Justice in January

Over a year ago Beth Shalom members, Alan Edelman and Debbie Sosland-Edelman, began a Social Justice Committee over Zoom for our Congregation. Beginning in the fall of 2020, a committed group of congregants spent a year learning about different individuals and organizations that are pursuing justice in Kansas City and beyond.

Justice – the translation of the Hebrew word, Tzedek – is different than lovingkindness, or Hesed. As Jews, we have an obligation to act in the ways of Hesed, of lovingkindness in our interactions with others. However, the Jewish tradition also calls for us to work to create a just society.

After our year of learning and connecting with different leaders, our committee has chosen three areas of focus to begin with:

1. Shalom Homes

Shalom Homes will be a partnership between Congregation Beth Shalom and a pre-existing organization called Tikkun KC. Tikkun KC purchases blighted properties and restores them for dignified home ownership for low-income families. Tikkun KC works on neighborhood transformation in partnership with the residents of the neighborhood. 2. Good Faith Network

The Good Faith Network is an expansion of the successful “Justice Matters” initiative in Lawrence, Kansas. Beth Shalom is one of over two dozen houses of worship in Johnson County. The Good Faith Network will harness the

3. Front Porch Alliance

Front Porch Alliance works together with Kansas City’s eastside children and families to meet their changing needs at home and in school. This is a very hands-on volunteer opportunity to help families in the Kansas City area directly. SARAH PELTZMAN EDUCATIONAL SERIES

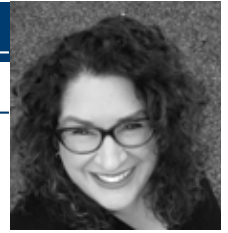

The Congregation, and the entire community, is invited to join our Beth Shalom Sisterhood members for the 2nd trimester of Sarah Peltzman classes which will begin on Thursday morning, February 3.

Hazzan Ben-Yehuda will be teaching all five weeks. Her topic will be “Midrash—the What and Why Behind the Stories You Think You Know”. These classes will be held in person at the synagogue from 10-11:30 am through March 3. (Note: We will have the ability to Zoom a class in case of severe weather).

For a fourth grade assignment, my son was asked to interview a mensch. He chose Rabbi Glickman. When asked why he chose Rabbi, he said “Well, he showed me and Josh how to burn things on Passover. And he’s really nice.” With a little prodding, he said Rabbi Glickman explained how we search for all the chametz and then perform the ceremonial biur chametz, the burning of leavened bread before Pesach. So obviously, setting a fire at synagogue is pretty cool, and learning without realizing that’s what you are doing, is even cooler!

Amos has known Rabbi Glickman his whole life. As a staff kid, he has been in the synagogue a lot, so there have been many opportunities to interact with Rabbi. But it goes so much deeper than that. He learned from an early age that Rabbi Glickman was someone he could learn from, talk to and trust. When Amos started school at HBHA, many of his classmates were wearing tzitzit under their shirts, so Amos wanted to as well. We encouraged him to talk with Rabbi about what it meant to wear tzitzit and how to do it respectfully. He listened carefully and based his decision off the conversation he had with Rabbi.



When Amos turned 7, he asked for a shofar for his birthday. He practiced blowing it at home, in the car, outside, everywhere. And it wasn't always

pleasant!! The first time we were at synagogue after he got his shofar, he went straight to Rabbi's office to show him. I was in my office, and suddenly was getting videos of a shofar blowing challenge between Amos and Rabbi. They have blown shofar together every year since. There have been many more videos of them blowing shofar together, at shul, at school and even more challenges! Always side by side. Always playing off each other. Always encouraging and



congratulating. Rabbi even helped build Amos' confidence so he could be the shofar blower at the outdoor pavilion service this past year.

For his interview, Amos asked Rabbi many

questions about what it means to be a mensch and how you become a mensch. Rabbi told him that a mensch is someone who cares a lot about others. Someone who is there for you during the worst times, and the best times. Rabbi said he learned a lot from his parents, his wife and his friends. He tries to model himself on people who are mensches. He tries to be sensitive to how his words and actions affect others.

It says in Pirkei Avot to “find yourself a teacher, acquire for yourself a friend”. Rabbi Glickman is Amos' teacher. He is his friend. He is his mensch. He is so lucky to have this role model. So lucky to have this relationship. Every time we talk about the new sanctuary and how Amos will hopefully be one of the first Bar Mitzvah on the new bima, I am overwhelmed with gratitude. I want this relationship for every congregant! Get to know our clergy. Come to programs, come to services, come when you want to learn something new. You may just find yourself a teacher, and acquire a new friend!

Have you heard about our newest program series, Better Together? This exciting set of events throughout the year is geared specifically for those families who have children in kindergarten and first grade. Better Together programs have a few goals; these events offer social opportunities to parents as well as children, and each Better Together event gives families Jewish skills that they can use outside of the synagogue context.

The first main goal of Better Together is to help families with similar-age children to meet each other and become friends. Fostering friendships among families enriches our Beth Shalom community and brings joy to every family who participates.

The second main goal of Better Together is to put Jewish practice and rich Jewish experience in the hands of each family – to empower all of our kindergarten and first grade families to enrich their Jewish practice meaningfully and joyfully.

Better Together programs this year include a start-of-year social orientation event, a gathering at the synagogue's sukkot, a havdalah intensive, Hanukkah story and dreidel-making, a challah-braiding workshop, a mezuzah workshop, making mishloach manot (baskets of food and goodies to share with friends at Purim), an end-of-year barbeque, and others.

Rabbi Glickman and I have enjoyed getting to know, deepening our relationship with our Better Together families so far this year. We look forward to expanding this programming in the years to come. We can't wait to engage more families, to bring more parents together socially, to facilitate more friendships within our community, and to enrich your Jewish lives both inside and especially outside of the synagogue. Legacy Giving to Beth Shalom Foundation

A major focus of our Foundation is establishing commitments for Legacy Giving. This is a written commitment by our members to designate funds that will be given to our Foundation upon the member's passing. It is a wonderful way to ensure the vibrancy of Beth Shalom for future generations

The purpose of our Foundation is to support the ongoing needs of our Congregation. This is done through an annual allocation of funds to supplement the budget and through funding of unusual capital expenses. For many years the Foundation has been able to allocate 5% of our fund balance to the Congregation. Additionally, we have funded unusual needs such as unanticipated repairs to our building or technology.

Several years ago, our Kansas City Jewish Community Foundation provided incentives to our Foundation (and others in our community) to obtain commitments for Legacy Giving. This program led to member commitments

exceeding three million dollars, and the Foundation continues to support our efforts and helps our members devise their giving plans.

Our members fund their commitments in numerous ways. Some families designate a set amount from their estates, while others designate a percentage of their estate. Additionally, members often designate our Foundation to receive the proceeds (or partial proceeds) of life insurance policies or retirement funds. Lastly, many of our members have, or establish, Donor Advised Funds with the Jewish Community Foundation for this purpose.
