Letter from Jewish Summer Camp(s): Change Your Life – Work at a Camp!

With apologies to Allan Sherman and his 1963 classic parody song “Hello Mud-dah, Hello Fadduh,” I am sharing this month some reflections on visits to our children and alumni who are campers and staff at Jewish camps in Wisconsin.

This summer, Alex Worth, our new Program Director, and I visited both Herzl Camp and Camp Ramah in Wisconsin. Herzl is a non-affiliated camp founded in 1946 by families in the Minneapolis-St. Paul community. Ramah is the camping arm of Conservative Judaism, with Ramah Wisconsin being the first of many camps opening in 1947. Both of these camps, which predate the formation of the State of Israel, have deep roots in Jewish joy, Jewish peoplehood, Zionism and Hebrew language. And, of course, it is simply a lot of fun seeing both camps filled with Jewish youth getting time in the woods, on sports fields, in lakes, praying, singing, dancing and creating art projects away from home.

Beth Shalom is blessed to have many campers and staff at these two camps as well as Camp Sabra (a JCC camp in Missouri), JCC Ranch Camp in Colorado, Ramah in the Rockies, Camp Ben Frankel (an independent Jewish camp outside St. Louis), BBYO leadership programs, and Israel programs. I look forward to seeing other camps in future summers.

Alex and I had the chance to bring treats from home to our kids. We also got to see them in their “natural envi-



ronment” – smiling, singing, and running around freely, far away from the stressors of too much school, activities and phone screens. One of the great joys was seeing our alumni as counselors and staff at both of these camps. They were stretching themselves in areas of leadership and real world skills of project execution. Additionally, they were caring for Jewish kids a few years younger, and also building their own robust Jewish community with other staff members.

Both Herzl and Ramah had integrated Israelis into their teams. Ramah had well over 80 Israeli staff members. Additionally, Ramah is deeply connected to the Masorti (Conservative) movement internationally and had campers from Berlin, Ukraine (yes, coming to the Midwest from war-torn Ukraine) and the Masorti youth group, Noam in Israel.

If you have post-high school young adults in your life – either by blood or by choice – suggest a summer working at a Jewish camp or other Jewish immersive experience for children and teens. Summer camps have lost many counselors due to the rising pressure of internships and other competing interests. Also, there has never been a better time for our young adults to become Jewish role models of joy, responsibility and ruach (Jewish spirit) for those a few years younger. They will impact and change the lives of others – and if they are not careful, they might have a life-changing experience themselves.

Remedies for Hopelessness

To begin this article with the words “these are challenging times” seems like an understatement. To say “never in my life have I felt more emotionally challenged almost every day” is not. I am deeply upset that I am growing accustomed to feeling challenged, angry and sad almost daily on account of the news, both domestic and international, and I know that I am not alone. Many of you have shared with me your own rage, sadness, or hopelessness.

As a teacher and as a pastor, I counsel people that knowing and learning is better than living in denial, and that some sort of action is often a remedy to feeling hopeless. Feeling purposeful is better than feeling like there is nothing at all you can do.

So what can we do right now? In the past, Rabbi Glickman has taught that the remedy to antisemitism is to double down on Jewish connectedness and Jewish action and behavior. I think that similarly, the answer to feeling angry, hopeless and sad is to engage with the community in meaningful and purposeful ways. To whatever degree you are able to engage on a national level, do it; writing letters to our congresspeople in support of what you support truly matters.

And to feed your soul, to help you feel like you are part of something positive and meaningful, I strongly encourage you to come together with your community on Shabbat and otherwise during these challenging times.

Every Shabbat, Rabbi Glickman and Rabbi Kaplan offer



Torah that feeds the soul. I try every Shabbat to lift my spirit and yours as well with prayer in traditional as well as newer music of our people. But I think the most important offering is simply coming together for a few hours on Shabbat morning with dear friends, some of whom you have known for a long time – possibly all your life. Spending time with other Jews on Shabbat grounds us in an identity-strengthening “special sauce” that has the power to sustain us and to motivate us to continue to write letters, make phone calls, listen respectfully and speak gently with those

around us who are willing to engage and work together for good, and to recognize and dismiss those with whom such engagement is impossible.

I hope that in the weeks and months ahead, especially if and when things feel particularly difficult, you will look forward to coming together on Shabbat to spend a few hours together. I hope that during Kiddish lunch, you will seek each other out, lift each other up, and feel a sense of purpose in doing Jewish together. And I hope that in the days between one Shabbat and the next, you feel stronger because of the time we spend together.

Just a few weeks after this Scroll is published, we will celebrate Rosh Hashanah together. May the time we spend together at services, around dinner tables, at Tashlich, and even fasting, fill your spiritual cup. May the coming year be full of more joy than sorrow, more health than sickness, and more prosperity than challenge. May you enjoy the love of family and friends, and may you be sealed for a good, sweet new year!
