From the Rabbi's Study

Walking Through the Valley of the Shadow of Death



The most well known psalm in our tradition is the twenty-third psalm. One of the most harrowing lines is about walking “through the valley of the shadow of death.” What is striking to me is what a very realistic portrayal of grief this is.

This short descriptor portrays grief as something that is dark (“shadow of death”). However, a shadow occurs because something is blocking the light – not because the light disappears. The darkness of grief is very normal, and it is also possible for grief to feel like a permanent darkness when inside. However, like with any other shadow, when the object blocking the light diminishes or moves, the light can return. This idea of difficulty that is gradually eased is also true with the idea of “walking through a valley.” Though the base of a valley is low, with effort, it is possible to walk through to the other side.

I have written before about how

our daily minyan has been a source of comfort and inspiration to so many. Thanks to Amy Lieberman Pollack, and her mother, Floriene Lieberman, we have a new way that the daily minyan held at Village Shalom comforts through the **Lending Library of Solace**. After saying kaddish for Amy's father and Floriene's husband, George Lieberman, Amy sees this lending library as a lasting reminder to George's impact. Amy has reached out to educators, counselors and rabbis around the country to stock this library with the most relevant and useful books.

However, the only way this lending library will serve its purpose is if it is utilized. When somebody loses a relative, it is really difficult to reach out and to avail oneself of the resources that are available.

I would like to encourage you – yes, you – to help us be the best synagogue we can be by inviting friends you have who have lost someone to join you for minyan to say kaddish. Even if you are not a regular minyan attendee yourself, it is so much

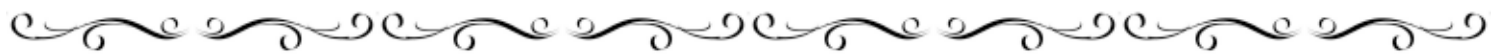
easier for a mourner to attend if he is brought there by another friend. Also, at that time, I encourage you to peruse the new **Lending Library of Solace** to find a book that might help your loved one journey “through the valley of the shadow of death.”

Our presence in each others' lives is how we make the joyful time more joyful and the difficult times manageable. The hope is that as people observe a yartzeit, finish sheloshim (the thirty day mourning period), or complete eleven months of kaddish, they will donate a book in memory of their loved one.

October, in this hemisphere, is synonymous with autumn, and to the Jewish soul, autumn is synonymous with Sukkot. Sukkot is the 8-day celebration of the transient nature of human creation, and the cyclical nature of God's creation. Let me explain what I mean.

God created the whole world from mere words, and while everything changes and while living things die, the grand scheme, the background against which everything else lives or dies, continues. God's creation continues and is the stage on which we live our lives. And while our lives are not forever, we have a distinct pur-

pose – to make this world, and each other's lives better while we are here! So how does this translate to Sukkot?

Every year we build a sukkah to remind us of the temporary homes we lived in while wandering in the wilderness for 40 years. We build the sukkah knowing full well we're going to take it down in a week's time, pack it up and put it away for next year. So perhaps we would say – let's not waste time making it pretty; after all, it's just up for a week!

Judaism teaches us that we must honor and beautify even the mitzvah that is utterly temporary. The Sukkah, the home most of us don't live in, can be a simple hut – but when we fill it

with beautiful art, hand-made pictures and hangings and twinkling lights, we can truly feel at home even in our temporary hut!

Our children created decorations and will be enjoying them throughout the holiday including Sunday morning, October 4, when PRS students will be "Snackin' in the Sukkah". If you have not already enjoyed a meal in a sukkah, there are a few days left to do so – bring a picnic-style meal and fulfill a mitzvah. I hope you will truly enjoy our sukkah. I look forward to celebrating with you.
