From the Rabbi's Study

Israel at 65 – How Significant is it?

This month, according to the secular calendar, the State of Israel is turning 65. Last month, we celebrated its birthday on the Jewish calendar. In a half generation, we will no longer have American Jews who recall a day without the existence of the State of Israel.

I have written and spoken about the importance of Israel precisely because its independence will soon disappear from first-hand memories. However, there are other reasons for Israel's importance.

In just 65 years, Israel now has approximately the same number of Jews as America. Once a fledgling nation, it is now the start-up nation leading the world in areas of high-tech and environmental research.

Neither the Jewish community in America nor Israel, are completely self-sufficient – we are more interdependent than ever. The Jewish

population in the United States and the Jewish population in Israel are like two siblings who discover that they actually need each other more in adulthood than they did as adolescents.

Israel can teach us about independence, self-reliance, and about the creation of an authentic Jewish culture rooted in the West and the




Jewish canon – while being created in Hebrew. We, however, have the opportunity to teach Israel about the beauty of religious pluralism and tolerance. Robert Putnam's book, American Grace, describes an American tapestry of religion thriving in harmony. When Israelis spend summers in Jewish



American summer camps through the Jewish agency, they have the opportunity to bring a taste of this back to their home towns.

In Israel's 66th year, I encourage all of us to both work toward creating a strong bond between our two communities, and not being afraid to both learn from, and teach our brothers and sisters who live in Medinat Yisrael – The State of Israel.

So to Linda and to Bey, I wish you both all good things as you go from strength to strength.




Building Community/Celebrating Shabbat

Tzedakah in Motion

Tzedakah is a holy obligation. It is the mitzvah of using your resources to help others. Each time our religious school is in session, our students bring nickels, dimes and quarters (sometimes dollars) for tzedakah. Over the course of a year, this adds up to over \$600, and as part of the process, we put a lot of thought into how this money is distributed.


Our 8th grade religious school students are tasked with this responsibility each spring. They study texts on tzedakah, such as why we give tzedakah, how much is proper to give and who is obligated to give tzedakah.

Students then research one or more organizations and make a presentation to the other 8th grade students,

including a recommendation of how much the organization should receive. It is up to the 8th grade students, as a "tzedakah board" to determine which organizations receive money and how much. We look for a balance in the process so that local and national agencies are considered.

Our intent is that through this

process, these students will better understand the concept of tzedakah in their lives and will become the future generation of givers to both



the synagogue and the community.

This year, the 8th grade students allocated tzedakah to the following organizations: World Wildlife Fund, National Council of Jewish Women, CHAI Lifeline, CHAI – Concern for Helping Animals in Israel, Project Ezra, Israel Guidedog Center for the Blind, Jewish Family Service and the Jewish Family Service Food Pantry.

Over the summer we encourage our families to continue to set aside tzedakah. A good time to do this is before lighting the candles on Shabbat. There is always a tzedakah box in the school office and we encourage our families to continue to make tzedakah donations over the summer or to bring their tzedakah money in at the start of the school year in September.



Graham Cracker Crust

1/2 cup crumbs

1/4 cup sugar

1/2 cup melted margarine or butter

Preheat oven to 300°. Mix ingredients together and press in the bottom of a springform pan. Bake at 300° for 5 minutes. Cool.

Filling
1 lb. cream cheese
½ cup sugar
1/8 teaspoon cinnamon
½ teaspoon vanilla
1 tablespoon lemon juice
4 eggs separated



Blend the cream cheese with sugar, cinnamon, vanilla and lemon juice. Add 4 egg yolks, one at a time, mixing well. Fold in stiffly beaten egg whites. Pour mixture on the crust baking at 300° for 45 minutes.

Topping

1 cup sour cream 1 tablespoon sugar

1 teaspoon vanilla

Blend together and spread on top of cheese-cake. Bake at 300° for 10 minutes. Cool and refrigerate.

Fruit on top is optional. Remove from springform pan to serve.
