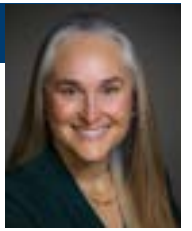

Lifting up our voices, uplifting our prayers

There is a fantastic tension between love of tradition and exploration of what is new and worthwhile, especially when it comes to music – and especially when it comes to the music of prayer. Jewish prayer is deeply steeped in tradition. We each have a sense of what it is supposed to sound like, and we can tell when it's not right. Some parts of our worship are easy to adjust to modern music, and some prayers and services feel important to keep just as they are.

As important as it is to conserve our nusach, the melodic patterns in which we offer up prayers, for the most part, we want desperately to lift our hearts, our voices, and our community in prayer. Between the challenges that many of us face in trying to follow and sing in Hebrew, and in trying to sing along with nusach, which does not always sound like a tune, but more like a chant, the introduction of moving melodies that focus on a few words or perhaps on a line or two of the liturgy can enhance the prayer experience and bring more of us into active worship together.

Sometimes we are stirred by soul-filling melodies and tunes that are inspired by the liturgy and even by the "old" tunes. In my parents' generation, then-new synagogue music was inspired by the music of the "old country," that music now feels like we have been using it since we left Sinai. Half a generation later, the Jewish musical landscape was re-sculpted

by Debbie Friedman z"l, Craig Taubman, Danny Maseng and others, inspired more by American folk music and the music of the 60s and early 70s; and today there is deeply inspirational music coming out of Hadar in New York, and out of several different minyanim in Israel, including Nava Tehillah among others, inspired by today's musical trends, in America and in Israel.

In our Tefillateinu services, our monthly instrumental-music Shabbat morning services, and in Rising Song, our post-Kiddush informal Shabbat song sessions, we are learning and experimenting with new and new-to-us tunes and songs. Some of these are nigunim from the "Old Country" that have been rescued, so to speak, from oblivion. When we sing these tunes, we invoke the memory of all those beloved Jews who were moved by these melodies in generations past. The new nigunim and songs move us because they speak to our modern musical emotional sense. Both types of music hold the power to engage us all in song and open our hearts in prayer.

I hope that you will join us to learn some new tunes, and I hope most of all that when you come to shul or when you tune in to our livestream, you will sing along and allow your soul to be stirred by the beautiful music we are making together.

Join Us For Daily Minyan

We are making progress toward having a daily minyan in person each morning! Since we returned to Goldsmith Hall for morning minyan, we have successfully recruited 36 people who have committed to attend at least monthly, 32 who attend at least weekly, and 18 people who attend more than one day each week.

Assuring an in-person minyan every day allows people to know that they can say Kaddish in-person with their Jewish community on the occasion of a yahrtzeit of a loved one. And experiencing a minyan in-person adds meaning not just for those saying Kaddish, but for all who participate.

While we are making progress, we still need members of our congregation to commit to coming to morning minyan on a regular basis. If we know 10 are coming, we can commit to having a minyan for those saying Kaddish, and we can read from the Torah on Mondays, Thursdays and on Haggim, which we cannot without an in-person minyan. If you

commit to a specific day and can't come, with even a day's advance notice we can call a backup to replace you.

Beyond the experience of minyan for those who attend, assuring a daily in-person minyan adds meaning to the memories of loved ones whose yahrzeits are remembered with the Kaddish. Assuring a daily in-person minyan adds value to the culture of our congregation, and to the Jewish spirit of our community.

Did you read a Jewish book this month?

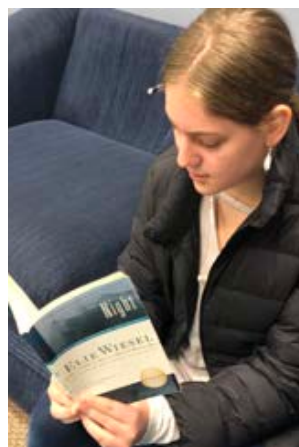

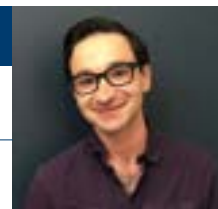
