Blessing Over the Hanukkah Candles (to be said prior to lighting the candles)

ברוך אתה הי אלקינו מלך העולם אשר קדשנו במצות׳ו וצונו להדליק נר של חנכה. Barukh atah Adonai, Eloheinu Melekh ha'olam, asher kid'shanu b'mitzvotav, v'tzivanu l'hadlik ner shel Hanukkah.

Blessed are you Adonai our God, Ruler of the universe, who has made us holy through God's commandments, and commanded us to light the Hanukkah candles.

Blessing for Miracles (recite immediately following the first blessing, prior to lighting)

ברוך אתה הי אלקינו מלך העולם שעשה נסים לאבותינו בימים ההם ובזמן הזה. Barukh atah Adonai, Eloheinu Melekh ha'olam, she'ahsa neesim la'avotaynu bayamim haheim baz'man hazeh. Blessed are you Adonai our God, Ruler of the universe, who performed wonders for our ancestors in history at this very time of year.

Blessing for Special Occasions (recite following the Blessing for Miracles only on the first night of Hanukkah)

ברוך אתה הי אלקינו מלך העולם שהחינו וק'מנו והגיענו לזמן הזה. Barukh atah Adonai, Eloheinu Melekh ha'olam, shehekheyanu v'kiy'manu v'higiyanu laz'man hazeh. Blessed are you Adonai our God, Ruler of the universe, who gave us life, sustains us, and enabled us to reach this season.



Standing As One: So Rare

Standing at the March for Israel in Washington, D.C. with members of our Kansas City community and members of our senior educational and clergy team at the synagogue was a profound experience. I ran into close relatives I hadn't seen since

before COVID. I reconnected in person with dozens of friends I hadn't seen in years or decades, and I knew I was standing in the mall with so many other friends I didn't run into physically.

I saw folks waving Pride flags with Stars of David emblazoned on them like an Israeli flag. I saw entire black-hat yeshivot who stood in separate fenced in areas so the boys didn't mix with girls as is their custom. Sweatshirts and kippot from every university Hillel and Chabad on campus were visible. Signs from every city in North America were raised high telling everyone that their community was there.

Seeing all the signs and swag visible, it reminded me of the Numbers 2:2 describing the Israelites in formation in the desert: "The Israelites shall camp each with his standard, under the banners of their ancestral house." Our "standards" were the individual municipalities from which we came, the banner of our "ancestral home" were the seemingly infinite Israeli flags reminding the world that the Land of Israel is all of our ancestral home. I know that in a minute we will be arguing again. We will self-separate over denominations, nuances of liturgy, meaningful disagreements over philosophies. Some of our divisions will help us cast a wider net by having a variety of entry ways into the Jewish people's tent; some of our divisions will be meaningless and self-destructive hairsplitting. But for that one, two-hour window we stood together. We were the largest choir singing "Star Spangled Banner" I'd ever been a part of, and possibly the largest choir in history to sing "HaTikvah." We all chanted "Bring Them Home!" loudly. Even if media outlets chose not to hear our cries, perhaps the Great Redeemer of Captives would hear our cry.

As we approach Hanukkah, I pray that our candles will shine to even the darkest of places for those who need these lights the most.

Friday, December 8 - All Ages, 4:30 pm

Saturday, December 9 - All Ages; Families with young children 11 am

After giving the D'var Torah in the Library Minyan, Rabbi Kaplan will be at Pajamukkah Shabbat: Tot Shabbat and Programming for families with young children, followed by kiddush lunch. FROM THE Hazzan

I am on the plane headed home from the March for Israel in Washington DC.

It was a clear, bright, breezy, perfect day. My brother and I arrived on the mall very early- we made our way up to the stage to experience the event up close. This meant that we were with mostly college and some high school kids and their families, and with Israelis and people who like me and my brother, have family in Gaza. Our Uncle Mark's cousins, Keith and Aviva Siegel, residents of Kfar Aza, who made aliyah in their youth and were dedicated to relations between Palestinians and Israelis.

There were impressive speakers who made succinct and impactful statements. There were parents, siblings, and loved ones of hostages who spoke. Also, American and Israeli elected officials, Jewish-American actors, and American and Israeli singers. Throughout the five hours that we stood, sang, chanted, danced, and cried, I kept returning to one thought- this cannot be all. What will we do next? What will each of us do right now?

On November 26, I am flying to Israel. I will spend four days there with a handful of cantor-colleagues giving pastoral care to displaced Israeli families in Jerusalem. We will volunteer in temporary schools in the hotels that have become centers of refuge for entire communities. We will perform a concert for those those families. We will sing and pray together, and I will bring all the love and pas-

sion of our entire KC community with me. On October 20, my now-fiancé and I got engaged. On December 30, we will celebrate our aufruf, being called to the Torah to receive a blessing a week before we

get married. All this tremendous personal joy is in relief of the backdrop of the war in Israel and the most dramatic level of anti-Jewish hate incidents in America.

What can we do? We can - we must - punctuate our grief and our activism with moments of utter joy and celebration. We can and must bring our prayers for release of our hostages - our family - to these events. We can and must keep their names on our tongue and images of their beautiful faces before our eyes. We must exercise the longing for their return as we exercised our longing for a return to our homeland for 2,000 years - with prayers, with protests, phone calls and letters to our elected officials. We must show up to vigils and to synagogue services; we must be together. We must deepen and strengthen our community so that not one Jewish person in Kansas City has to feel isolated or afraid.

My friends, now is the time to be stronger than we have ever been. Join the leaders of our community in support of the people of Israel who need our support, who need to know that we are praying for them, that we are with them, that their struggle is also our struggle.

year. For four of them, this was their very first USY convention. This was the beginning of what will hopefully be a long tradition of involvement in USY programming.


