Annual Meeting Update

Over 250 congregants attended our annual meeting on June 13. Our Officers and Board Members were installed,

The Long Range Planning Task Force announced it would recommend the Board adopt the following *Identity Statement* as our guide:

We are a diverse, egalitarian, Conservative Jewish community striving to enhance lifelong connections to Judaism and to each other through prayer, spirituality, learning and friendship.

The Task Force will also recommend that the Board of Directors adopt the following *Strategic Imperatives* to implement the *Identity Statement*:

- CBS will offer learning opportunities to meet the needs of our members.
- CBS will offer creative opportunities for a variety of prayer and spiritual experiences to meet the diverse needs of our members.
- CBS will continue to strengthen and build our congregational community.

From the Rabbi's Study



Waiting for the Messiah or Making it Happen Ourselves

Harold Camping's prediction that the world would come to an end proved incorrect, and some were disappointed. I was neither disappointed nor surprised. I was not surprised because I do not subscribe to that kind of religious

theology. In my world view, while God is the ultimate source, human action is what leads to most results. I do not subscribe to nor advocate that we sit back with the belief that God will provide or that God will resolve all matters. I would surmise that most of you feel similarly. When there is illness, you seek medical attention and care. When there is a financial crisis, you seek a proper solution.

While this model is applicable on a global plane, it is equally appropriate for local and personal matters. There are those who would consider our congregation ill and in need of attention. The cure will come not through divine intervention nor just because we fervently pray or express a set of beliefs. Nor will it happen just because we wish it to or due to our righteous behavior (although that is always a good way to live.)

No, the cure requires the commitment to be involved in the curative process. Our decision to stay was easy because it was the responsible action to take. You do not turn your back on people in a time of need. Now is similarly the time for all congregants to do the same. Starting no later than July 1st, every member (100%) must commit to one activity and/or effort on behalf of Beth Shalom. Every member (100%) must dedicate her/himself to the path of re-envisioning and rebuilding. Every member (100%) must get involved as a volunteer with a program or a project. And every member (100%) must commit to do financially what he/she can do.

Harold Camping and his followers have their world view. Among Jews there is the debate whether the Messiah will be a singular figure or is the totality of the people Israel. I totally dismiss the Camping approach and personally favor the second view among Jewish theologians. I do not suggest that the Messiah awaits our combined efforts during this coming year, but I do see a new age for American Judaism and its congregations. That new age will be brought about by the united efforts of all.

Community Tisha B'Av Commemoration

Beth Shalom will observe Tisha B'Av this year along with B'nai Jehudah and Ohev Sholom on **Monday, August 8**, 8 pm at Lamar in Goldsmith Hall.

Tisha B'Av, the ninth of Av, is a day of mourning and fasting commemorating the destruction of the First and Second Temples in Jerusalem in 586 BCE and 70 CE respectively. The joint service will begin with Ma'ariv and immediately followed by the chanting of *Megillat Eikhah*, the *Book of Lamentations*. It is customary to dim the lights and read by candlelight or flashlight, and to sit on the floor, during the chanting of *Eikhah*, and to stand for the rest of the service, if one is able.

The commemoration will continue on **Tuesday, August 9**, 7 am at Village Shalom, Appleman Synagogue, with Shacharit which will include a Torah reading and *Eikhah*. Remember that on Tisha B'Av we do not wear tallit or tefillin in the morning. The day will conclude with Minchah at 6 pm at Village Shalom, Appleman Synagogue.

Congregational Interfaith Burial Policy

In April, the Board of Directors approved a policy authorizing burial of interfaith couples and a defined class of non-Jewish relatives at Mt. Carmel Cemetery. The Board's decision flows from a teshuvah (legal ruling) issued by the Committee on

Jewish Law and Procedure of the Rabbinical Assembly, the central authority on Halakhah within the Conservative Movement. Prior to presentation to the Board, the policy was researched, vetted and approved by the Keruv Initiative, Cemetery Committee and Rabbi Tobin. In keeping with applicable teshuvah, the following are the congregational standards governing interfaith burial:

Interfaith burial will be located in a specifically dedicated area within Mt. Carmel Cemetery.

Only a non-Jewish spouse, mother, father, brother, sister, son or daughter of a member of the Congregation in good standing, may be buried in the interfaith section of Mt. Carmel, subject to acceptance of the body by the senior rabbi of the Congregation.

Burial must comply with *Halakhah* as determined by the senior rabbi of the Congregation.

No non-Jewish service, ritual or symbol will be permitted at Mt. Carmel.

At the discretion of the senior rabbi, other clergy may participate in a service at the Yukon Chapel, graveside or other prayer service or ceremony.

Anyone dissatisfied with a decision from the senior rabbi may, after consultation with the senior rabbi, appeal that decision to the Board of Directors.

As a holy obligation, tzedakah is the act of giving to those less fortunate.
