A Double-Scoop of Joy this Year

This year is a Jewish leap year and a secular leap year. In the secular (Gregorian) calendar, we have one day added every four years to make sure that our calendar aligns with the earth's actual revolutions around the sun. The Hebrew calendar is neither a completely solar-based calendar like the Gregorian, nor it is a completely lunar-based calendar like the Islamic calendar. Our months align precisely with each cycle of the moon, but we still make sure that Passover is always just following the vernal equinox by adding an additional month of Adar.

The Gilbert and Sullivan Operetta, *Pirates of Penzance*, focuses on a silly plot where confusion ensues around a young man born on February 29th. In this operetta, the Pirate King sings: "although for such a beastly month as February, twenty-eight days as a rule are plenty; One year in every four his days shall be reckoned as nine and twenty."

Many of us agree that February is often a "beastly month," so how nice is it that in the Hebrew calendar when we need a leap year – we extend the most joyful month. Adar is the month in which Purim falls, and on Jewish leap years we get to celebrate both an Adar I and an Adar II. Our sages teach us that it is a mitzvah to be happy in Adar, and that "Whomever enters the month of Adar should increase their joy!" So, this year, we get to have twice as much joy!

Most years, having a reason to double our joy would be welcome. This year, though, it might feel a bit uncomfortable to celebrate raucously. I was in Jerusalem, for example, in Purim of 1994 when Baruch Goldstein murdered dozens of Muslim Palestinians in prayer at the Cave of Machpelah in Hebron. Two years later, my first year at JTS, there was a horrible bus bombing on Jaffa Road killing JTS rabbinical student Matthew Eisenfeld and his fiancée Sarah Duker amongst dozens of others. Then, on Purim itself, a horrible bombing in Dizengoff Square in Tel Aviv. I share these to say that we are, tragically, used to Adar falling in less than joyful times.

Some of us may need the Jewish joy that is unique to Purim – we may need the escape valve, the silliness, and the celebration. Others of us may be very disheartened by the frivolity. For both groups, we can benefit from the essential nature of Jewish joy.

Pirkei Avot teaches: "Who is it that is truly wealthy? The one who rejoices in their portion." Psalm 100, the Psalm of thanksgiving instructs us: "Worship the LORD in gladness; come into God's presence with shouts of joy." The legal tradition puts its greatest emphasis of Purim on the joy of giving monetary gifts to the poor.

Gratitude for your portion. Connection with God. Sharing your portion with others. These are the three elements to deep and lasting joy. These three elements will elevate our double scoop of joy that comes with Adar I and Adar II whether you feel like a Purim Party, or whether you want your outward celebration subdued. These three elements deepen our joy regardless of the happiness of the times we live in on any particular year.

Jewish Values in Action at PRS

PRS is one of 260 religious schools worldwide that partner with an organization called Shalom Learning. The staff at Shalom Learning provides the high-quality materials that guide the Jewish Studies piece of our curriculum for grades K-8. The entire school focuses on one Jewish value in unison over several weeks.

Each value we focus on is broken down into age-appropriate lessons. For example, the third-graders learn how they can apply the value within their family, the fourth-graders/fifth-graders discover how the value applies to the self, and the sixth-graders/seventh-graders develop an understanding of how the Jewish value can shape their relationships with their peers, community, and world.

The values that are taught are:
Hakarat Hatov (recognizing the good), Hachnasat Orchim (welcoming guests), Tzedakah (giving to help

others), Ometz Lev (courage of the heart), Ba'al Tashchit (do not be wasteful), Shalom Bayit (peace in the home), B'tzelem Elohim (in God's image), Bikur Cholim (visiting the sick), Hashavat Aveyda (returning lost objects), Todah (gratefulness), and Yisrael (connecting with Israel).

It is exciting to see the students at PRS demonstrate their understanding of these values as they interact with others here at Beth Shalom and when they go out into the world. Please take the time to let them know that you see them making good choices based on our Jewish values. We are all so proud of these kids!

Kansas City is now listed as a top 10 places to visit in 2024 by the *Wall Street Journal*. Surely, part of the draw are all the things that go on in the “heart” of our metro area. Jewish life, supported by Congregation Beth Shalom, is certainly a part of the action!

When we committed to building the Sacred Space at our Lamar campus, the board also committed to maintaining programming and some to be determined presence, north of 95th Street. When Ohev Sholom and Beth Shalom consolidated in the summer of 2022, those plans began to take more significant shape.

This past fall and early winter, Rabbi Glickman hosted several drop-in coffee sessions on The Plaza; our monthly Shir L'Shabbat services continued to support a regular presence in Prairie Village - led by Anna Jaffe, Rabbi Rudnick, and a team of musicians; we celebrated Hanukkah at Drastic Measures in Shawnee and at Fairway City Hall. Shir L'Shabbat will continue and we have more than two

dozen folks registered to learn with Rabbi Glickman weekly at JFS Brookside in cooperation with Melton (special discounts for members).

At Drastic Measures, it was standing room only for Hanukkah-themed cocktails and fundraising for JFS. In Fairway, more than 40 people - from toddlers to grandparents - lit candles and enjoyed Kosher cheeses, wines, and Charcuterie, before learning with Rabbi Kaplan about some of the lesser known Hanukkah stories - and the wine and cheese connections to the celebrations.

Even our “Out South” members have appreciated participating in these experiences and are excited to join the growing number of “Close In” options Beth Shalom is increasingly offering. Good Faith Network

The Good Faith Network builds a collective voice so large it can't be ignored. We are an interfaith organization building people power in nearly 30 congregations across Johnson County (including Congregation Beth Shalom). We organize and use that voice to advocate for changes that address the root cause of our community's most pressing problems. It starts with the Listening Process. Every fall, our leaders across every member congregation host a series of small group listening sessions. In these discussions, we pose questions like: 'What keeps you up at night worrying? What do you see happening that makes you angry?' After these listening sessions, Network Members from across the county gather at an annual Community Problems Assembly. There, they vote democratically on the community issue(s) that the Good Faith Network will prioritize that year. After the Community Problems Assembly, lay leaders and clergy form research committees around the selected priorities. Committees embark on a months-long research process - speaking with those who are experiencing the problem and interviewing sub-

ject-matter experts, current service providers, and relevant public officials - to better understand the issue. Additionally, the committees discover what best practices are being used in other communities that are eliminating the targeted problem. The Solutions Briefing in April brings the whole network up to speed on the committees work and readies us to mobilize. The Nehemiah Action in May is where we present solutions to our most pressing problems with a voice to big it cannot be ignored! Our three issue campaigns are: mental health, affordable housing, and ending homelessness.

Please join us on Sunday, February 18 at 11:30 am at Beth Shalom for an update on our progress in the three issue campaign areas.
