The Most Beautiful and Mysterious Fruit

Though many of us think of an etrog as an overpriced and delicate lemon, its very mystery adds spiritual resonance. It is not obvious from the Torah that the etrog is the intended special fruit for the season.

In Leviticus 23:40, we read:

On the first day you shall take the product of hadar trees, branches of palm trees, boughs of leafy trees, and willows of the brook, and you shall rejoice before the LORD your God seven days.

What is this mysterious fruit? Where does it come from? Why does it matter?

The etrog's biological origins are not in Israel but in China. This journey was possible since the fruit is almost all rind, with barely any fruit inside. (Obvious to anyone who has tried to eat or juice an etrog!) The etrog made its way to first Persia (Iran) and later to the Land of Israel.

The Israelites of the Sinai desert likely had no access to an etrog. In Israel, there are etrogim in art from Second Temple period, and cultivated etrog seeds from the 5th and 6th century BCE.

There is spiritual dimension to this bizarre fruit that frames our new year. Can you imagine, what efforts were made to get an etrog from the Mediterranean to Kansas in the late 1800s? How did etrogim get into the Soviet Union or ghettos under Nazi control? How many hands touched each etrog as it traveled from farmer, to merchant, to traveler, to synagogue? One spiritual element of the etrog is the



Jewish people's interconnectedness ensuring these etrogim found their way from farms to Sukkot celebrations.

A second spiritual dimension is the very fact that the etrog's origins are from half a world from Israel. One of the theological revolutions of Jewish monotheism is believing that God is the God for the entire world - not just one land and one people. The etrog is one of the few Jewish ritual items whose physical origins are not originally from Israel (or from the Sinai desert!) - and Sukkot celebrates God's presence for all of

the people of the world.

The other spiritual dimension for me is the fruit's connection to the Garden of Eden. There are midrashim (rabbinic legends) about the fruit tree in the Garden of Eden. Scientists identify four "true species" of citrus fruits from which all other citrus fruits descend. The foremothers and forefathers of citrus are mandarins, pummelos, citrons (etrogim) and the papeda. In the way that the waters in a mikveh link us to the waters of Eden, the scent of the etrog connects us quite literally to the original fruits that birthed all other citrus fruit.

Joel Levine, Hattan Torah

Joel Levine has been a resident of the Kansas City area for most of his life with the exception of a few years in St. Louis and Dallas. He grew up at Ohev Sholom where his parents and grandparents were leaders of the Congregation. Following in the family tradition, Joel participated in and led numerous committees and initiatives including membership, worship, finance, fundraising, and others. Eventually Joel became a third generation, three-term president of Ohev Sholom. In the community, Joel was an advisor for AZA chapters #2 and #621 and chaired the BBYO Youth Advisory Committee.

More recently, Joel was a member of the negotiating committee that resulted in the positive consolidation of Congregations Ohev Sholom and Beth Shalom. Joel assisted with the transition of information to Beth Shalom and participated in the committee that designed the Ohev Sholom Memorabilia Room. In 2023, he led the initiative to respond to the federal Nonprofit Security Grant Program to obtain funds to upgrade security at Beth Shalom. Beth Shalom was awarded the maximum grant and security enhancements are underway.

Joel received his BS degrees in Business and Computer Science from the University of Kansas. For most of his career he directed Sales Operations for large, international telecom companies until his retirement in 2016.





Lisa was born and raised in Los Angeles. She attended Smith College and then Washington University School of Law, where she met her husband, David. Lisa and David moved to Kansas City in 1998. They have been members of both Beth Shalom and Ohev Sholom, along with their children Sabina (who is now 26) and Noah (who is now 24). 
Following Sukkot, we will dance our way into Simchat Torah - literally! You'll find us singing, marching, decorating flags, and waving them proudly as we celebrate
