A Jewish State for ALL of her Citizens

As I write this article, it's a beautiful Jerusalem night - the air is crisp and cool, the humidity is perfect, and the sounds of Jerusalem nature fill the air in the quiet neighborhood in which I am staying. I am here to study at the Hartman Institute, where among many other inspirational programs both in Israel and in North America, rabbis and cantors come and study for 10 days every summer. This year's program was designed to renew and refresh those of us who love Torah study with colleagues, and also to give us food for thought on our own spiritual lives and the lives of our communities. In addition, a special series of additional lectures is dedicated to helping us understand what "the situation" looks like to the leaders of the Hartman Institute - from issues surrounding the current government and its policies and actions to Hartman's own Center for a Shared Society, a branch of the Hartman Institute dedicated to dialogue between Israelis and Palestinians so that we can hope to live side by side in harmony and equity.

Last night, Rana Fahoum, a Palestinian Israeli citizen who was recently appointed the director of the Center for a Shared Society, and Donniel Hartman, the President of the Hartman Institute, interviewed each other in a conversation where they talked about what each of them, a Palestinian Israeli and a Jewish Israeli, needs in order to imagine living in a truly shared society.

I found the conversation to be troubling, intriguing, brutally honest, full of respect and ultimately, hope. Both Rana and Donniel shared aspects of how they have felt in the past and



A Youth Director Walks into a Jewish Summer Camp...

Imagine this... a person arrives at Herzl Camp or Camp Ramah in Wisconsin. They've never been to summer camp before. They're putting on a brave face... looking like they're an old pro... like they've been there countless times before. Underneath, they're nervous. They don't know how they're gonna fit in (or if they will at all). Will they seem like a fish out of water because they don't know the traditions or customs of the camp? You might think this is a new, young camper, but it's actually the Beth Shalom Youth Director.

I never attended summer camp when I was a kid, so going up to visit our teens at Herzl and Ramah was an exciting, yet frightening proposition for me. It was a completely new experience that I feared just a little bit. When I arrived at both camps, the world of camp didn't slow down in order for me to catch up, however what did happen was absolutely magical!

how they feel now that conflict with the aspirations of the other. And yet they both are committed to the process of listening to each other and sharing their truths with each other. They were clearly comfortable with each other. Watching them and hearing them, I could feel the crumbling of the foundation of some of the concepts upon which I was raised to think about Palestinians.

Donniel began his part of the dialogue by sharing that early on, he decided that he would approach his relationship with Palestinians with the dictum of Rabbi Akiba, that which is hateful to you, do not do to others - he felt this would be a strong foundation for repair. But he has come to realize that this way of behaving falls so far short of where we as Israelis and we as Jews MUST treat others - especially those beside whom we are striving to live, and especially since we are the ones with power. We must go a step further than Rabbi Akiba and realize that our obligation is actually - that which is hateful to OTHERS we must not do to others. We have a moral obligation to find out what the other needs, to hear them where they are and if necessary, to help lift them up.

I have no idea how long it will take us to achieve the shared society for which the Hartman institute is striving. I have no idea exactly how it is going to happen. I do know, though, that I am invested in this course of action. I am invested in feeling less conflicted about the status of the Palestinian minority population living in our midst in Israel who feels that they are oppressed and occupied, regardless of how I may have felt about their situation.

The teens of Beth Shalom regularly would approach me before each and every activity to tell me exactly what was about to happen, and then would check-in with me afterwards to hear my thoughts on what I had just experienced. I was touched and humbled by what initially felt like a welfare check of sorts. That being said, after thinking about it, I realized what it really was was our teens be so incredibly proud of their respective camps and the community they have built there, and they wanted to show it off, share it, and welcome me into it.

New experiences can be a scary but also beautiful thing. I am returning to Kansas City enlightened, motivated, and inspired by the pure joy and meaning that Jewish summer camp has to offer. I consider myself blessed and thankful that our teens welcomed me with open arms into their camp communities.
