as a time to kick start a spiritual habit. What I mentioned above are synagogue "programs." Ultimately, a spiritual habit isn't about simply showing up for a synagogue program. A spiritual habit is about taking action regularly to refine your spirit. Going to one gym class or attending one class on sensible eating won't change our physical health – but regular exercise and healthy food can. Similarly, spiritual change won't happen just by showing up for one or two programs. It is about creating personal, regular, spiritual practices that allow us to connect with the Divine. This can be through intentional prayer or meditation, through intentional tzedakah or acts of compassion, or through intentional Torah study.

I wish you a happy – and renewing – secular New Year, and hope that Congregation Beth Shalom can be your partner making it a year of renewal.

## Tu B'Shevat

Tu B'shevat, also known as the "Birthday of the Trees" falls on January 21 this year. Below are some ideas of ways you can celebrate this holiday with your child.

- Plant something together.
- Taste a variety of fruits. Talk about different kinds of seeds, what type of trees they grow on, their skin or peels, are they edible, etc.
- Drink different shades of grape juice and talk about the colors and how they may relate to seasons. Which season is dark longer (the days are shorter) and which season are the days longer and brighter.

**Create a "handprint tree." Paint your or your child's arm and hand brown to use as the tree trunk and branches. Dip finger tips into leaf colored paint to use as leaves.**

- Make an edible tree using pretzel rods/sticks as the trunk and branches and green grapes cut in half as the leaves.
- Play Jewish music and move your body like trees swaying in the breeze.





## Life Lesson 16: “Tell me and I forget. Teach me and I remember. Involve me and I learn.” Benjamin Franklin

Some students do well in certain subjects and struggle with others. Some adults continue to struggle with doing things they may have been doing for years. With much practice, we can all do our job well. But we cannot excel at something without the talent to do it.

When we as adults are shown how to do something and we don't understand it the first time, many of us are too embarrassed to say we don't understand; please show us again. Too often we allow our egos to get in the way of our learning. Some of us will understand certain things much more quickly than others. However, there are things others will learn more quickly than we do.

**“Give a man a fish and you feed him for a day; teach a man to fish and you feed him for a lifetime.” The source of this quote may be unclear, but the message is very clear. If you teach someone a skill that will benefit them for the rest of their life, you have done a wonderful mitzvah. They may not have the talent to be a commercial fisherman or catch a big tuna, but they can be able to feed their family.**

We all have been blessed with certain talents, some of which we may not realize we have. We all have learned many skills and do not understand why other people are much better at performing some of those skills than we are. Maybe we are the ones performing at a much higher level than others. Unless we have the talent to do something, we will never excel at the skill associated with that talent. The bottom line is you can't teach a talent; you can only teach a skill.

If you want me to be the best at something, don't try and teach me a skill I don't have the talent to learn and expect me to be proficient at it. It is futile. Rather, help me excel where my talents lie; help to be even better at what I am already good at.

As Judge Judy said, “Don't try to teach a pig to sing. It doesn't work, and it annoys the pig.”

## Fund for our Future Moves Ahead

As you know, our Board authorized the Congregation to hire an architect to design a new sacred space, to complete the project which was envisioned years ago for our Lamar campus. Rabbi Glickman, Hazzan Ben-Yehuda, and the Building Committee, headed by Gina Kaiser, have worked closely with our architects, Preston Scott Cohen, Inc. and BNIM Architects. If you have seen the model and pictures, I hope you agree that their work, when completed, will make our building into one that brings you - our members and your families - closer together and closer to the Almighty. At the same time, we need to make sure that our clergy and staff have the resources they need to ensure that what takes place in our building is as inspiring and memorable as the space itself.

Our Fund for the Future is intended to raise money to build a sanctuary and to enhance our funding for endowment and programming. I'm pleased to announce that four of our past presidents - Mike Abrams, Fred Bodker, Ron Coppaken, and Kurt Kavanaugh, have agreed to serve as co-chairs of our fundraising committee.

Our goal is to raise \$15 million. We have an excellent start from a wonderful contribution of \$1.5 million from the late Hannah Krumholz, who designated her gift for our sacred space. In addition, we have a very generous donor who will match 50% of each dollar you contribute towards the building, up to a maximum match of \$5 million.

As we announced previously, there is no required contribution to this fund and there will be no assessment. That said, we can only build our future with your help. We are hoping each of you will invest in your synagogue, by contributing what is meaningful for you and your family. In so doing, you will help insure a thriving Conservative Jewish community in the Kansas City area, now and far into the future. ### *Sisterhood Celebrates its 95th Birthday with Song and Prayer*

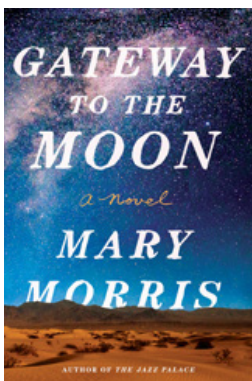
Sisterhood invites the entire Congregation to join us for Sisterhood Shabbat in commemoration of our 95th birthday on Shabbat morning, January 19.
