Let Us Make The New Sacred Space Sacred

Rabbi Sidney Greenberg, who passed away 21 years ago at the age of 85, was a pillar of American Judaism. A rabbi ordained at the Jewish Theological Seminary in 1942, Rabbi Greenberg was a chaplain in WWII and then served congregations in the Philadelphia area for over 50 years. He was the author of over 20 books and a shining light in Conservative Judaism.

Rabbi Greenberg wrote the following prayer for a Shabbat prayer book he edited:



I could not write a more eloquent prayer than what Rabbi Greenberg penned decades ago. He expresses perfectly the synagogue I hope we can build together both inside the new sanctuary and wherever we gather.

We have so much to be proud of and grateful for with the new sanctuary. There were thousands of hours of service, hundreds of donors with gifts of all sizes, dozens of workers of every type of skill who built this home for us to gather in.

Though the building is a work of art in itself, in many ways it is not a work of art – but in fact a blank canvas or an uncarved block of marble.

This sanctuary is but a holding space for the real beauty of our synagogue. It is a frame for art that is visible and invisible.

The faces of our family, our friends, fellow travelers, people new to our lives, and visitors will be the true visible beauty the space contains.

The prayers, the thoughts, the inner struggle, the hidden pain, the gratitude and joy – these offerings will constitute the invisible and most valuable beauty. If the sanctuary is the blank canvas or marble, and our faces are the art – our prayers, gratitude, pain and remembrance are like Monet's brush strokes or Michaelangelo's delicate sculpting.

As we enter the month of Elul, I pray that this be a time of renewal as we enter the time and space of the holidays next month.

May the door of this synagogue be wide enough to receive all who hunger for love, all who are lonely for fellowship.

May it welcome all who have cares to unburden, thanks to express, hopes to nurture.

May the door of this synagogue be narrow enough to shut out pettiness and pride, envy and enmity.

May its threshold be no stumbling block to young or straying feet.

May it be too high to admit complacency, selfishness, and harshness.

May this synagogue be, for all who enter, the doorway to a richer and more meaningful life.

As we begin a new school year and anticipate the upcoming Jewish year, I encourage everyone to think about the ways they want to continue to make Beth Shalom an even more pleasant dwelling space – both inside and outside of the building walls. There are many opportunities in the coming weeks, ranging from a pre-Rosh Ha-Shanah gathering for 20s and 30s to social justice work through the Good Faith Network. Whether it’s talking to someone new at services, inviting a family member or friend to join you at an event, or talking with a board, clergy, or staff member about new ways to get involved, let us experience how truly good it is to be together.
