Supper Club for 20s/30s

A month after the launch of Beth Shalom's new sub-community for people in their 20s and 30s, referred to as "Supper Club," a headline in Business Insider read, "Supper clubs having a renaissance as Gen Z shuns nights on the town." Even before it was making the news, a handful of our congregants in their 20s and 30s had picked up on an unspoken commonality among their peers: many younger people want to be in community in relational and comfortable ways, not primarily revolving around happy hours. Yes, we sometimes have a "night on the town," and many of our events include alcohol, yet the younger Millennial and Gen Z members of Supper Club have also spent the past year building community in ways such as discussing Jewish texts at a congregant's home in Waldo, crafting while enjoying soup and homemade bread in Brookside, and planning outings to community partners like the White Theatre and the Mitzvah Garden. Though the venue and activity differ, the goal is the same: bring Jewish young adults – members and not, many without kids but a few beginning the parenthood journey, solo and partnered – together to do an activity together that



takes off the pressure to make small talk and deepens substantive relationships.

Our Connection to Israel

Every year the adult students in the Sisterhood-supported Sarah Peltzman Adult Education class share ideas of what they would like to learn. This year, students asked to learn about Israel and how and why we are connected to Israel. With greater levels of hatred toward Israel in the press and in communities around the world than ever, this topic is timely and important.

I share here the foundation of this class in the hopes that you will feel rooted, renewed and confident in your meaningful connection with our ancient and modern homeland, regardless of antisemitism, pressure and bad press that Israel is getting today.

The Torah begins with the story of God creating the entire world and everything within it. Rashi, the prolific 11th century French commentator, asks – why does the Torah begin here? Why doesn't it begin, rather, with God's relationship with the Israelite people, since the Torah chronicles our relationship with and responsibilities to God? Rashi immediately answers the question – The Torah begins thus so we will understand that, in the words of the psalmist, the world and all within it belong to God. Therefore, God has the right to "give" any part of God's creation to anyone.

So when God promises a piece of land to Avraham and his offspring forever, and reiterates that promise to Isaac, to Jacob, to Moshe, to Joshua, and later to the



prophets to repeat to the Israelites, God and God alone has that right to do so. And when God tells Moshe that God will exile us from that land when we stray from God's mitzvot, and that God will return us to that land and punish the countries who exiled us, we believe. And biblical history proved this out over and over again.

While one might argue that the Torah is not a history book, ancient Persian, Egyptian and Assyrian writings support

many accounts of events in the later books of the Tanakh. Throughout the Tanakh, we learn about times when we strayed and thus suffered tremendous losses, including being expelled from the land, and also that we turned back toward God's path and returned to our homeland.

And the punchline is that the Jewish People, as small as we are, can historically trace our communal memory back to our exile from that homeland. We have never questioned who we are as a people and where we came from. We have brought our holy story, our sacred texts, with us everywhere we have lived, and our liturgy has developed with the echoes of that shared history and under the influence of our sacred texts. We KNOW that this is our story, and therefore, we KNOW that we are one people, one family, united by that story, by that history, by all of the texts and experiences that are ours. What unites us as a people is our relationship with our God, in our Land, and in one language – which has always been Hebrew even when we did not speak it.
