#### We are so excited to begin our life with the CBS family

Shalom!

My wife, Annie, our children, Gavi, Ellie and Dani, and I are so excited to begin our life with the CBS family. We can't wait to begin meeting people at synagogue on Shabbat, or exercising at the JCC, or just around town. I will be in the office starting the third week of July, and if you are around, I'd love to see you at the synagogue or for a cup of coffee.

The summer months are known for their LACK of Jewish holidays. I would like to suggest that there is one Jewish holiday that we often overlook – the Fourth of July. "What?" you ask, "That's an American holiday! How can Fourth of July be a Jewish holiday?"

As anyone who has lived outside of America can testify - the Jewish people are blessed by the existence of the United States of America. The United States was the first nation to extend full rights to its Jewish citizens. With a few notable exceptions, America has had few instances of state-sponsored anti-Semitism. We as Jews have so much to be grateful for the United States: the defeat of the Nazis, the recognition and support of the State of Israel, and unprecedented freedom to live freely as Jews. All of these (and many more...) are reasons to celebrate this July 4th and express gratitude – not just as Americans, but also as Jews.

I point this out, because I believe that our Judaism isn't meant to be simply tucked away at synagogue, Hebrew School or Day School. Our tradition gives us a toolkit for celebration, and seeing the world through a unique set of eyes.

I look forward to meeting you in the days and weeks ahead. I hope that you have a fun and a meaningful summer!

#### Tisha B'Av

This year B'nai Jehudah will host Tisha B'Av evening study and reading of *Eicha*, *the Book of Lamentations*. Maariv will begin at 8:15 pm, Saturday, July 28 to be followed by readings and reflections by community members and area rabbis. Participating congregations include: Beth Shalom, Beth Torah, B'nai Jehudah, Kol Ami, Ohev Sholom and Temple Israel. For other opportunities to hear *Eicha*, please see offerings available at KI or BIAV.

For Jews around the world, Tisha B'Av (ninth day of Av) traditionally commemorates the destruction of the first and second Temples, which both occurred on that day. The First Temple was destroyed by the Babylonians in 586 B.C.E. and the Second Temple by the Romans in 70 C.E. Over the centuries since, however, this date has become an occasion of mourning and remembrance for the many tragedies experienced by the Jewish people throughout our history. During the three week period preceding this date, weddings and similar celebrations are not permitted, and the same kind of restrictions observed on Yom Kippur are observed on the day of Tisha B'Av itself.

Some other camp activities include:


- Every Friday we enjoy Shabbat singing with our friends to get ready for Shabbat.

Easy ways to bring Judaism rituals on your summer trip.

As you begin packing for a summer trip, there are easy ways to bring Judaism rituals along with you.

- Put together a Shabbat bag with candle-holders, candles, a Kiddush cup and a small bottle of juice. You can get bread or rolls for saying the motzi. For Havdalah, all you need is two Hanukkah candles, juice, and spices.
- Say a blessing or bracha for so many things as you travel. A blessing is a very simple way of inviting God into your midst and begins with the traditional bracha formula of Baruch atah Adonai Elohaynu Melech ha'olam, "Praised are You, Adonai our God, King of the Universe," and then continues with the subject of the blessing.
- In our siddur, Sim Shalom there are several pages of blessings. It is nice
  to travel with a siddur which has all the blessings you need for Shabbat,
  Havdalah, eating, and for the wonders of nature. If you do not have
  these blessings, stop in the office and we will be more than happy to give
  you a copy.

Use your experiences over the summer and your time together as a family to make Judaism a regular part of what you do, no matter where you are. Teach your children to appreciate nature, to praise God and bring Shabbat with you no matter where you are. Have a safe and happy summer.


