New Jewish Learning for Teens

Congregation Beth Shalom is partnering with the American Jewish University to offer our high school students the opportunity to take local in-person classes with our rabbis for college credit. The program, called the Jewish Learning Experience, was created by the AJU in Los Angeles for students around the country to not only deepen their connection to Judaism and the Jewish people but to also gain a competitive edge in their academic and professional pursuits. Students earn three college credits per course that can be transferred to other universities. The tuition is \$1,300 and generous scholarships are available.

This year, we will be offering a new

class that was created in partnership with the iCenter (JST 313: Introduction to the History, Culture, and People of Israel). This class will be co-taught by Rabbi Glickman and Rabbi Kaplan. Now, more than ever, our teens need to have a strong background in the history of Israel and its place in the Jewish world.

What's In A Name?

Some of you might recall the look of enthusiasm I have when we recognize one another and you still remind me of your name. We are fortunate to belong to a large, vibrant community that has recently consolidated Congregation Beth Shalom and Ohev Sholom, installed new board members, and hired a new rabbi and preschool director. Many of us find ourselves in situations where we are happy to see someone but can't recall their name promptly. Furthermore, as we strive to welcome new members, it can never hurt to assume people might not know our names. I'm not saying introduce yourself to the person you see at minyan weekly, but you get the idea.

The fact is, names hold great weight. This is true of last names, as well! Whether the legacies of loved ones for whom we're named, a reflection of marriage or divorce, or an expression of our ethnicity, the specifics of a name often say much about who we are as people, though it is best not to assume someone's background based on name alone. Last names have been



on my mind recently not only as the community gets to know me as "Rabbi Kaplan," but also in light of Patrick and my marriage this past June. People in our lives have asked how to refer to us as a couple! (The answer: Rabbi Talia Kaplan and Patrick Johnson.)

While we do not see many last names in the Bible, the text addresses the importance of distinct names from very early on. As early as the first humans, names were used to distinguish one from another: the addition of a heh to the word *ish* (man) created the word *isha* (woman). Names are also used to mark transitions in identity, such as when God transformed "Avram" to "Avraham" and "Sarai" to "Sarah." It

is customary to refer to figures in the Tanakh by their "transformed" name, even when discussing events that chronologically precede the change. Similarly, throughout rabbinic literature, there is an understanding of how important it is to call people by the proper version of their name. When Rabbi Zakkai's disciples asked how he merited such a long life, he responded, "I never referred to my fellow by a nickname."

Though I see our rabbi-congregant relationships as less hierarchical than that of an esteemed rabbi and his disciples, I do want to say that it really is an honor to be one of this community's rabbis. "Rabbi" literally translates to "my teacher." I understand it as a title defined by relationships, a title animated by our learning, sharing life cycle events, and working towards a better world. Beth Shalom will always be the first community to have called me their rabbi.

Each of us can bestow honor on someone by how we greet them. In the coming days and months, I aspire to learn many more names. Please join

Silence Before Song: Resting My Voice

Friends, as some of you know, I have struggled on and off with a cyst on my vocal cords. Just before COVID, I was on vocal rest for several weeks because of it, and slowly, with therapy, it got better. But the doctors told me that it likely would not go away completely, and that it could flare up, especially given my work of singing and teaching.

This winter, it did just that, and it was strongly suggested I find an excel-

lent surgeon who operates on professional singers. I found my surgeon at the Cleveland Clinic, and I will have surgery July 30. Following the surgery, I will begin recovery, first with three days of silence, and then progressing slowly with speech and singing therapy for the following few months. My prognosis for a full recovery is excellent if I follow the doctor's orders for a slow and steady recovery.

By the High Holidays, I may be able to gently sing a little bit. Several congregants who have wonderful bimah




skills have graciously volunteered to lead our community in prayer during this time. While I will miss leading our congregation in the beloved prayers and melodies of Rosh HaShanah, Yom Kippur, Sukkot and Simchat Torah, I know our services will be uplifting, engaging and beautiful, and I will be among you to welcome the new year. I hope to make a few appearances on the bimah, but it will depend on my recovery.

I will continue to work with our Bnai Mitzvah students, to make hospital and home visits, and to tend to my other duties as your

Hazzan as much as my vocal recovery allows starting a week after surgery. I will be on the bimah with our Bnai Mitzvah celebrants this summer and fall, with extra help from some of the aforementioned volunteers to lead services until I am back to full strength.

I am very much looking forward to full healing, and to working on having a stronger voice than I have now. I am grateful for your support and understanding during this time.


