FROM THE Rabbi's Study



One Year Later: Beginning the Journey Home

One year ago, our congregation, like synagogues around the country, made the decision to shut down our in-person services inside our building. Like the continuing story of the Jewish people, we have been yearning for our return home. As the infection rates from this plague decrease and the vaccination rates increase, we are hopeful for us to connect again live and in person.

This year for our Beth Shalom family has been one of deep pain, and also appreciation for the meaning and joy our synagogue community brings to each of us.

We tragically said good-bye to many members over the past year. Some of these were actual Covid deaths, but many more were Covid-adjacent losses. Many of you lost family members and friends around the country and the world. The hardest part of this year for many of us was the inability to be physically close to those whom we love during times of grief.

We were also inspired by the resilience of our Beth Shalom Community. As soon as we closed our physical doors we opened our virtual doors. We reached out through phone-a-thons, we created meaningful worship through streaming and zoom, we stretched our creative muscles like never before. Who had ever heard of a Zoom minyan, a Car Mitzvah, High Holidays in a park, a Shofar drive-thru, or Purim at the Drive-In before this year? The energy was boundless from our entire community: the members, the volunteers, our new fans who tune in from around the country, the board leadership, our cemetery, maintenance, support and programming staffs. Our congregation did a moon launch while building and repairing the rocket during the journey! I have never been prouder or more grateful for a synagogue community than I was this year.

So, on this year anniversary, I want to share with you that as vaccination rates increase and infection rates decrease, our congregation is diligently working on Connecting Together Live. These are the three words that I want us to

keep in mind: Connecting. Together. Live. Connecting. Foundationally, our congregation uses Jewish experiences to connect with one another to be the best individuals we can be – and to be the best community we can be. Together. We want to be with one another – both like the days before Covid, and in deeper ways as we've grown this past year. Live. We are creating Jewish Living Experiences together. We will make them safe. We will only connect in ways that the infection rates permit. We will make these experiences accessible. But, our purpose is for us to have these experiences both “Live” as in “Saturday Night Live” – in real time. But also, to keep us physically, spiritually and emotionally alive. We can't wait to celebrate with you and connect together live in the coming weeks. We will do it with joy. We will do it safely. We will do it together in collaboration with each other.

Beginning the Shabbat after Passover, Beth Shalom will begin having weekly Shabbat morning services in Goldsmith Hall, by reservation. We will begin with up to 30 congregants present, and plan on increasing these numbers throughout the late spring and summer. We will follow guidelines for appropriate masking, distancing and registration protocols. We look forward during the summer to add the Library Minyan's services to our Shabbat morning offerings. Safety measures permitting, our goal for the high holidays is to offer as many in person opportunities to celebrate, pray and be together as is safe. We will continue to offer streaming alternatives for those unable to join us physically. We are also looking toward the safest way to learn and connect together live for preschool, religious school, USY, and adult engagement as the summer winds down.

“For forty days and forty nights...”

No, that’s not how this story starts.

“When I was a kid...”

Nope.

“It was the best of times, it was the worst of times...”

Well, that’s definitely closer.

Masks, gloves, hand sanitizer -- I don’t think any of us really believed what was going to become “the new normal” and it is okay to admit this has been scary. At the same time we’ve been trying to protect ourselves, we’ve also needed to remain vigilant to protect others.

Thank you, Beth Shalom, for recognizing the potential danger more than a year ago and helping to protect our vulnerable synagogue community with *pikuach nefesh* (the saving of lives).

Thank you for remaining a *beit kenneset* (a place of prayer and study) and providing opportunities for us to continue to celebrate together gathering via physically distanced means (i.e., phone, computer screen, ZOOM) and allowing us to still be socially present with each other.

COVID-19 provided Beth Shalom time to create innovative programming formats and evolve different uses of technology. Special stages strategically placed in Goldsmith Hall (more than 20 feet apart) along with plexiglass and required mask wearing, allowed livestreaming services by our Rabbi and Hazzan for viewing from home on much smaller computer screens.



Cooperative weather even helped us maintain appropriate distance to celebrate many holidays outdoors this past year. And, families who may never have previously celebrated Jewish holidays in their own home, started their own traditions by holding seders at kitchen tables.



As local COVID-19 infection rates decrease and vaccination rates increase, we begin the process to return to the synagogue for safe gathering. Families have been able to celebrate together in Goldsmith Hall (in limited numbers) b’nai mitzvah ceremonies, while sitting in appropriately distanced chairs, spread throughout the room.



Safety remains a priority, while increasing attendance at services, which is currently planned to begin after Pesach. Protocols with preregistration, required mask wearing, and physical spacing is part of “our new normal,” for now. Because of our period of growth this past year, our innovative programming formats and livestream services will also continue.

Please stay well. As a family physician, here is my advice: wear a mask, wash your hands, keep your vaccinations up-to-date, and physically distance as appropriate. Remember, when you are protecting yourself, you continue to protect those around you.
