

From the Rabbi's Study

Yizkor on Passover – A Forgotten Time to Remember



Passover is a time that is all about memory: memories of our grandparents' recipes, memories of favorite seder stories from years past, memories of times when

our people survived slavery throughout the ages.

Much of our community's Passover celebration comes through participating in a Seder and remembering the story of the Exodus. Maybe, your family has special memories of how you survived on Passover in unique circumstances. I have a favorite memory of surreptitiously eating matzah sandwiches in the grand lobby of a fancy New York hotel in Times Square, only to look around and seeing everyone who was in the lobby also eating their brown-bag matzah sandwiches.

What we often forget, though, is the observance of Yizkor on Passover. Yizkor is a sacred rite to remember those whom have passed on. We say the Yizkor prayer on the final day of Passover, the second day of Shavuot, Shemini Atzeret (the 8th day of Sukkot one day prior to Simchat Torah), and of course, Yom Kippur. Most people know about Yom Kippur, but are not aware of the other Yizkor remembrances.

By having our year punctuated by Yizkor, we are able to remember our loved ones within a community of prayer once during every season. Yizkor forces us to take time throughout the year and remove ourselves from the daily routine to recall those who came before us. Additionally, our sages believe that by mentioning our loved ones in synagogue and doing mitzvot in their memory at Yizkor is a way to continue to give uplift to their souls.

I remember in the garment district of New York City, that there used to be store-front synagogues that only opened on Yizkor days. They would have just the Yizkor service – no other prayers – multiple times throughout the day, so businessmen and garment workers could sneak away for a half hour and say Yizkor for a parent.

This year, I want to focus on building up our community of people who come to say Yizkor on other holidays other than just Yom Kippur. When a Yizkor holiday (other than Yom Kippur) falls on a weekday, we always have an early service so people who cannot get off work can still come to synagogue and say Yizkor.

To make this a time of community, we will be having a special enhanced lunch on the 8th day of Passover. This way, you can not only take time to remember your loved one who passed on, but you can connect with the living members of our vital community. I know that we are still over six weeks away from Passover — but I wanted us to not only remember our grocery shopping, cleaning, cooking and eating — but also mark on our calendars the time to say Yizkor.

Please join me on Tuesday, April 18th for these Yizkor Services. We will have both a 7:00 am service and a 9:30 am service, with the lunch following the later service.

Mi shenichnas Adar, marbim b'simcha! As we enter Adar, our joy increases!



I will be singing this song this month with everyone from preschoolers to the Shabbat crowd on Saturday morning as we dress the Torah scroll. But why is this the theme song for Adar? What is so amazing about Adar that everyone who welcomes Adar gets an increase

in joy?

Well, for starters, who can help but be happy once spring is in the air? Though I doubt this is what the author of the song had in mind...Rather, this song alludes to the holiday of Purim and the countdown to our physical and spiritual redemption from Egyptian bondage and slavery.

Modern Jews celebrate Purim in many ways. Many of us give gifts of food to each other as well as gifts of food and money to those in need. We will be sharing a Purim feast together on Sunday morning, and our community will offer two opportunities to hear the megillah in its entirety, once in the evening and once in the morning, in keeping with tradition. We will celebrate with a party wherein one could become so full of joy (and possibly also drink) to the point where one might be confused between "hurrah Mordecai" and "boo Haman."

But, I will suggest to you that 24 hours of Purim is not enough to feel that we increase our joy for the full month. Rather, I believe the joy is in the journey. The journey from Tu B'Shevat, through Purim and into Pesach, which leads through the Omer directly to Shavuot, is one where our joy is steadily in an upward trajectory. We move from the let down at the end of Sukkot to the darkest days of the year, lit up by the tiny Hanukkah candles, and wait till the start of spring – and once we are in Adar, we have so much to look forward to! Spring! The visceral experience of Purim is followed by the spiritual experience of Pesach.

For me, connectedness of the Jewish calendar is a guide for my spiritual life. Without the cycle of the holidays, in sync with the seasons, I might wander aimlessly spiritually-speaking. Our holidays give me a spiritual focus, and they are all connected. With the advent of Adar, and the establishment of spring, my heart begins to soar as I celebrate Esther's success in Shushan and begin to plan for my own escape from whatever personal slavery I suffer this year.

May you enter Adar with joy in your heart, and may your joy increase as spring progresses!

Mint Chocolate Chip Cake

Ingredients for Cake:

2 cups white sugar

1 3/4 cups all purpose flour

1 cup unsweetened, Dutch process cocoa powder (I use Hershey Special Dark)

1 1/2 tsp baking powder

1 1/2 tsp baking soda

1 teaspoon salt

2 eggs

1 cup milk

1/2 cup vegetable oil

2 tsp vanilla extract

3/4 cup boiling water

Ingredients for Frosting:

2 sticks (1 cup) salted butter, slightly softened

1/3 cup heavy cream

2 tsp mint extract

1 tsp vanilla extract

Drop or two of green food coloring

4 cups powdered sugar

2 oz semisweet chocolate, finely chopped

Instructions:

Preheat oven to 350°. Grease and flour 2 eight or nine inch pans. In the bowl of a mixer, combine sugar, flour, cocoa powder, baking powder, baking soda, and salt. Whisk together until fully combined. Add eggs, milk, oil, and vanilla and beat on medium speed for 2 minutes. Scrape the sides of the bowl, then slowly stir in the boiling water. Pour batter evenly into prepared pans and bake for 30 -40 minutes, until tops of cakes spring back when you lightly touch in the center. Remove cakes from oven. Allow to cool in pans for about 10 minutes, then remove to finish cooling on wire racks.

Prepare frosting: In the bowl of a mixer, beat butter, cream, and both extracts on medium speed until smooth. With mixer speed on low, slowly add powdered sugar and mix until just combined. Add food coloring and increase speed to medium high and beat for about one minute, until frosting is light, smooth, and fluffy. If frosting is too thick, add another Tablespoon or two of cream and beat for 30 more seconds. Add chopped chocolate and mix on low until incorporated. Frost cooled cake.

Notes:

Refrigerate cake until serving.Do not sub chocolate chips for chopped chocolate in frosting -- it will make the cake very difficult to frost. I used bakers chocolate, but feel free to use your favorite dark chocolate bar.To make frosting the cake easier, wrap the cakes in plastic wrap and or refrigerate for an hour or two before frosting. It will make the cakes more firm, which is easier for handling and more moist.
