Lost (and found) in Translation: Using Different Lenses to Read Torah



Shavuot | **Saturday, June 8 — Sunday, June 9, 2019**

On the festival of Shavuot, we stay up late learning Torah to commemorate the giving of the Torah. This year we will be looking at different lenses through which we can read our sacred texts to help us find deeper and more relevant meanings.

DAN MARGOLIES "How Alter Altered the way I Read Torah." Biblical Scholar, Robert Alter just completed what may be the most important English translation of the Hebrew Bible since King James. Dan Margolies, a lifelong Torah reader and chanter, will share how Alter's translation has changed the way he reads Torah.

HAZZAN BEN-YEHUDA "Music Matters – what we are hearing with the melodies of chanting". For thousands of years, Jews have had a unique musical language attached to the reading of Bible. Understanding these melodies can help us unlock hidden meaning.

Gifts of the Heart

The construction of the Mishkan—the Holy Tabernacle to welcome God's presence—at its essence did not come from material goods. The Tabernacle begins by God instructing Moses to accept gifts from everyone *whose heart moves them*. (Ex. 25:2)

Before there are any materials given to the Tabernacle, Israelites' hearts must be stirred. Throughout the construction process we hear about *nedivot lev* "gifts of the heart" and *chochmat lev* "wisdom of the heart."

A sacred community is foundationally built within the space we can carve out in our hearts. The gifts of the heart are the ones that build community, and they are not only monetary.

This past number of months, we have buried many beloved members of our community. So many tears. So many joyful memories. So many holes in our lives where these people lived. But the inspiration for Hazzan Ben-Yehuda and me was seeing how people stepped up to comfort one another. People filled shiva homes. People supported each other with physical and emotional embrace. So much deep heart-gifts that kept our community together.

But the heart-gifts in our community are not just for the difficult times. Week in and week out, our Kiddush Corps comes to synagogue early so that we can all sit down to a delicious Kiddush lunch together. Teens volunteer in our Polsky Religious School each week so that our youngsters have inspiring, fun, Jewish role models to look up to.

A few months ago, we began a program to volunteer reading to children with Phoenix House. This is part of a city-wide campaign to raise literacy through Turn the Page KC. What started as one member wanting to give to the greater community from his synagogue community has blossomed to a team of nearly a dozen volunteers. These examples are just the tip of the iceberg of people who make our events happen, our fundraisers succeed, our preschool grow, and our youth group flourish. This is how the fabric of our community is woven.

Rabbi James Jacobson-Maisels writes about the spiritual and emotional nature of the tabernacle:

Once we had the Tabernacle (mishkan) and the Temple (mikdash). Now we have only our hearts—hearts that can be a dwelling place for all those who are suffering, if we open them wide enough.

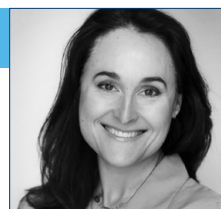

Those funds are used to build connections, between each other and between each of us and our rich traditions. Because of your support, Congregation Beth Shalom, its staff, and its members, are there when you need us.*

We offer services twice per day, every day of the year. That allows our members to support each other as we mourn the loss of a loved one, or to remember them on their Yahrtzeit. On Shabbat morning we have two, sometimes three different services, plus programs for young children. We offer a variety of Shabbat dinner programs for families with children, and for empty nesters. Our award-winning Purim program allows people of all ages to enjoy eating, drinking, learning and being together, as do our programs for Shavuot, Simchat Torah, and other holidays. Our Rose Family Early Childhood Education Center, Polsky Religious school, youth and scout programs help fulfill our obligation to pass on our rich traditions to the next generations. Our Rabbi and Hazzan spend countless hours visiting the sick,

tending to the needs of those who have lost their loved ones, teaching us, preparing students for B'nai Mitzvah, and leading us in prayer. All these and much more are supported by staff who put in whatever time is necessary to meet the needs of our members.

In the year to come we have plans to offer even more: more musical services, more Shabbat dinners, more programming for members of all ages. But those plans are subject to our budget, which is dependent on the generosity of our members. In the next few weeks, you will be receiving dues statements from the office. As you think about your contribution, please consider all that Congregation Beth Shalom does for you and all its members, every day of the year. And please consider a different type of bottom line, that being the friendships you have with other members because of Beth Shalom, the connection you feel to our shared traditions because of experiences you have had in our synagogue. New MiSheberach Policy Announced

One of the most important services we provide for our congregation is to be able to give spiritual and emotional support to those who are suffering illness.

To better give this support, we are trying to streamline our process for having people on the our MiSheberach list.

Beginning June 1st, we will re-start (from scratch) our list of those who are ill and/or hospitalized every 60 days. Those wishing to list the name of a loved one for longer than the allotted 60 days should contact the ritual office directly at 913-647-7281, or make a note of the request in the form on our website under the “ritual” tab, bethshalomkc.org/misheberach. If we do not receive contact information for the person requesting that a name go on the MiSheberach list, the ill person’s name will not be listed for longer than 60 days.

Forms submitted through our website should be completed in full (including your contact information) in case we need any clarification. It is our intention at Beth Shalom to make sure that every person in need of spiritual and/or physical healing be remembered through prayer, and we look forward to working with you to reach that goal.

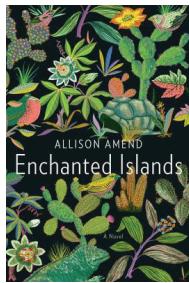
