From the Rabbi's Study



"Be Conservative"

It is clear to me that Beth Shalom has a real future, but that the nature of that future is yet unknown.

I pray that Beth Shalom will be what it was always meant to be: a Conservative synagogue community which educates its members of all ages, exemplifies a fully lived traditional Judaism in the modern

world, and is firmly committed to the norms and standards of the Conservative movement as they develop.

As our volunteer leadership continues to do the sacred work of future thinking, I note certain trends to be avoided and certain historical facts to be remembered.

Synagogues Matter: Synagogues are the bedrock of Jewish survival, continuity and affiliation. Despite the buzz, it is actual membership in congregations which has always been the best predictor of a Jew's likely support of Federation, JCC, JFS and education. It is the core, the denominational Jew, who has passed and will pass Judaism on to the future. Therefore, it is the core that requires the most attention and communal support.

Content Matters: Judaism is a religion of content. Learning, Living, and Teaching this content is the primary purpose of the synagogue's membership, and the essence of our covenant with God.

Differences Matter: Each denomination's educational needs are different from each other, and need to be supported in parallel, not merged into a neutral communal form. For us, this means Hebrew language, and complete gender equality in our performance of Mitzvot, communal prayer and education. This is true of Pre-School, Religious School and Day School. In each setting our children must learn and live not just Judaism, but our uniquely compelling approach to Judaism.

Fun Matters: It is absolutely necessary to continue to change how we teach. But it would be misguided to eliminate what we need to teach in favor of mere experiences. We must not ignore the denominational differences in the name of informal education, or we lose the baby with the bath water. Camp Ramah, among many examples of excellence, is our best model.

The Staff-Lay Partnership Matters: We have broken down our staffing to create the ability to rebuild. A congregation with our many and varied needs will require a partnership of competent senior staff and volunteers working as equals in knowledge and authority. Staff, volunteers and trustees must have well defined roles and re-enforce each other's roles positively. Proper training for each of those roles is the only way to build the dynamic future which we all dream of for Beth Shalom.

Israel Matters: Israel is the ultimate future of the Jewish world. We must be more educated, more supportive, more involved with the people and future of Israel and in building our Masorti movement there.

God matters: Your Jewish relationship with God is at the core of everything we can ever be. It is not only who we are, but "why" we are. All our troubles and challenges will be all right - if we control less, learn more and seek the good in all people through a personal and communal relationship with *The Holy One*.

I have been privileged to be your rabbi, although for too short a time. Be strong and of good courage. If each of the members of Beth Shalom shows a commitment to be firmly involved at all levels, this sacred community has a bright future in front of it.

Carmel was founded by our earliest congregants in 1885, with a view toward the future. We have enough space to support our needs for the next 145 years.

Our employees, the cemetery committee and Board of Directors of CBS are constantly working to expand, improve and redefine the role of Mt. Carmel in our ever growing, ever changing congregation. Mt. Carmel is financed by a separate account with monies directed solely towards its benefit. This account must stay above a certain amount as mandated by the State of Missouri. Three sources of income support permanent maintenance: investment income, plot sales and donations.

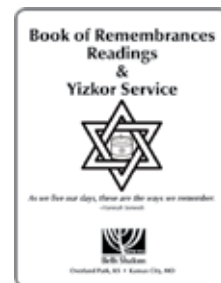

Hebrew High's Innovative Learning Approach

During the past school year, the 8th, 9th and 10th grade students of Beth Shalom's Hebrew High School, housed at our Lamar campus, studied the Holocaust for two trimesters, and genocide in Bosnia, Rwanda and Darfur during the third trimester. Their instructor was Marlene Katz.

The students engaged in an advanced study of the Holocaust, which included survivors' stories researched and portrayed by Katz in character. During the study of genocide in Bosnia, Rwanda and Darfur, students studied the warning signs, the acts of violence, the responses to the violence of genocide, and how the countries are being rebuilt.
