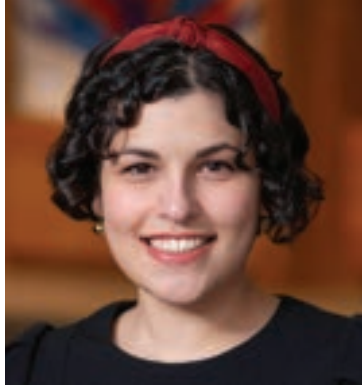


Celebrate Purim with Beth Shalom

Purim is often seen as a lighthearted holiday—one filled with costumes, celebration, and revelry. While there's no shortage of joy in the festivities, the holiday also grapples with darker themes. The story of Megillat Esther, for instance, touches on violence, revenge, the abuse of power, and the persecution of the Jewish people. Yet, it is through the dramatics of Purim that we have the fortitude to engage with these difficult realities. In a time marked by uncertainty and disarray, Purim is deeply needed.

We are excited to share a number of ways to celebrate Purim with Beth Shalom. Our big, synagogue-wide event will be a Megillah reading and spiel at 7:30pm on Thursday, March 13. Here is where community members chant the story of Esther. This year, there will be more fun – and funny – surprises than you can count interspersed throughout the reading, from clergy musical numbers to comedy bits to a costume contest. That's right, we are asking you to get creative...put together



your best costume, and you might just win a prize. There will be snacks and beverages, both alcoholic and zero proof.

For families with children – especially those under b'nai mitzvah age – the evening will begin at 6:30pm. Grab a seat in the Sanctuary for the Dr. Seuss-Shan Family Purim Play, featuring some of your favorite teachers and directed by Civia White! Then, adults and kids alike should put on their creative hats, because it's time to learn about how the mitzvah of mishloach manot – Purim gifts of food items and more – is the perfect intergenerational family activity. Art supplies and snacks

of all shapes and sizes await you just outside the sanctuary, where we will make our own themed gift baskets to celebrate, learn, and give together. We will then head into the synagogue-wide megillah reading. Though the theatrics will be appropriate for all ages the entire evening, we've been sure to put the extra exciting, family-friendly content up front (~7:45-8:15pm).

On Friday morning, we will daven shacharit, read Torah, and chant megillah at 7am, followed by a festive Purim meal.

For folks in their 20s and 30s, the fun will continue after Shabbat, with a party thrown by The Supper Club, our new young adult initiative. Join us for a Karaoke Brunch, breakfast for dinner style. We'll eat dinner, make havdalah, and then pay homage to the Purim theme of turning things upside down, with a contemporary twist featuring a special karaoke host.

Currently, Happy Bottoms distributes diapers to over 40 local organizations, including hospitals and social service agencies. The diaper drive will take place March 3-April 1.

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Winter Warmth at Polsky Religious School

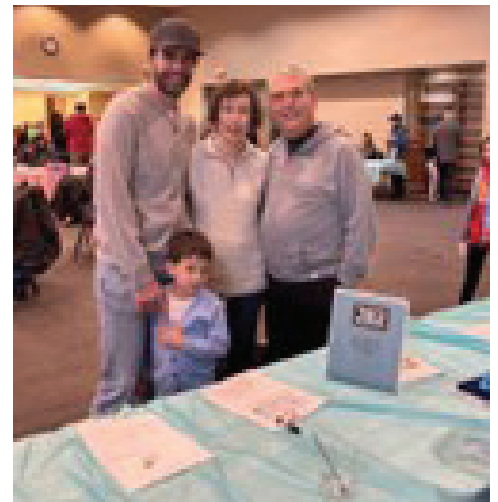
