Even if we are too old, too young, or simply not attending Jewish summer camp – we can create a camp-like atmosphere in our homes over the summer. Here are two ideas to bring some spirit to your summer:

Bring your Jewish Self on the Road(trip).

There is nothing more American than a summer road trip. The first paragraph of the *Shema* (the *v'ahavta*) says that we are to teach the words of our tradition to our children, and recite them when we are at home and when we are on the way.

Here are a few ways to make your road trip a Jewish road trip: Connect with a local Jewish community for a Friday



night or Saturday morning service. Bring Shabbat candle-sticks with your gear. Find places of Jewish interest in the towns you pass through (there are many old Jewish cemeteries in small towns and throughout the South and the West) and learn the stories of the places you go. Or, using a paid service like Audible.com or a free library service like Libby, you can find a lot of great Jewish audiobooks to listen to on the road.

Bring Shabbat Outside.

Shabbat meals

don't need to take place at the dining room table! Pick up a challah from Hen House or Trader Joe's, and meet another family at a park for your own Shabbat picnic. Or, have a backyard or driveway Havdalah under the stars. There are beautiful ways to add spirit to your Shabbat celebrations just by changing the location.

I hope that this summer brings you and your family many blessings of joy and of celebration as we live our Jewish lives to the fullest – whether in our homes, or on the way.

Shabbat: A Sandcastle in Time?

"Shabbat is a palace in time," wrote Rabbi Abraham Joshua Heschel, in speaking to how the actual time of Shabbat creates a unique opportunity for sacredness. June brings some of the longest Shabbatot of the year. You may have heard that Shabbat lasts 25 hours, which raises two questions in relationship to this idea of Shabbat as a palace in time.

Why does Shabbat last 25 hours, not 24? And if Shabbat always lasts 25 hours, how can one Shabbat be longer than another?

We are instructed to add time to Shabbat, beginning it a little earlier and ending it a bit later than required. This extra time—called *tosefet Shabbat*—is a way of honoring Shabbat's holiness by not rushing in or out. That's how we arrive at 25 hours.

In Jewish tradition, time isn't measured only by clocks, but by sunlight. Specifically, *halakhah* — Jewish law — divides the time between sunrise and sunset into 12 equal hours. These halakhic hours expand in the summer and contract in the winter. So even though every Shabbat includes 25 halakhic hours, a Shabbat in June literally lasts longer than one in December.

What might at first sound like a technicality actually



holds deep spiritual resonance. Just as the rhythms of the week shift in summer—think "Summer Fridays," kids at camp, vacation time—Shabbat, too, stretches differently in this season. And that stretch invites us to inhabit it more fully.

Shabbat as a "palace in time" means that there can be a shift in how we relate to moments and presence. And in the long days of summer, that palace can take on new dimensions. Or, if you're more of a beach or lake person, you might think of it

as a sandcastle in time.

Many of us say, "If only there were more hours in the day." On Shabbat, there are always 25. But in summer, those hours feel longer, and that gives us room.

This season, consider how you might dwell in that expanded time. Maybe you linger longer at the dinner table on Saturday night. Maybe you plan a Shabbat afternoon hangout with friends you rarely see. Maybe you walk to the library, screen-free, for an unhurried afternoon of browsing. Or maybe you let a porch-side cocktail hour drift into havdalah as the light fades.

Let this summer's long Shabbatot be a chance to rest more deeply, connect more fully, and savor the gift of sacred time.

COUNTING THE DAYS, PURPOSEFULLY

As I write this article at the start of May, we are on the 22nd day of the Counting of the Omer.

We are told to number the days between Pesach and Shavuot, and so each year, I have tried to count the Omer daily from the conclusion of the second seder till erev Shavuot. I rarely managed to remember to count every day until smartphones became a thing and I set a daily alarm at 9:30 pm to remind me to count!

But what, really, is the point? What does it mean to me to engage in this nightly counting? I jokingly refer to it as a game, but it is surely more than that.

On the *pshat* level, the most basic, face-value, level, I do it because I am commanded to do it. It is one of the mitzvot, and seemingly not a very difficult one at that. There are so many mitzvot that I am NOT able to do – it feels good to know that this one I CAN do! ...but the truth is that counting every day is actually not that easy – because counting every day forces us to be hyper-aware of the passing of time. And generally, we do our best NOT to be hyper-aware of the passing of time.

We talk about “lifetime guarantees” and committing to something “for life,” and we tend to translate those phrases as “forever” in our minds. We rarely allow ourselves to



think about the fact that our days are numbered, even though we do not know what the number is.

My beloved father died a number of weeks ago. At first I counted the days without him – 7, 30... I am now counting the weeks. In time, it will be months and then years. My world has fundamentally changed, and I am changing along with it.

The Omer offers us the same opportunity, to count and also to take account – to purposefully mark the passage of time between liberation from slavery and dedication to a purpose – the receiving of and living through Torah. The Omer gives us a chance to prepare ourselves for our transformation from a people who have been oppressed to a people who have been redeemed and who have a purpose in the world.

Whether or not you are counting the days, I hope and pray that you allow yourself to slow down and notice not only that each day counts, but that you can count the days, and in so doing, deepen your appreciation of all that day has brought. I pray that you allow yourself to grow purposefully with the passing of time, to walk away from that which oppresses you and toward that which fills your life with purpose.

May your days be enlightened by love, and may you shine the light of lovingkindness in the name of your loved ones who came before you.

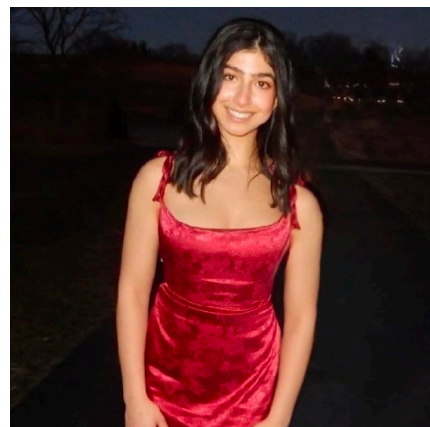
