Finding God Without the Props

There is a week at the end of the Hebrew month of Tishrei that has nothing special in it. From the conclusion of Simchat Torah until the beginning of the month of Heshvan, there are no special rituals. We don't have any additional prayers whatsoever -- not even the penitential prayers known as Tachanun which are usually said on weekdays that are not festive days. In other words -- no joyful prayers, no penitential prayers, not happy, not sad. Those days are just there. During the last week of the month of Tishrei we have nothing special, nothing unique, no Jewish rituals to set that week apart.

The lack of specialness is a striking contrast to the whole lead-up to that week. Starting with the deepest valley of the year, Tisha B'Av, for nearly 90 days we have had something unique added to our Jewish prayers, rituals or Torah reading. It began with a whisper: saying special haftarah (prophetic readings) on Shabbat morning that helped carry us out of the pit of Tisha B'Av. It is such a quiet whisper of change in ritual, that most folks don't even notice that these are special readings.

Then, we hit Elul. We start blowing the shofar on a daily basis. We begin stretching our teshuvah muscles, and getting in spiritual shape. This energy grows in a crescendo for the entire month. Finally we get to Rosh HaShanah. We are so excited to stand before the King we are literally blowing primordial horns. We fast on Yom Kippur repenting and celebrating God's gracious forgiveness. We eat in a Sukkah and shake the lulav and etrog, going beyond a mere crescendo into a dance. We are starting to get ecstatic in our celebration of God's beneficence.

Then Simchat Torah. Wow. Song. Dance. Chaos. True exaltation. We are drunk with the joy that we are starting another year of Torah reading, drinking the nectar that will sustain us for another year...

And then. All of a sudden. The party is finally over. We've swept up the confetti, washed the wine glasses, and put away the decorations until another year. And that's when we arrive at this final week of Tishrei.

But maybe it is not nothing we are experiencing. Perhaps, if we listen closely, there is an echo reverberating in our hearts. The feeling is like the lingering sound of a cymbal after a huge crash. The sound just hangs in the air until the vibrations naturally die out.

The last week of Tishrei appears as if there is nothing special, but it is actually living inside the echo of the celebration. If we want, we can allow that to be our spiritual state for all of the "everyday" days that will follow. Most of our lives are neither the tragic mourning of Tisha B'Av nor the cacophony of ecstatic song from Simchat Torah. Most of our lives are ordinary and every day. But if we strain, if we really listen, we can hear the shimmering echo that might still be reverberating in the air. And if we hear the echo, we can remember the joy we once had and will again.

This is what it means to live with faith: no need for costumes (like the shoeless Tisha B'Av), no need for instruments (like Rosh HaShanah's shofar), no need for sets and props (all the accoutrement of Sukkot). We can love God and live with God, without any help at all -- just the echo of the Divine presence hanging in the air.
