Jewish Values on Campus - It's not Just about Shabbat and Israel



Thousands of Jewish high school seniors will graduate in the next month and fan out across college campuses. Being a Jewish university student is

more complex than it ever was. I have written, spoken and taught about the many issues facing university students that are most often connected with Jewish values: namely maintaining (or exploring) Jewish practice and defending Israel in an increasingly hostile environment.

One area where Jewish voices are not yet as strong as we need to be is on the growing issue of sexual assault and rape on campus. This is why I believe the conversations we need to have with our graduating seniors of both genders are about the importance of respect and sexual consent.

Judaism is not a prudish tradition. While being definitely pro-marriage, Judaism does not shy away from the joy that comes from physical and sexual intimacy. However, it is also a tradition that for thousands of years has come out strongly in favor of consent between intimate partners. Jewish law compares rape to murder and has forbidden marital rape since the time

of the Talmud over 1500 years ago. That is why safe sex is about more than simply using a condom, contraception control, and protection from sexually transmitted diseases. Safe sex today also means physically and emotionally safe sex, and not simply the absence of pregnancy or disease.

Admittedly, it may seem that having this conversation before high school graduation is too late. After all, close to 50% of high school students are sexually active. However, the social dynamic on campus is radically different than in high school, and it is the first time our children are making these choices completely away from home.

We need to have conversations with our graduating seniors about what we expect of them in their behavior on campus, and the way they behave on dates, at parties or in dorms. This, too, is a reflection of our people's values. The conversation need not be prudish. It need not be scolding, but it should reflect a voice of expectation. In the same way we have hopes for our children to achieve academically and professionally, we also want them to have healthy relationships with their life (or dat-

ing) partners. Try asking your child if they know anyone who's ever gotten into a scary or troubling situation and what they think about it. Ask if there's anything making them nervous. And for your sake and theirs, remind them you are only a phone call away.

These conversations about respect and consent need to happen with our sons and daughters. Not only do I not want our daughters to be raped, I do not want our sons to become rapists. Of course we want to prevent sexual assaults and rapes, but these incidents no longer are only perpetrated by strangers. Too often on college campuses, sexual assaults occur between young adults who know each other and who might have fun "partying" together. Alcohol might play a part as it certainly can affect decision making. This is another great topic for conversation with our sons and daughters.

Let's let our kids and universities around the country know that Judaism believes in treating human beings with respect. In accordance with our tradition, let's take a strong stand in favor of consent, respect and healthy relationships.



Cheese Blintzes

Batter Ingredients:

4 eggs

1/2 cup milk

1/2 cup water

1 package vanilla sugar

Pinch of salt

1 Tbsp. oil

1 cup flour

1/4 cup sugar

Filling Ingredients:

1/2 pound farmer cheese

4 ounces cream cheese

4 Tbsps. honey or maple syrup juice of 1/2 lemon

1 egg yolk

Directions:

Batter: In a large mixer bowl combine eggs, milk, water and blend well. Gradually add flour, then both sugars, salt and oil. Beat well until there are no lumps in the batter.

Filling: Combine all ingredients in a bowl and beat well. Or combine all the ingredients in a blender container and blend until smooth. To Assemble Crepes: Prepare batter and filling. Using a paper towel or basting brush, apply a thin coating of oil to a 7 inch skillet. Place skillet over medium heat until skillet is hot but not smoking. Ladle approximately 1/3 cup of batter into the skillet. Tilt pan to swirl the batter so it covers the bottom of the skillet. Fry on one side until small air bubbles form, and top is set. Bottom

should be golden brown. When done, carefully loosen edges of crepe and slip out of skillet onto a plate. Repeat until all the batter is used. Grease the skillet as needed.

Turn each crepe so that golden brown side is up. Place 3 tablespoons of filling on one edge in a 2 1/2 inch long by 1-inch wide mound. Roll once to cover filling. Fold the sides into the center and continue rolling until completely closed. Heat 2 tablespoons of oil in the skillet and place each crepe seam side down in the skillet and fry 2 minutes on each side, turning once. Yield is approximately 12 blintzes.
