Why is this Passover Different from all the other Passovers?

I was speaking to one of our oldest members during the first days of the great Covid-19 synagogue transformation. She is 97 years old. She said to me, "Rabbi, in all my years, I have never experienced something like this in all my years!" I responded: "If you are 97 and haven't experienced something like this, there is a good chance that NOBODY in our community has."

I do not want to underplay the true grief and anxiety that many members of our community are going through because of the social isolation from the pandemic. Additionally, many of us are genuinely concerned for the health of our loved ones or ourselves. Some of us may have already experienced someone getting ill from this virus.

However, it is also important during this time to remember the great resiliency of humanity, and the eternal ability to adapt that the Jewish people have. We are the great adapters of history. Our ancestors snuck lulavim and etrogim under ghetto walls in Nazi-occupied Poland, and baked matzos in the ditches of Auschwitz. The rabbis in pre-State Israel revitalized the laws of the sabbatical year when we began having agriculture in the Land of Israel again. We will find ways to live Jewishly now also.

Even with the technological help, video calls don't take the place of Passover with family. Here are a few suggestions for how to make this Passover memorable – in positive ways.

1. RECORD FAMILY MEMORIES. Use this pandemic as an excuse to interview family members about your family's Exodus to America. Record on video or write it down so that it is not limited to just this Passover.

2. PLAY WITH ZOOM. Zoom and other video-conference technologies can allow multiple families to share a seder. Give yourself permission to make mistakes – we are all trying something new. The Torah says that the first Passover was filled with hipazon – hurried chaos. It's ok to have a little chaos with digital mishaps.

3. ENJOY THE NEW INTIMACY. The rabbis say that even if there is just a couple, they must ask each other the four questions. Even someone who is alone must ask the four questions. The mystics say that even God asks Himself the four questions. Use this year as a chance to go deep into the story of the Exodus. Ask good questions. Tell good stories. Read broadly and think deeply.

We will continue to find ways to connect in meaningful ways both during the pandemic and after it has hopefully passed over.

Annie and my children, Gavi, Ellie and Dani, join me in wishing you all a very meaningful Passover.

Those who are over 70 ½ years old and have an Individual Retirement Account have a way. You can avoid income tax

Snapshots of RFECEC Purim Celebrations

The traditional seder has fourteen elements. Making kiddush over the first of four cups of wine (*kaddesh*), washing hands with no blessing (*urchatz*), eating greens (*karpas*), breaking the middle matza (*yachatz*), telling the Passover story (*maggid*), washing your hands with a blessing (*rochtzah*), blessing and eating the matza (*motzi matzah*), eating bitter herbs (*maror*), making a sandwich with charoset and maror (*korech*), eating the amazing meal (*shulchan orech*), searching for the afikoman (*tzafoon*), blessing after the meal (*barech*), psalms of praise for God’s redeeming us from Egypt (*hallel*), and ending the seder (*nirtzah*).

It’s a lot. I know. The “traditional” seder starts after sundown and goes until after midnight. In fact, within the body of the seder, in the *maggid* section, the haggadah itself tells us that anyone who lengthens the seder as much as he or she can is supposed to be praised. Within the haggadah, we read about how the Rabbis of yore lengthened the seder so much that their students came in to tell them it was time for morning services!

I was present at a conversation recently where a Jewish adult suggested to others that if there are kids at the seder table, it’s important to simplify and shorten the seder for their sake. The speaker suggested keeping the Hebrew to a bare minimum and making the seder somewhat brief. They went on to suggest that the kids will learn to do a “traditional” seder when they’re older.

As a clergy/educator who deeply values tradition, I could not disagree more. There are so many ways to bring our children into the fullness of our traditions without jettisoning the language of our Torah and our ancestors and the traditions that kept us distinct for all the generations from the Rabbis until today.

First and foremost, create a scenario for success; let older kids help with the planning of the seder, from food to seating chart, songs and activities. Try to make sure younger kids are well-rested, that they know it’s a special stay-up-late night, and tell them there will be snacks before dinner; you can munch cut veggies and dips once you do *karpas*. Make sure there are activities for the kids that they can do out of their chairs as well as in their seats – nobody likes to spend four hours sitting! It takes a little extra time to prepare, but not that much, and your kids will say it’s the best seder they’ve ever had! There are hundreds of great ideas that you can find online or by comparing notes with your friends!

I wish you a zissen Pesach – may your seders be full of fun, and also full of tradition! See <https://www.jewishboston.com/kid-friendly-seder-ideas/> for more ideas! You can also Google seder for kids for other great ideas.

- Feed kids something before starting so they aren’t hungry, and have lots of veggie snacks on the table after *karpas* (carrot sticks, celery sticks, even humus and eggplant dip!)
- Have blocks available for children to build pyramids when an activity is needed
- Create a poster of the order of the seder, and allow children to take turns placing stickers on the poster to mark which part of the seder you’re on
- Provide a tent area near the seder table with books, Passover games and puzzles for the children to play with while the adults conduct the seder
- If you have older children at your seder, encourage them to work on a “news report” of the Exodus from Egypt and give reports during the seder on how the children of Israel are doing on their journey
- Make puppets for the characters in the story so children can use their puppet during that person’s “voice” in the hagaddah
- Purchase or create a 10 plagues wall hanging or bag (for a wall hanging, use a board covered with pretty fabric and Velcro to attach the appropriate plagues; for a bag, represent the plagues using large animal buttons, insect stickers, Styrofoam or ping-pong balls for hail, bubble wrap for boils, sunglasses for darkness and red tissue paper or tinted water)
- Have a make-your-own charoset buffet table, with a variety of ingredients to choose from
- Make an edible pyramid for the table (mix ground almonds, dried figs and dried dates in a food processor to create a soft yet formable dough; roll dough into a ¾ inch log, and then roll it in ground almonds to coat it; square the log by flattening each side, and then cut it into small cubes, dipping the ends in ground almonds; stack on a plate in the shape of a pyramid)

Of Blessed Memory, Betty Brand, 1925-2020



We note with great sadness the death of Betty Brand on January 22, 2020. Mrs. Brand was a past Sisterhood President of Congregation Beth Shalom from 1967-69. She also served as president of the Women's Division of the Jewish Federation of Greater Kansas City, and B'nai B'rith. She was actively involved in selling Israel Bonds, receiving its Eleanor Roosevelt Humanitarian Award. Mrs. Brand was acknowledged as the Hyman Brand Hebrew Academy Auxiliary 'Woman of the Year.'

Mrs. Brand's passion for the arts led her to establish the Arthur Kraft Memorial Scholarship for the Visual Arts in 2007. An artist in her own right, she shared her personal works in a one-woman show at the age of 85.
