Light the Menorah

#### Blessing Over the Hanukkah Candles (to be said prior to lighting the candles)

ברוך אתה הי אלקינו מלך העולם אשר קדשנו במצות'ו וצונו להרליק נר של חנכה. Barukh atah Adonai, Eloheinu Melekh ha'olam, asher kid'shanu b'mitzvotav, v'tzivanu l'hadlik ner shel Hanukkah.

Blessed are you Adonai our God, Ruler of the universe, who has made us holy through God's commandments, and commanded us to light the Hanukkah candles.

#### Blessing for Miracles (recite immediately following the first blessing, prior to lighting)

ברוך אתה הי אלקינו מלך העולם שעשה נסים לאבותינו בימים ההם ובזמן הזה. Barukh atah Adonai, Eloheinu Melekh ha'olam, she'ahsa neesim la'avotaynu bayamim haheim baz'man hazeh. Blessed are you Adonai our God, Ruler of the universe, who performed wonders for our ancestors in history at this very time of year.

#### Blessing for Special Occasions (recite following the Blessing for Miracles only on the first night of Hanukkah)

ברוך אתה הי אלקינו מלך העולם שהחינו וק׳מנו והגיענו לזמן הזה. Barukh atah Adonai, Eloheinu Melekh ha'olam, shehekheyanu v'kiy'manu v'higiyanu laz'man hazeh. Blessed are you Adonai our God, Ruler of the universe, who gave us life, sustains us, and enabled us to reach this season.

# Hanukkah: The Time to Light Our Fires

Hanukkah's miracles are famous for the miracle of the oil that lasted for eight days

instead of one, and for the unbelievable military victory of the Maccabees over the Syrian Greeks.

However, preceding either of these miracles was the miracle of Matityahu's (Mattathias in English) inner strength. Matityahu was a Cohen (priest) who had the ability to offer sacrifices in the Temple. The attacking Syrian Green King Antiochus IV's local governor tried to get Matityahu to offer pagan offerings per the king's order. They knew that because of Matityahu's office and personal reputation of integrity would cause others to follow him on the path of idolatry.

Matityahu refused to succumb to the religious triumphalism of the Hellenists and stayed true to his belief. He fled for the hills with his sons including the leader who would become the hero of the Hanukkah story, Judah Maccabee.

The Maccabees and the oil get all of the glory when we celebrate Hanukkah, but Judah's father, Matityahu, deserves so much credit. It was his internal strength that allowed him to stand up to the seemingly insurmountable external forces as well as inspire his own sons and many followers.

Two early Hasidic rabbis, the Ba'al Shem Tov and Rabbi Menachem Mendel of Kotzk (the Kotzker Rebbe) had two ways of looking at fire and flames. The Ba'al Shem encouraged Jews to have an outward facing flame to inspire our worship in God. The Kotzker Rebbe focused on one's inner life. A contemporary teacher, Rabbi Matthew Berkowitz writes: "The Baal Shem Tov desired a flaming personality that could radiate the light and love of Torah and God from the inside out; moments of spiritual ecstasy keep the flame continually burning. For the Kotzker Rebbe, it is steadiness and directedness that keeps an internal, concealed flame driving the individual."

We are living in a time of tremendous Jewish opportunity and tremendous Jewish challenge. On one hand Jewish life and learning has never been more accessible and welcoming, on the other hand for many American Jews there has never been a time of more visible antisemitism.


Our job is to be shamash candles. We must be the ones who light one another's spiritual flames. For some of us this will come from an outward-facing flame, for some of us this will come from an inner concealed flame. Our job, though, is to give space (especially for our young people) to ignite sparks within themselves.



## Hanukkah brings Lessons of Light, Courage and Hope

Hanukkah brings light into our lives during the darkest part of the year, when the days are short, and the nights are long. It is a time when we remember the miracle of the oil burning longer than it should have to allow time to rededicate the Holy Temple after it had been desecrated.

It is a time for rejoicing: playing dreidel to help remember and celebrate that "A Great Miracle Happened There", "Ness Gadol Hayah Sham." We eat latkes and sufganiyot (fried, jelly-filled donuts) cooked in oil; we put up decorations; and we light our menorah each night for eight nights to remember the miracle.

For me, the true miracle and lesson of Hanukkah is not just that the oil lasted for eight days, but that the Jewish people had the resolve to do the best that they could with what they had, and even though they thought the oil would not last as long as they needed, they went ahead and began to clean up the Temple and to do the best they could with the oil they had. Without the determination to begin, they never would have accomplished their goal.

In addition to determination, Hanukkah is about courage. Sometimes it isn't where we wind up in life; it is the desire to do the best we can with what we have, and to move forward, to try; to begin, even if we don't know where we will wind up or how things will end. Sometimes we start out with one goal in mind, and along the way, discover another path, another destination. And one thing is for sure: You can't

accomplish your goal if you don't have the courage to begin.

Hanukkah brings hope and faith into our lives and reminds us of the everyday miracles we experience: waking up, opening our eyes, moving through the day. Hanukkah brings light into our lives, and is a story of hope for the future, and faith that once we begin, we will have courage and find our way to a miracle that is meant just for us. This is the lesson of Hanukkah I want to pass on to my children and grandchildren.

I hope you all have a meaningful, spiritual, and glowing Hanukkah.
