A Beth Shalom Hidden Gem: Daily Minyan

For many people – even multigenerational Beth Shalom veterans – our synagogue still has hidden gems that go unnoticed. One of these hidden gems is our daily minyan. Often, people don't “discover” our daily minyan until they have lost a parent or other close relative and need to say kaddish.

Likely since Beth Shalom's birth over a century ago, our community has had a daily minyan. Since I arrived in 2012, I have heard stories about the minyan in all its locations. For many years after we moved to 143rd and Lamar, we held our minyan at Village Shalom, and since the pandemic, we have had it at our synagogue.

Every day there are anywhere between two and six folks who are saying kaddish for a deceased relative. In addition, there are sometimes as many as 10-15 volunteers who come to ensure that there is a minyan and are not saying kaddish. Some of us come there because of our spiritual commitment to daily prayer, others come to “pay it forward” to ensure a minyan for someone else saying kaddish, and still others come for the camaraderie. On Torah reading days (Monday and Thursdays) there is a mini-kiddish with a l'chaim and cookies. Some mornings, folks go

out to breakfast with one another.

Much has been written about the psychological brilliance of the Jewish way to mourn our loved one. It is impossible to say too much about the genius of minyan. At a time when we are prone to social isolation, separation, and possibly depression – our tradition demands that we find nine others to be with in order to say the kaddish prayer. It is unusual to be so reliant on so many others to fulfill a spiritual and emotional need. It fosters humility in the mourner, and a sense of purpose for the folks who show up.

Nowadays, we have morning minyan in person every day. On Shabbat, as most know, we begin in the Main Sanctuary or the Library Minyan space (rooms 108-109) at 9:30 am. On Sundays and some national holidays, we have minyan at 8:00 am. On Mondays through Fridays, we have minyan at 7:00 am. We park in the lower parking lot and there is a security keycode that lets you enter with a code from 15 minutes before the start time until 15 minutes after. You can also attend by Zoom if you cannot get there in person. For evening minyan, it is at 6:00 pm Sunday – Thursday and is on Zoom only.

Coming to minyan for the first time can be intimidating if you aren't familiar with the prayers. Any of us on the clergy team would be happy to help you get acquainted. We take a rotation so that there is a member of clergy there nearly every morning. Our emails are at the end of this article.

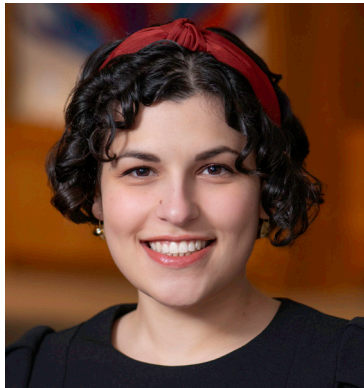


Three Faith-Inspired Ways to Honor Martin Luther King, Jr.

True peace is not merely the absence of tension; it is the presence of justice.

- Reverend Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr



MLK Day is more than a day of service - it can be a day to recommit to King's vision for racial and economic justice in America. Often as Jews, we like to recall how our ancestors, like Rabbi Abraham Joshua Heschel, walked alongside King. The word for Jewish law and living, "halakha," comes from the root of the verb "to walk." How we live as Jews is an ever-evolving and active process; we cannot just talk about how Heschel walked with King, but also, we must work to continue this path. Below are three suggestions for how to (re)commit to that project this MLK Day:

1. Celebrate the Torah of Jews of Color: The Jewish tradition is richer when we encounter the many "faces" of Torah. (Our tradition teaches that there are 70 faces of Torah, speaking to its

multivocal nature.) For the non-Black members of our community, you can learn from and celebrate the contributions of thinkers like chef Michael Twitty, Rabbi Sandra Lawson, and author (and rabbi) MaNishtana. For Black Jews in our community looking for interesting and supportive content, I recommend the podcast Wholly Jewish.

2. Read "Letter from a Birmingham Jail": After being imprisoned for participation in non-violent demonstrations, King addresses his fellow clergymen. This letter explains the dangers

of being more neutral, or moderate, in the face of injustice. As we read King's words, we can think about why he might have addressed this letter to faith leaders and what role we as people of faith have in responding to injustice today.

3. Learn about Redlining and Working for Equitable and Affordable Housing in Johnson County: There is a deep history in America of housing policy having racial and economic disparities, and Johnson County is no exception. Good Faith Network, the interfaith organization that Beth Shalom participates in to improve life for residents of Johnson County, is taking this history into account when we do our work on homelessness and affordable housing. Join Beth Shalom, Beth Torah, and B'nai Jehudah at Beth Shalom on February 16 for a training on this approach to social change, and pencil-in April 6 at 3 pm and May 6 at 6 pm for larger interfaith gatherings. If you can only make one, we suggest prioritizing May 6.
