It is an ancient and widespread custom for the first born to fast on the day before Passover commemorating the miracle which spared them from the plague that struck down the Egyptian first born. This fast is treated leniently. Thus, if there is a festive meal that relates to a mitzvah (for example the completion of a tractate of the Talmud), the firstborn participates in the meal rather than fasting.

With this in mind-all Beth Shalom first born are invited to join us for services and a siyyum (celebration) as we complete a tractate of Talmud.
