Celebrate With Our Simchat Torah Honorees

CBS volunteers are traditionally honored and celebrated for their service on Simchat Torah. On Friday morning, October 21, Inge Silverman will be

honored as *Kallat Torah*, the last aliyah in the Torah, and Joel Goldman will be named Chatan Bereishit, the first aliyah in the Torah cycle. Please join us that morning to honor and thank Inge and Joel for their service.

Inge Silverman is a 4th generation member of CBS. Serving as Chair of the Docent Committee since 1985, she welcomes and mentors non-lews to the synagogue. Inge also was instrumental in starting the Simchah Committee in 1971, currently called Kiddush Corp. Inge taught Sunday School and served as secretary to the religious school's Director. She also worked as Administrative Secretary of CAJE for 30 years until retiring 3 years ago. Inge and her late husband Buddy are the parents of son, Michael, (Marcia) and daughter Amy (Craig Both). Joel Goldman, Chair of the Long Range Planning Task Force, has been instrumental in helping us through the recent building transition. He says of his work with

From the Hazzan's Study

Is the Avodah service, part of the Yom Kippur Musaf, archaic and irrelevant? What does the Kohen Gadol have to do with modern Judaism? The Temple is gone, and so is the priesthood.

The Kohen Gadol, the High Priest, was the spiritual leader. He was the one who risked drawing as close to God as possible, knowing that drawing close to God changes us so severely that we might lose our family, our position, our life. He was the one who asked God for mercy on behalf of the congregation, knowing the good and the evil within the community. He had no inheritance and relied on the *terumah*, the donations, of the community. He was charged with maintaining tradition in the face of changing secular governments and changing community mores. All aspects of the life of the Kohen Gadol were under scrutiny by the community.

How different is this from the demands we place on our spiritual leader, our rabbi? We ask the rabbi to maintain the tradition yet be responsive to modern customs. He or she is asked to find ways to engage people within a society that does not support Judaism. We expect that person to draw as close to God as possible, and risk losing their family and their health. They know the good and the bad of the community, and they are expected to treat

each person with loving-kindness. They are expected to be experts in laws which many want to change, let alone ignore. And they, like the Kohen Gadol, are under complete scrutiny by the community.

The Kohen Gadol became irrelevant with the destruction of the Temple and the elimination of animal sacrifice. The modern spiritual



leader risks becoming irrelevant through the destruction of the unique rituals and laws of Judaism. When the community rejects the need to know the tradition, rejects the need for understanding and knowledge, and rejects the need to draw closer to God, the spiritual leader will indeed be irrelevant. As we choose a new rabbi, let's remember why they do, in fact, remain relevant: that remembering the tradition, promoting gemilut chasadim, and using intelligence to interpret our laws leads the community to a closer relationship with God. Ultimately, this is, now, the way to repairing our world.

Congregation Beth Shalom's Transition Progress **Update...**

Thanks to the hard work of many devoted volunteers and staff, the transition to our Lamar building is proceeding. If you haven't seen all of our artifacts and equipment in their new homes, we hope you will soon.

The major tapestries and sculptures have been relocated to Goldsmith Hall and the foyer. The remaining artwork and Judaica have been catalogued and prepared for transfer, and will be relocated with the help of an interior designer. The ark face, the Ner Tamid, the chairs and the reader's stand from the sanctuary will be stored for possible future use. The stained glass windows have been catalogued and will be stored. The simchah tree from the Cumonow Social Hall will be located once an appropriate wall is identified. Transfer of yahrtzeit tablets is also underway. Prayer books, Torahs and tallitot have already been moved.
