

Together We will Plant a Beautiful (Spiritual) Garden

This coming month is one of the most beautiful, and under-celebrated, holidays

of the year: Tu B'Shevat. (This year it falls on Monday, Feb. 6, 2023). Tu B'Shevat is the "New Year of the Trees." Tu B'Shevat is a lot like Mother's Day – we appreciate our moms every day, but we celebrate her on one particular day. Similarly, we benefit from trees every day, but we have one day in the year when we celebrate all that we receive from the trees. In recent decades, it has become a holiday for Jewish environmental values.

Planting, gardening, and trees are recurring symbols in all aspects of Jewish life. People are compared to trees, the Torah is called a "Tree of Life," and the very beginning of our Torah can be read as an introduction to understanding Judaism's view on the relationship between human kind and the natural world.

As we approach this year's Tu B'Shevat I encourage you to think about the lifecycle of trees, seeds, replanting and rebirth in relationship to synagogue life. The several years of Covid and its continued recovery can be likened to the tree's life cycle. We have experienced a long winter; and those with immunocompromised bodies are, in many ways, still isolated from it.

For the last 6-12 months we have been in the process of replanting. We have been experimenting with the reintroduction of a Tot Shabbat service weekly (with an enhanced Tot Shabbat monthly). We have been planting seeds for a new Shabbat initiative for early elementary grades called "Shabbat Shelanu" ("Our Shabbat"). We have seen many teens and alumni reading Torah in our Goldsmith service, longtime friends returning to the Library Minyan in person, and the continued energy of our Social Justice Committee which launched during Covid. Additionally, we have been experimenting with finding our footing in reaching our families that live in Prairie Village and KCMO as we continue Ohev Sholom's Shir L'Shabbat service and launched a Melton Course at JFS in Brookside.

All of these new initiatives – and replanting of existing initiatives are the cultivations of a beautiful, spiritual, communal garden.

Outside my window, every day I see the heavy construction vehicles hard at work beginning the task of building our new sanctuary. As I watch, I know that we are not exactly cultivating a spiritual garden – we are in a greenhouse. We are getting the plants, flowers and vegetables ready so that when our garden (the sanctuary) is completed – it will be filled with all of the beautiful spiritual bounty that we have been cultivating in the months and years following the long Covid winter.

Shalom Chevre, Peace my Dear Friends,
