Return. Renewal. Renaissance?

The time that we approach Yom Kippur is known as the days of "Return," teshuvah.

The time of Rosh HaShanah, however is known as a time of hidush, "Renewal." When we dip our apples in honey, we ask God to Renew us with a new year of sweetness. This seeming contradiction between renewal (becoming something new or different), and return (going back to something familiar) is actually where our congregation is right now.

We have continued to build and deepen our congregational relationships even within the twists and turns of a pandemic that has forced more isolation than nearly all of us have ever had in our lifetime.

In the midst of this, the leadership of Congregation Ohev Sholom and Congregation Beth Shalom have facilitated a renewed congregation with added energy and vibrancy. It is not unusual to hear stories in the Jewish press about congregations that cannot overcome small differences and end up dissolving instead of dreaming together of a brighter future.

Also, we surpassed any fundraising goals that we had set several years ago for our new sanctuary. Unfortunately, these increased funds are to help us continue to meet the inflated costs due to global financial insecurity. It has been inspiring to see the incredible outpouring of our congregation.

Finally, through continued fiscal responsibility on the part of our leadership and also biding out time during the "great resignation," we have made two new hires significantly expanding our investment in the next generation. We have hired Ben Novorr as our Youth and Family Programming director and Civia White as our Director of Education. Hazzan Ben-Yehuda working exclusively in clergy and pastoral roles will be placing special focus on the years prior and following the critical year of bar and bat mitzvah.

Congregation Beth Shalom has 294 children ages 0-18 in our membership – we owe this next generation a meaningful and joyful Jewish future.

We have learned so much from the time of COVID, and we will try to incorporate this into our ongoing education and programming. We have learned that folks appreciate and miss in-person gatherings, and that screens will not be a full-time replacement for Judaism "In Real Life." At the same time, we have learned about the efficacy and true meaning by having "Judaism on Demand," that is afforded by thoughtful uses of technology. We have learned that while the pandemic shone a light on mental health issues and loneliness specifically – these were not new issues, they were exacerbated ones. We are working on finding the best way that our gatherings can help bring a deep sense of belonging. Also, we have learned that our members love gathering in our building and want to have Jewish experiences geographically close to them. This is the catalyst for some of the new programming like the Shir L'Shabbat Service that is around 70 blocks north of our synagogue building.

As with other intellectual, cultural and artistic renaissances in the past – I am hopeful that our synagogue, Beth Shalom, is also poised for renaissance. Like we learned in European history class – renaissances come about through the alchemy of both renewing into something different, and building (or rediscovering) values from our past. I pray that we can look forward to this type of renewal/return/renaissance in 5783.

My wife, Annie, and our children, Gavi, Ellie and Dani, join me in wishing everyone in our congregation a sweet new year!


I was humming the tune of “Sunrise, Sunset” and wondered about the lyrics. In the musical “Fiddler on the Roof,” the words talk about children growing up, becoming beautiful and tall. The song foreshadows seasons passing for the newlyweds and how they will learn from each other.

Sunrise signifies a new beginning, a birth, revived spirit, hope. So, maybe reversing the words to “Sunset, Sunrise” would have been a more appropriate telling of their future together?

Have you ever “really” experienced a full sunrise?

One December night at Haleakala Crater in Hawaii, driving to the top of the almost 10,000-foot summit at 4 am, going from an 85 degree Fahrenheit ocean to a 40 degree Fahrenheit wind, and standing with about 50 people. I looked up and saw stars, planets, and a winter time meteor shower. For hours we waited in the cold dark.

Facing east, shadowed fog covered edges of stones making up the crater basin. People talk about how it’s always darkest right before the light, but that’s not exactly true. As the black edge was slowly outlined by blue, yellow, a tint of white, and then a bit of orange in the sky, I could see the subtle curvature of the horizon where the earth touched the sky. Though the colors were constantly changing, it seemed that time stood still.



When walking into a dark room and suddenly turning on a light, the brightness is sometimes jarring, unexpected, and can even be painful. There are times that growth feels like that.

For me, Congregation Beth Shalom is much like a multicolored, progressive, steady sunrise. With the successful consolidation of our conservative synagogues, we have joined families to collectively work as a strong Jewish community. A new Sacred Space building is forthcoming and with our expanded educational programming and family initiatives, together we are evolving similar to watching a deliberate sunrise each day.






