Serve God with Joy



For the last three years our Purim celebrations have been getting better and better, with more energy, more participation and more fun. We are trying to live out the teaching from Psalms: *Ivdu et HaShem b'Simcha* – Worship God with Joy!!!

Wednesday, March 23rd in the evening – get out your costume and come to Beth Shalom! Your presence is what will make this party great.

This year, we are thrilled to have a Totally Awesome Purim which will feature the M80s, a 1980's cover band, snacks and drinks. All ages are invited.

I know – it's a school night. I know – we have work the next day. I know – it's a Wednesday.

We all make time to stay up late for events that we know are important – it could be tickets to a band we've always wanted to see, it could be the Royals playing an important game, it could be out of town friends or relatives who come by.

Purim is one of those times to stay up late! This is the time for us to teach ourselves, teach our friends and teach our children, that celebrating life is worth staying up late for. The thriving of the Jewish people is worth staying up late for. Light conquering darkness is worth staying up late for. It's worth being silly for. It's worth dressing up for. The committee is consulting with USCJ, as well as with several congregations around the country which have moved to various models.

Sheila Sonnenschein chairs the "Green Shul" Committee, which is helping CBS lower our energy footprint. Suzy Rieber, Milisa Flekier, Kim Matsil, Carla Oppenheimer and Mirra Klausner, with the help of Richard Simon, Chuck Gasser and Steve Feinstein have found a way to increase

recycling and save the congregation some money on a new trash contract. Three families have pledged to cover the expense of a recycling bin for the next 24 months.

Dana Schwartz continues her energetic leadership of the re-constituted Membership Committee, which seeks to assure that new members feel welcome. Our membership is stable between 690-695 family units, with quite a few new members – greet them warmly!

All About Adar

Have you ever wondered why it is that sometimes the holidays are "early," and sometimes they're "late?" A few weeks ago, the fifth, sixth and seventh grade classes learned why this happens! It's because we have a lunar calendar with 12 or 13 months, and hundreds of years ago, the Rabbis solved the problem of keeping our lunar calendar in check with the seasons of the solar calendar, which is critical in Judaism, since so many of our holidays are season-specific.

Imagine celebrating Pesach, also called *Hag Ha'Aviv*, the holiday of spring, in deep summer. Try to find indian corn and gourds and pumpkins to decorate your sukkah in February! Or consider celebrating Hanukkah

in early March, as the days are finally getting longer, and the sun is up far later than in December! All this would be commonplace if it were not for the invention of intercalation – the working together of the solar and lunar calendars by way of the addition of an extra month seven years out of every 19. That extra month is inserted now, and is called Adar I.

If you have ever wondered which Adar, Adar I or Adar II, is the "leap month," let me solve that riddle for you now; it's Adar I. Adar I has no holidays in it at all, and Adar II still has Purim in it. So why do we insert the leap month of Adar before the Adar with Purim?

Here's where things get really

cool – every Jewish home-maker will tell you that Purim is the one-month snooze-alarm alert before Passover. It takes a month to prepare your kitchen, your house, and even your soul for Pesach. Less time and you won't be ready, more time and you can't stay focused.

Please remember to mark your calendars for our community celebration of Purim, and refer to page 1 of the Scroll for all times and places.

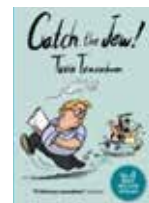

Gluten-Free, Dairy-Free Hamantaschen

Ingredients:

- 2 large eggs
- 2/3 cup sugar
- 1 teaspoon vanilla
- 2 1/4 cups gluten-free all-purpose flour
- 1/4 cup canola oil
- 1 teaspoon baking powder
- 1/4 teaspoon salt
- 1 teaspoon orange zest
- Jam, chocolate, or whatever filling you prefer



Directions:

- Preheat oven to 350 degrees.
- In a medium bowl whisk together eggs, sugar, vanilla, oil and orange zest.
- Using a sifter, pour flour, baking powder and salt inside and sift on top of liquid mixture. Using a wooden spoon, mix together until crumbly. Add water a small amount at a time if mixture is too dry.
- Knead dough until smooth, then transfer ball to gluten-free floured surface. Flour rolling pin and roll out dough to 1/4-inch thick.
- Using a 3 inch round cookie cutter, cut circles in dough and transfer to lightly greased cookie sheet.
- Using a teaspoon, place one teaspoon of preferred filling (I used chocolate almond butter and pomegranate jelly) in the center of dough round.
- Fold left edge of circle until it almost hits the center. Fold right edge over to create a pyramid. Fold the bottom edge up to meet the other sides, folding one side under the right and over the left. Pinch the ends.
- Place on a cookie sheet and bake for 18-20 minutes until golden. Check the Hamantaschen after 18 minutes.
