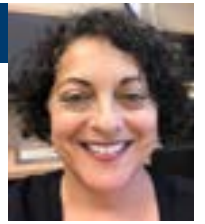

It is an ancient and widespread custom for the first born to fast on the day before Passover commemorating the miracle which spared them from the plague that struck down the Egyptian first born. This fast is treated leniently. Thus, if there is a festive meal that relates to a mitzvah (for example the completion of a tractate of the Talmud), the first born participates in the meal rather than fasting.

With this in mind—all Beth Shalom first born are invited to join us for services and a siyyum (celebration) as we complete a tractate of Talmud.

There was no school on the Sunday of Presidents Day weekend, but that did not keep the PRS teachers from coming together with religious school teachers from all over Kansas City for a morning of learning and fellowship. Noa Dovrat, our community Israeli emissary, spoke to the teachers about Israel in the media and how to support our students as we talk about challenging topics that appear in the news. Sarah Markowitz, from the Jewish Community Relations Bureau, shared the results of the student survey about antisemitism in the schools. It was disturbing to hear how frequently our children experience antisemitism. Sarah connected us with many resources that the teachers can use to discuss these hurtful experiences with the kids. She also, and most importantly, told the group of Jewish educators to keep on teaching about the beauty and meaning of our religion. Kids who have a good Jewish background can be more confident in their reactions to hate. Thank you, Noa and Sarah!
