## The Months of Elul and Tishrei: Time to Reset

In 1980 or 1981 an otherwise anonymous IBM computer engineer named David Bradley was frustrated with the very first Microsoft-based computers he was working on designing. The computers kept snagging and locking up. Every time the computer froze, they would have to fully turn off the computer and turn it back on and wait for the entire computer to boot up from scratch.

To avoid this, Bradley invented the three-key combination Ctrl-Alt-Del which rebooted the computer starting all of its processes again (Control-Command-Power on a Mac). This five minutes in an over thirty year career for Bradley allowed billions of people frustrated with their computers to stop everything and reset.

This year, more than any other year, we all need a reset.

Since the days after Purim we have experienced a style of living that no generation has experienced. Similarly, Rosh HaShanah, Yom Kippur, Sukkot and Shemini Atzeret/Simchat Torah will be unlike any other.

Following guidelines from our local health departments and guidance from Beth Shalom's reopening committee we will be offering a combination of streaming services live from Goldsmith Hall, recorded services and some outdoor family experiences with appropriate physical distancing.

During this time, it is easy to focus on what is out of our control. However, the connection we create with God during this time, the space we give our souls, the joy we allow ourselves to experience can be in our control... if we allow ourselves.

One of the primary images of Rosh HaShanah that we speak about again and again is how on Rosh HaShanah, God birthed the world (Hayom Harat Olam...). Intrinsic in the day itself is one of re-creation and rebirth.

I am grateful for all of the energy, creativity, thought and joy our staff team and volunteers have been putting into the continual renewal of our synagogue since the pandemic began. I look forward to experiencing new ways of celebrating the holidays with you in the days ahead.

I pray that God renew your family for a good new year of health, reconnection, and joy.

## Making Your High Holidays Holy at Home

When I think of the High Holidays, these are the things that come to mind for me – song and singing, food, family, stress and joy, house guests and long stretches of time at synagogue – all of this after weeks and weeks of prep work. This year is going to be different. This year we have to be incredibly mindful about what we do and how we do High Holidays. On all other years, the High Holidays are elevated, they are made holy by all of us coming together, by the white of Rabbi and my robes and the white Torah covers. This year, what will make our High Holidays holy in the absence of the pomp of our communal in-person celebration?

I want to take you on a mind-walk. Close your eyes. Think about the perfect Rosh HaShanah. You can repeat this exercise for Yom Kippur, Sukkot and Simchat Torah, but let's start with Rosh HaShanah. Where are you? What are you wearing? Who is around you? What do you hear? What are you saying or singing? If you are at a meal table, what food is on the table? Who is at the table with you? When you have the image in your mind, take some notes – what are the elements that make the holiday special for you?

One of the trends of the last five months is that we all joke about how we don't know what day it is anymore. One day blurs into the next. It is critical that we don't blur and

lose the special days that are rapidly approaching! Rosh Hashanah is not just any Saturday or Sunday, and the same goes for Yom Kippur, Sukkot and Simchat Torah! Since the synagogue building will not be welcoming all of us this year for services, we must take it upon ourselves to set those days apart from every single other day of the year!

So mark your calendars. Sit down with your family, with whomever you live, and make a plan to make those days special, to make those days count. Find out what each of you needs to really feel like it is holiday. What do you see when you close your eyes and imagine the "Perfect Rosh Hashanah?" It could be as simple as putting on "shul clothes" and eating apples and honey during or after tuning in to one of the amazing live stream programs Beth Shalom will offer. It could include creating a playlist of your favorite holiday prayers/melodies. It could include setting a festive table and sitting down to a special holiday meal. It could certainly include zooming or facetimeing "guests" to your holiday table!

Just don't let these holy days get away from you. Wishing you and all of your loved ones a healthy, happy, sweet new year. May you be written and sealed for a year of prosperity and joy. Shanah Tovah!

Fall 2020 does not look like any fall I have ever had!

In order to try to meet families where their comfort level may be, we are offering 3 different programs this fall.

We will be offering 2 small classes initially, one for 3's and one for PreK. These classes will meet in school, similarly to how we have always had class. The main difference will be that the two classes will not interact at all so they can form their own cohort. This program will not start until COVID-19 cases are on the decline in our area.

We will also offer pods, groups of 4 children each with 1 teacher. All of the pod programming will take place outside

for 1 ½ hours 2 or 3 times a week. Our pods will be for 18 month olds thru PreK children.

Additionally, we will offer field activities where families will attend programs on our field, sitting on their blankets and social distancing. Music and movement, yoga and Shabbat singing will take place along with an art project or science activity.

### Guard and Remember in one utterance.

As this year's high holidays approach, this passage - which we recite at Kabbalat Shabbat - kept bouncing in my head. The teaching reflects that in the two different places the Ten Commandments are delivered in the Torah, the commandment to observe Shabbat is once to guard Shabbat, and the other to remember Shabbat. The writer of L'cha Dodi is telling us that it is as if God delivered these two words together.

The high holiday time is a time of remembrance (Zachor is the root word for Zikaron). It's easy for all of us to remember the times spent with family at Rosh HaShanah and Yom Kippur - the special and fancy meals; the sweet, unique fall tastes of apples dipped in honey; the glow of the holiday candles shimmering off of a beautiful round challah; the time spent holding a grandparent's hand while we were children fidgeting in services; and the warm embrace and laughter of friends in the "hallway minyan" as we came and went from the sanctuary.

Of course, this year will be different - fewer family members at our meals, not being together in the services, study sessions, baby-sitting, youth services, and - my personal favorite - the hallway minyan.

This weekly reminder - that we must both GUARD and REMEMBER our traditions - has been the reason we made such significant changes to this year's holiday offerings. This year, the need to GUARD enables us to REMEMBER our

holiday observance.

As our clergy, volunteers and staff create new High Holiday experiences that guard and protect us from the risks associated with spreading a virus during a global pandemic, Congregation Beth Shalom will preserve the memory of holidays past while sparking new family experiences that become glowing memories for you and your family as you celebrate this season together.

As I wish each of you and your families a sweet, happy and healthy new year, my heartfelt gratitude goes out to Ann Karty, Hanan Hammer and Steve Ruben who guided our process around opening safely; to Rabbi Glickman and Hazzan Ben-Yehuda for their boundless energy, flexibility, and creativity; to Eric Schultz and the members of the ritual committee for supporting these new efforts at High Holiday connection and meaning; and to Judy Jacks Berman and Stefanie Williams who have guided our amazing staff to make the most of a year when Guarding and Remembering took on new meaning and urgency.

## Sisterhood Achieves International Recognition

Beth Shalom Sisterhood is one of 13 sisterhoods in the Intra-Continental Region of Women's League for Conservative Judaism to be presented the coveted Jewels in the Crown Award at the July 2020 Virtual Convention of Women's League for Conservative Judaism.

The Women's League for Conservative Judaism's Jewels in the Crown Award was established in 2009 in order to recognize sisterhoods who have shown excellence in education, cultural programming, and social action, and who strongly identify with Women's League.

To fulfill the criteria for the award, each Sisterhood must participate in Women's League programs or develop their own to fulfill the categories of Education/Program, Community Service/World Affairs and Women's League Activities. A minimum of two programs or projects must have been fulfilled each fiscal year between July 2017 and June 2020. A winning Sisterhood must have also submitted their per capita payment on time, participated in the Torah Fund Campaign and have had an attendee at a regional conference or meeting.

When training for this role and when running for office, she attended trainings including, ones by the National Democratic Training Committee and the Kansas Federation of Democratic Women. At the conclusion of the program, there will be a Q&A session available.
