Let Us Share Some Messy Space Together: Anticipating This Year's High Holidays

As we look forward to the high holidays, many of our emotions are high from communal tragedies, communal celebrations, as well as our own personal milestones.

On the level of the Jewish people, we have experienced loss, fear and mourning because of October 7th. We have also had moments of this year of tremendous closeness and collective good in reaction to the tragedies. On the synagogue level, we were blessed to celebrate the dedication of a sanctuary over a decade in the making. We have

seen the infectious hope of building a new future together.

Thinking about this cacophony of emotion that is inside many of us as individuals, and also what we carry as a community, I am sharing a piece of a stanza from the Israeli poet, Yehuda Amichai whom I often turn to in times of confusion.

*I still have within me the lust to
search for living water
with quiet talk to the rock or with
frenzied blows.*

*Afterwards, silence: no questions,
no answers.*

*Jewish history and world history
grind me between them like two
grindstones, sometimes
to a powder. And the solar year and
the lunar year*

*get ahead of each other or fall be-
hind, leaping, they set my life in per-
petual motion.*

*Sometimes I fall into the gap be-
tween them to hide, or to sink all the
way down.*

This final line for the poet happens during the time of the turning of the year: "Sometimes I fall into the gap between them to hide, or to sink all the way down."

For me, always, the best part of the high holiday season is the simple act of holding space together. Sometimes there is a hug or embrace. Sometimes, a laugh or a mazel tov. Sometimes, tears. Sometimes, song. Sometimes, silence.

The act of sharing space can remind us that when we fall into the "gap between," it can be a "we" and need not be an "I."

I look forward to sharing blessings and hope for a year of renewal, a year of good health and a year of peace. I look forward to sharing space for new beginnings.

My family joins me in wishing you a sweet new year.



PLEASE, BE SEATED

"How good and pleasant it is to be sitting together."

– Psalm 133

At the dedication of our new sacred space, I had the distinct privilege of being the first to offer welcoming remarks. However, as I looked around at the hundreds of us who had gathered, still standing to acknowledge the arrival of our Torah scrolls in the new ark, I realized a quick adlib was needed: "Please...be seated."

I smiled to myself, realizing that this was the first-ever utterance of a phrase that will be repeated thousands of times in this sanctuary over the years to come. And with the seats filled, the sanctuary was finally complete.

At our board retreat several days before, everyone in attendance took a few moments to envision the future they'd like to see at Beth Shalom—six months, a year, five years from now—and distill it down to a single word. The results ranged from "comfort" to "colorful," from "safe" to "strength," from "generous" to "generations." (Also,



"FOMO," which may technically be four words: "Fear Of Missing Out." Discuss.) We then shared one thing—just one, small (or, perhaps, not so small) thing—that we would do to make that future vision more likely.

I revealed the first thing that came into my head: invite more people to our sukkah this year. It seemed like such low-hanging fruit (no, I don't mean the plastic apples and grapes on strings): we have a sukkah, and the point of the holiday is to invite guests to sit inside. There is even a blessing for it: ...

leisheiv basukkah. Yet, that is the first step to building community. Invite. Sit. Talk. (Eat.) Repeat.

Another year (5785) begins, and the Beth Shalom calendar beckons with different ways to connect, from the *Yamim Noraim* in our new sacred space and musical services to Sukkot (and our new Ohev Sholom sukkah pavilion), from upcoming young-adult and family and Sisterhood events to visiting lecturers and artists. There will be many opportunities for us to pray and learn and dance and eat and drink and sit together. So please...be seated. And invite a friend.

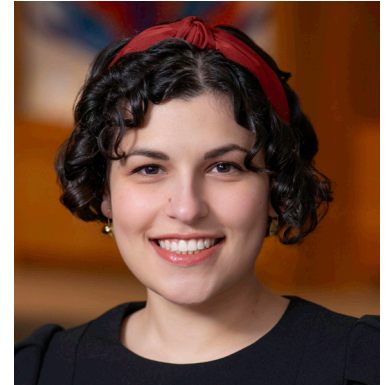


Yizkor for Commemorating 10/7

During the High Holy Day season, in addition to celebrating, soul searching, praying, and shmoozing, we also grieve. Both Yom Kippur and Shemini Atzeret include the Yizkor service, where we remember loved ones. For many at this time of year who are celebrating High Holy Days without a particular loved one for the first time, loss can feel acute. This year adds the additional layer of the one-year anniversary of October 7. In this moment of both individual and

communal mourning, I invite you to explore what liturgy works for you. Our Machzor, Lev Shalem, has many different poems and translations in the margins of each page. Perhaps you want to close your eyes and meditate or say the words in your heart. In the spirit of expansive prayer, I am including a new version of El Malei Rachamim written by Rabbi Sharon Cohen Anisfeld to commemorate some of the events of the past year.

The Polsky Religious School welcomed over 30 new students this school year. Bruchim, blessed, is also how we feel to see our children make new friends, our community grow, and our joy increase.

99% of the post-B'nai Mitzvah class is enrolled in the newly revamped 8th grade Sunday morning program. They meet to study Jewish texts, cook holiday foods, create a startup with an Israeli businessperson, practice spoken Hebrew, and more. The Confirmation Class has been redesigned to meet the needs of 9th and 10th grade students who have busy schedules. This class meets with either Rabbi Glickman or Rabbi Kapan on several Sunday mornings throughout the year to engage in conversations about homelessness, AI,

the justice system, food insecurity, and the environment.

Can't make it on Wednesdays? PRS now offers an additional optional hour of learning on Sunday mornings for grades 3-7. Have a Bar/Bat Mitzvah on the horizon? 5th and 6th grade students from both PRS and HBHA meet on Shabbat mornings for lessons with Hazzan Ben-Yehuda, worship with the congregation in our new sanctuary, and fun social programming.
