We are honored to have Rabbi William Gershon, Senior Rabbi of Congregation Shearith Israel, Dallas, Texas, install Rabbi Glickman as Senior Rabbi of CBS during the 9:30 am Shabbat morning service, December 15. Rabbi Gershon has been

the Senior Rabbi, Feldman Family Senior Rabbinic Chair, of Congregation Shearith Israel since 1998. He is a Rabbinic Fellow of the Shalom Hartman Institute in Jerusalem, and is the Vice-President of the Rabbinical Assembly. He serves on the Chancellor's Rabbinic Cabinet of JTS, is a member of the National Council of AIPAC and has been honored by Israel Bonds for his tireless efforts on behalf of the State of Israel.

A graduate of the University of Michigan and The Jewish Theological Seminary, Rabbi Glickman came to us from Congregation Shearith Israel in Dallas where he served since 2001 and was a powerful catalyst for cutting-edge, innovative programming, dynamic education and meaningful spiritual experiences. ## Giving Thanks is a Jewish Theme

Thanksgiving has all of the ingredients of a perfect, ewish holiday: recalling an histori-

Jewish holiday: recalling an historical event through food, the gathering of family and the expression of gratitude. Though we as Jews have tried linking Thanksgiving to Sukkot, there is little outside evidence that the original Pilgrims made this connection themselves.


This, however, does not take away from the fact that we Jews have felt at home with the holiday of Thanksgiving since its inception. Some of the most powerful religious deciders of Jewish law in the twentieth century such as Rabbi Joseph Soloveitchik and Rabbi Moshe Feinstein all permitted Jews to celebrate

Thanksgiving despite the "history" we may have learned in elementary school of Pilgrims and Native Americans.

Through Jewish living, we have ways of "giving" thanks, and "doing" thanks. To give thanks, is simply by giving voice to that which you are grateful. We do this at our Thanksgiving table both by saying the appropriate blessings on our food, as well as going around and saying what we are thankful for this year. However, there is also "doing" thanks. Instead of simply vocalizing thanks to God for the bounty we have, I suggest helping God in His task of feeding the world by sharing your bounty with others. In this way, you are not only "giving" thanks, but "doing" thanks. A new holiday -

"Thanks-doing"?

The two guest speakers will be Dr. Jennifer R. Klemp and Julie Levine.

Dr. Jennifer R. Klemp, PhD, MPH, is an Assistant Professor,



Cancer and Genetic Counselor and the Director of Cancer Survivorship Center at the K U Cancer Center. She serves on the National Cancer Survivorship Resource Center's Quality of Life: Survivorship Programs & Navigation Workgroup. She has worked in the field of breast cancer prevention and survivorship since 1996, and has

a clinical research interest in understanding breast cancer risk, cancer genetics, quality of life, and lifestyle modification.

Julie Levine is a two

time cancer survivor. She was diagnosed with stage 3 breast cancer in 2008, and a second primary cancer in her lung in 2009. There is no family history of breast or ovarian cancer in Julie's family, but she carries the BRCA2 mutation, more common in Ashkenazi Jews.




