From the Rabbi's Study

We are in the Relationship Business



When synagogue and church boards evaluate the success of their houses of worship, some will remark that we need to treat the organization “more like a business”. The critical question is, what business are we in?

Our business is the relationship business. There are many men and women in sales of one sort or another who will tell you the same thing – they are in the relationship business. However, we are a little different.

For a person in sales, being in the relationship business allows you to sell a different product. For us, the relationship is both the journey and the destination.

But here's the tricky thing – the congregants are both our sales force and our customer base. With our size, to be successful in the relationship business, we all need to be selling, and all need to be buying simultaneously.

The only way we can both create and maintain meaningful relationships is if every single congregant in our kehillah – our sacred community – is hungry to build and maintain meaningful relationships.

What does it mean to be “hungry”? In the business world, it means hustling to find every potential client so that you can put food on the table. In the synagogue business it means hustling to make sure that everyone is connected to somebody in the shul

and that there is nobody left without a place at a table.

I have two entry points for our relationship business that are connected to hunger: volunteering to serve food with “Lechem,” or volunteering to serve food with “Kiddush Corps”. Lechem serves food at a shelter one day per month, and members of our synagogue serve all of us at Shabbat Kiddush each week when lunch is not catered. But remember – we are ultimately not in the food service business. These are just opportunities to create and “feed” relationships.

Security at the Jewish Community Center Campus

This year more than ever, security will be extremely tight at the JCC.

- Tickets will be checked at the door by a police officer. Please have your ticket with your name on it in your hand to gain entry.
- If you do not carry a ticket for religious reasons or you have forgotten it, the police at the door will have a “Members in Good Standing” list. If your name is not on the list, you will not be allowed to enter.
- For the safety of all concerned, additional police officers have been hired.

2014 Ticket Policy Important Security Changes

- Every member will receive two tickets, one for Rosh HaShanah and one for Yom Kippur.
- Entry for children 25 and under does not require a ticket when accompanied by a member with a ticket.
- All family members over the age of 25 must have a ticket; guest tickets cost \$150 per person and are good for both holidays.

Rimon Service – Friday, Sept. 26-10:30 am - Social Hall -Main door entry to the JCC only.

This is an opportunity for people of all ages to come together for a “bite sized” service that is also delicious, juicy, flavorful and colorful. It is only 90 minutes in length, is filled with song, discussion, learning and energy.

- If you are in arrears, you are not in “good standing”. Contact Elaine Levine, Executive Director to clear your account.
- We do accept guests who are members in good standing at other Conservative synagogues provided their synagogue has contacted us for a ticket request.
- If you have not received your tickets by **September 10**, contact the office. Please understand we cannot clear any accounts at the door.

The dress is “respectfully casual”. This service is open to the community.

Message from the President



In the next few weeks we will celebrate Rosh HaShanah and Yom Kippur 5775. I'll address the congregation for the first time as President, during which I'll focus on the state of CBS. And, Rabbi Glickman will reach out to ask us to be generous in our High Holy Day Appeal. Even though that's the Rabbi's role, that's what I want to focus on here in the pre-High Holy Day *Scroll*.

CBS's membership stands at 719 families, four more than when I wrote in the July Scroll. For the third year in a row, we have a balanced budget, half of which comes from dues. Another



New Beginnings





Borscht by Natasha Olinetchouck

- 3-4 cloves of garlic diced or pressed
- 1 medium yellow onion chopped
- Half a head of white cabbage shredded
- 3 medium potatoes peeled and cubed
- 2 large carrots peeled and shredded
- 3 medium beets peeled and cut into small strips
- 1 lb stew meat
- 5-6 quarts of cold water
- 3 bay leaves
- 1 tbsp vinegar
- 1 tbsp sugar
- 4 oz. tomato paste



Instructions

Prepare beef broth by boiling rinsed stew beef in 5-6 quarts of water with the bay leaves. Before the water boils, skim the foam with a slotted spoon to make sure the broth is clear. Boil for an hour or until the beef is tender. Borscht can also be prepared with chicken or vegetable broth. Cook the beets covered in a small pan with a little bit of water, 1 tbsp of vinegar and 1 tbsp of sugar for 25-30 minutes on low heat.

Sauté the shredded carrots, chopped onion and garlic in a pan with a little bit of vegetable oil until the onions become translucent. Add 4 oz of tomato paste, sauté for another 10 minutes. Add a little bit of broth if the mixture is too thick.

Add the cubed potatoes and shredded cabbage to the broth, and cook for another 15-20 minutes, until almost tender. Transfer the beets and carrots and onions mixture into the pot. Season with salt and pepper to taste. Let it sit for 15 minutes before serving. Garnish with chopped parsley.
